This directory contains information on each member's insurance coverage, space available in warehouse, and phone number including area code.

The Directory contains 5 sections. Local and State agencies appear alphabetically under cities within each state. These agencies include research agencies and research divisions of larger organizations, taxpayers' associations, citizens' and voters' leagues, colleges and universities with governmental research divisions, leagues of municipalities, reference libraries, etc. The next 4 sections contain national agencies, individual members of the GRA not affiliated with organizations listed in the first 2 sections, index of organizations (arranged alphabetically), and index of individuals (arranged alphabetically).

9. A Comparison of Selected Telephone Costs in 19 Large Cities. July, 1972. Dick Howard. Industrial Development Studies, Special Report #11, 403 Clark Hall, University of Missouri, Columbia, Missouri, 65201. 18 pp. 7 tables. 1 figure.

This brief paper is concerned with telephone services designed for and primarily used by business. Costs are presented for 21 of the largest cities in the U.S. including Kansas City.

10. Opportunities in Missouri for Manufacturing Plastic Pipe. June, 1972. Earl E. Cannon. Missouri Division of Commerce and Industrial Development, 8th floor Jefferson Building, Jefferson City, Missouri 65101. 38 pp. 1 figure, 7 tables. 3 maps. No charge.

This report is a revision of a prior study published in May, 1968. Markets for two end uses for plastic pipe were selected on the basis of their national and regional potential. The two end uses were (1) drain, waste and vent pipe, and (2) rural water systems, especially Farmers Home Administration finance systems. A Missouri plant would have a market including Arkansas, Illinois, Iowa, Kansas, Missouri, Nebraska, Oklahoma and Tennessee.

Now over 4 million government employees belong to unions or quasi-unions and the number is growing. "The study considers the questions of public policy raised by the transition from the traditional merit system for government employees, to one now often dominated by collective bargaining." Also employee strikes and the question of how to deal with them is considered. Table 9 gives by state the key provisions of state laws relating to teacher organization.

The population is categorized in terms of general, social, labor force and economic characteristics. The tables on housing include utilization, structural, equipment

and financial characteristics.
