



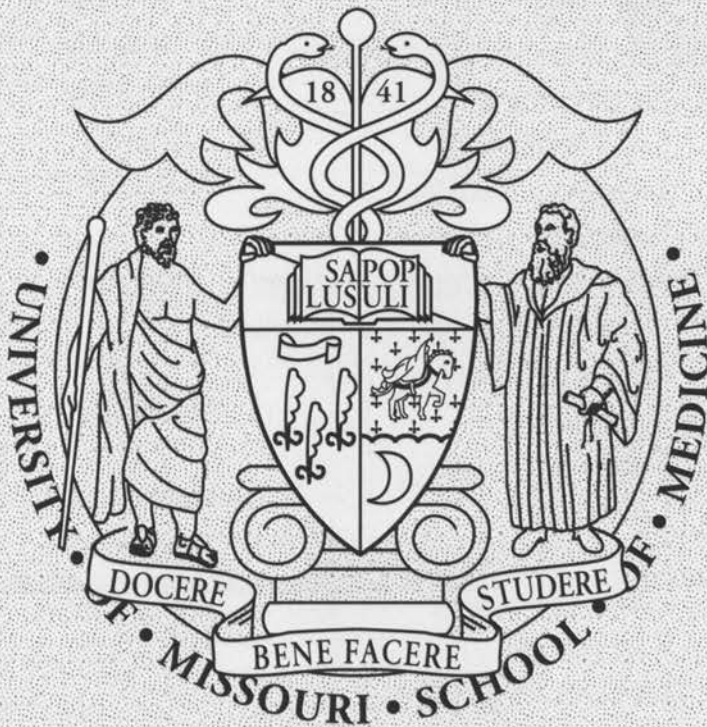

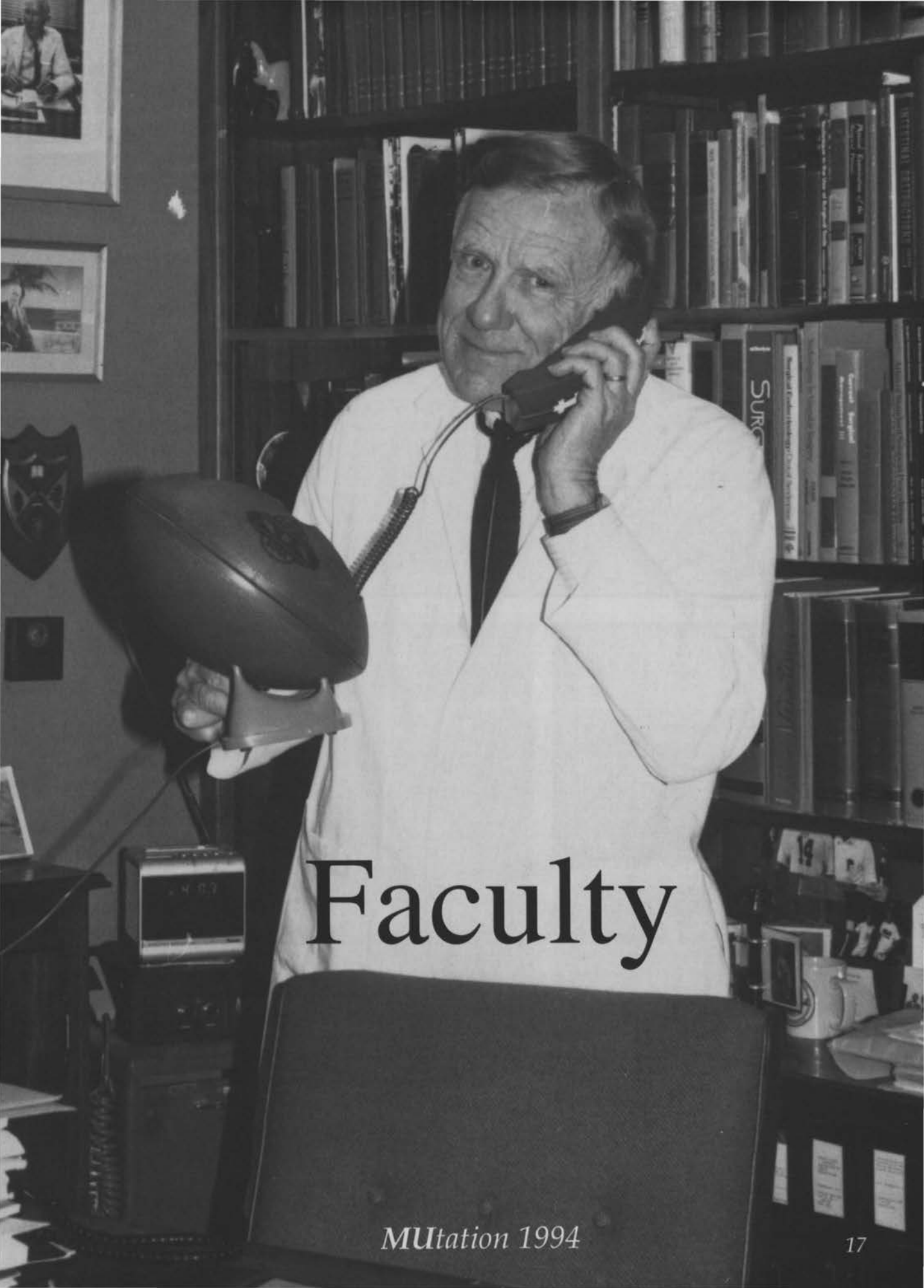

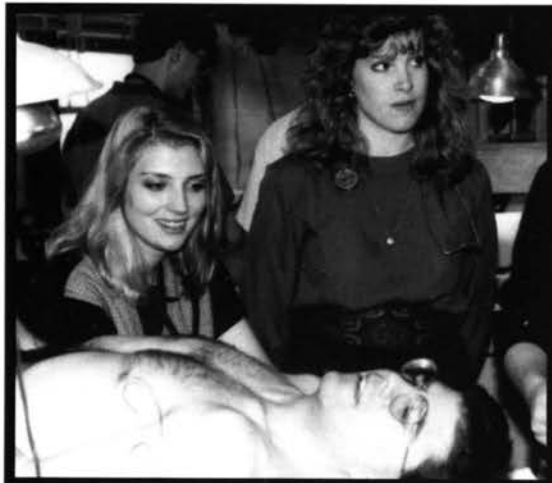

PBL--On your mark, get set,...

August 1, 1993: The curriculum design process had been like herding cats. Did we do everything we were supposed to do? Was everything in place? The new curriculum was ready--well sort of. The BSci and PBL were hooked up to the IPC which was connected to the SPX and ACE, the blockheads had tuned up the debriefers, the tutors were driving the SPs and the OME, the CDC and the CCDC were cleared for takeoff--or something like that. Time for a cimetidine.

The curriculum has exceeded all expectations. The students have responded positively to most experiences. There are a variety of roles for faculty and most have enjoyed new ways of teaching and the enthusiasm of the students. Designing and implementing a curriculum has not been easy or cheap. The faculty time and energy invested in education has been substantial. The investment in facilities, equipment and resources have been considerable.

The students like it. Most faculty like it. The LCME site visit team liked it. Several times I have heard a student say, "I love medical school; my friend at.....wishes he/she were here." Many revisions will be made in this curriculum, but we are off to a great start.

Ann Havey, the director of the PBL/Basic Science Curriculum explains the alphabet soup of PBL:

"Blockheads" - the endearing term given to the director of each of four blocks during the academic year.

Tutor - a faculty member who guides discussion and evaluates performance and participation of students during the small group problem-based learning sessions.

