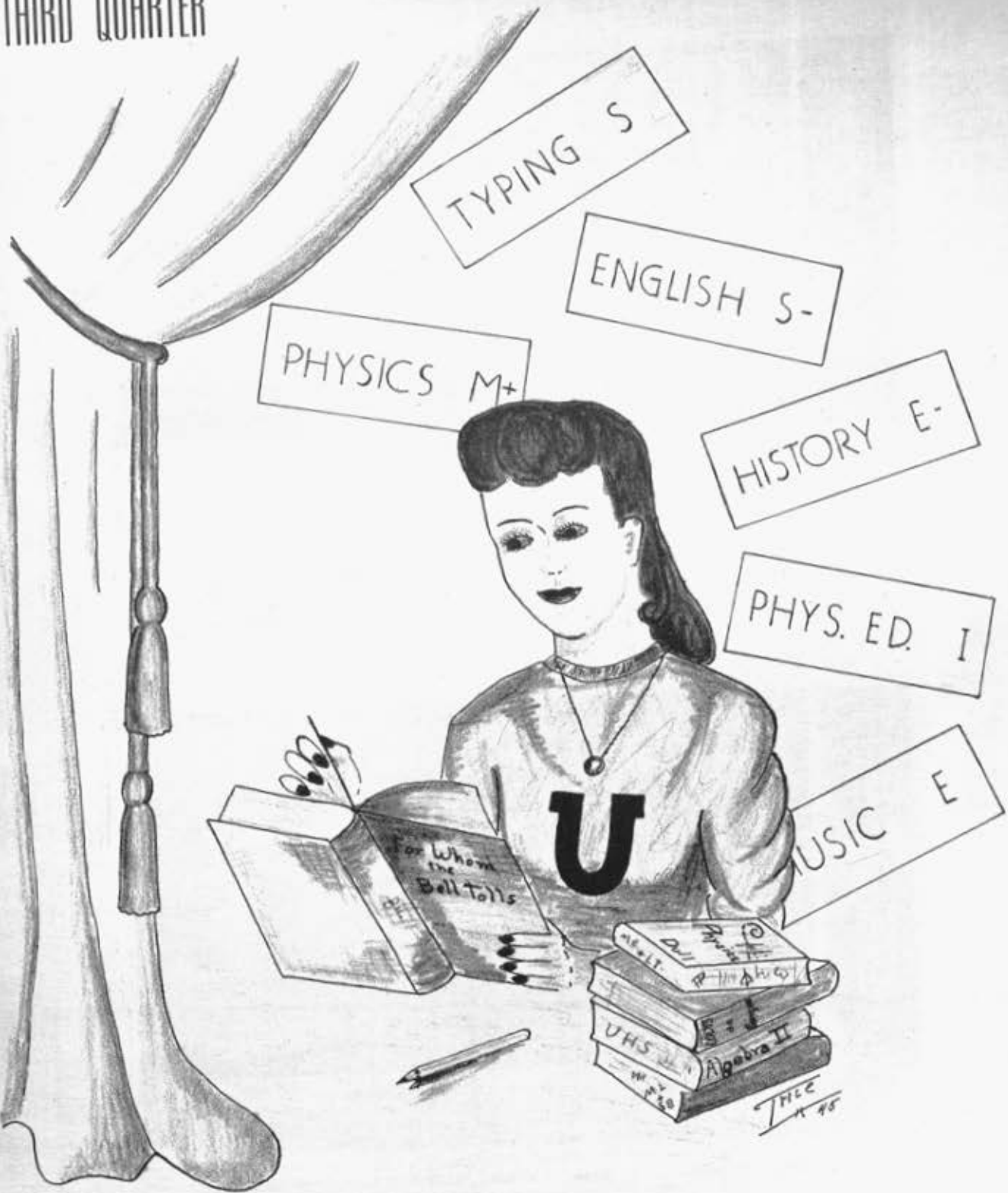

APRIL

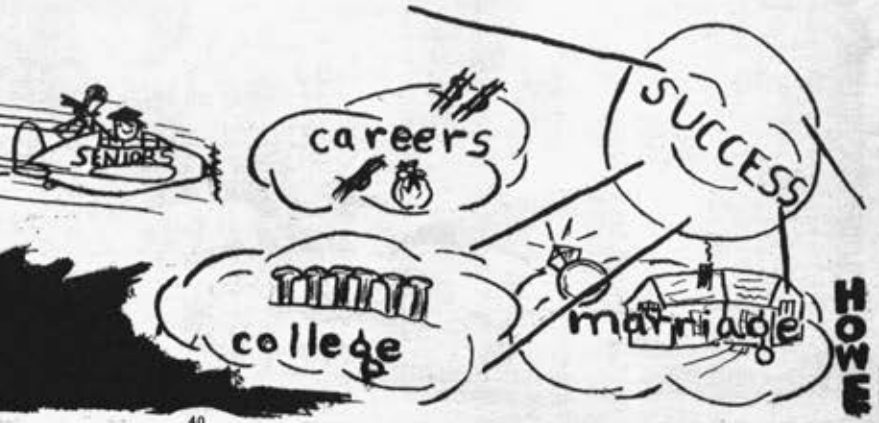