IPC - Introduction to Patient Care: a major component of the new curriculum, which covers physical exam and interviewing skills, health care system issues, biomedical ethics, clinical epidemiology, and psychosocial issues.

SPX - Standardized patient Program: paid community volunteers are taught to portray patients with specific diseases, allowing students to practice their history, physical exam and interviewing skills. Sometimes used to evaluate student performance.

ACE - Ambulatory Care Experience: a program begun early in the first year, introducing students to primary care outpatient experiences in community physicians' offices and hospital clinics.

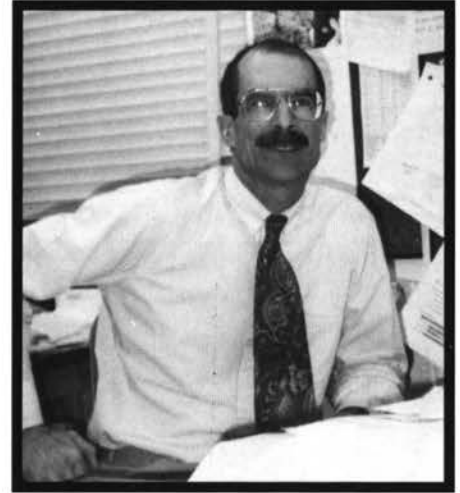

MARIA'S PERSPECTIVE

When I started medical school in 1986, I was like that old movie "I Led Three Lives." I had already led two of them and had started on my third. I had taught high school for the first one, fixed pinball machines, jukeboxes and video games for the second one, and was working on my third. There was a period of time during Life #2 that I was one of the famous 37 million uninsured. Let me get out my calculator and show you why.

Ok...Life #1...Maria Evans, aka Miss Evans, high school biology teacher. My top salary (1982) = \$10,800. My health insurance costs = \$10.80/month x 12 months = \$129.60 / year, or 1.2% of my gross income.

Now fast forward to life #3...Maria Evans, aka Dr. Evans, pathology resident. According to my W4 for 1993, I made \$30,796. My health insurance costs (I'm upscale now...I have dental coverage, too) = \$38.94/month x 12 months = \$467.28 / year, or 1.5% of my gross income.

Finally, two steps forward and one step back. Life #2...Maria Evans, pinball fixer in a family owned business in rural Missouri. My top salary (1985) = \$8788. Because it was a family owned business, I had no "bennies" at all...no retirement, no profit-sharing, and NO health insurance. I went out and priced health insurance once, in 1983. The best offer I found would have cost this healthy, then 23 year old \$275.29 every three months for a policy that was just

plain shabby. Limited ER coverage, limited hospital stay, and only \$500,000 total coverage limits. Time to get out the calculator again...\$275.29 x 4 quarterly payments = \$1101.06 / year, or 12.5 % of my gross income! No bargain, eh?

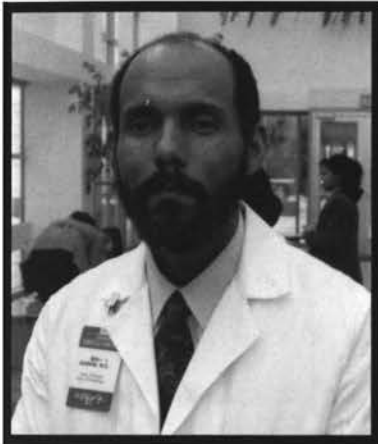
I know...you skeptics are saying, "Yeah, Maria...but what about your POST-tax income? You didn't pay as much in taxes then." Well, I got out my old tax returns (my tax lady would LOVE me!) Without boring you with the math, I re-figured this for these same 3 years and they came out to be 1.5% (Maria the teacher), 1.8% (Maria the resident), and 13.4% (Maria the pinball jock). Looks worse now, doesn't it?

Then I started thinking about all those folks I see on C-SPAN and CNBC talking about the famous 37 million uninsured. The Rush wannabes like to claim they're lazy freeloaders with poor financial planning skills. The bleeding-heart do-gooders tell me those folks are victims. I don't think I was ANY of those things back when I was one of the 37 million uninsured. I was just a bored young adult looking for something better. I wasn't a "victim"...I chose that job...but it took a while for me to figure out just what I wanted to do to better myself. I don't think I would have been accused of poor planning skills because of my inability to wall off eight and one-half times the amount of money I presently set aside for health care. To top it off, I'm single. I had it easy. I wasn't trying to raise a family and pay for this stuff, too. I don't find it surprising that I decided to forego health insurance.

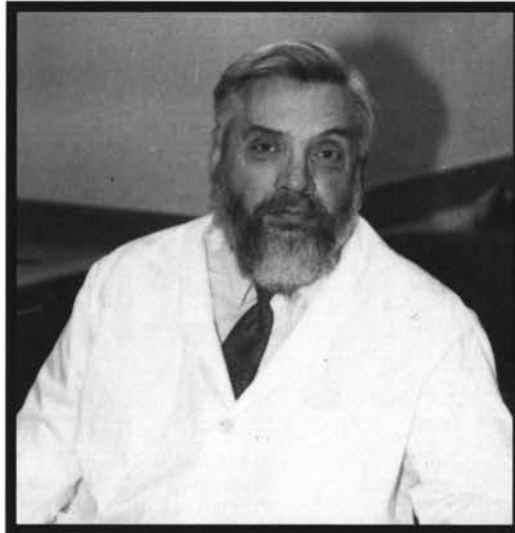
Like many of you, I find myself grumbling about "health care reform". But I stop grumbling when I'm reminded of Maria's life #2. I don't think people who would have to set aside 12.5% of their gross income are too sympathetic when we holler that our potential incomes might be cut from \$150,000 to \$70,000. I'm willing to bet that if Maria #2 had been a patient at the University Hospital and overheard Maria #3 in the cafeteria talking to her colleagues, on some days she might have thought Maria #3 was a whining, conceited jerk. I learned early on in my residency never to complain about money in front of my relatives...because Maria, the underpaid resident, is the highest paid member of her entire family...and my student loans mean nothing when you look at the fact that my relatives are buying houses and cars with much less and struggling to make the payments AND rearing their families.

The only way that physicians, as a group, will garner support for their views on health care reform is if we truly put those 37 million first--then, and only then, will the public be sympathetic to our special needs and circumstances. There are a lot of ways to do this. One way is to be active in organized medicine--especially at the local level. Another is to donate your time and service to charitable efforts in providing medical care to underserved populations. The best, however, is to make sure that the people that you come in contact with KNOW THAT YOU CARE. Make a promise NOW that you will be active in building a new health care delivery system for this country, not just stand idly by while the system builds itself. Maria #3 is already proud of you. Now make Maria #2 proud.

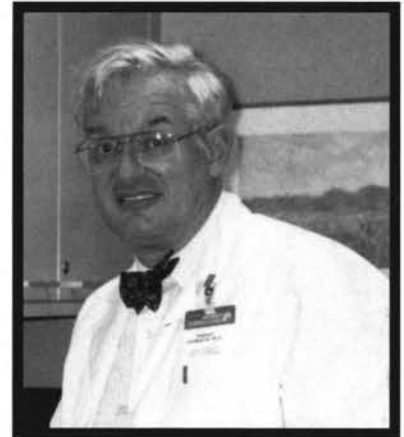
