Digitizing Status Report

As of November, Digitizing Services has 5 projects in various stages of completion. The largest of these projects is the Missouri County Histories. This project consists of 107 books to be digitized, OCR'ed and corrected into full text searchable format. To date, work has progressed on schedule, with 38 books digitized. As this is a statewide cooperative effort, we would like to say thank you to a few of those institutions who have graciously loaned us their material:

A project of great uniqueness is the digitization of documents provided by the family of Lloyd Lionel Gaines. The University of Missouri School of Law denied Mr. Gaines admittance in 1935. Gaines sought legal assistance from the NAACP, and together they challenged the admission policies of UMC all the way to the United States Supreme Court. The contents of the collection include photographs and letters written by Mr.

Gaines, as well as the legal correspondence with the NAACP. This collection, which portrays such a fascinating chapter of Missouri and United States history, will be available online for viewing in late January.

Stephens College and Digitizing Services have joined efforts to digitize the *Stephensophia*, the yearbook of Stephens College. This project consists of 31 yearbooks ranging from 1900 to 1940. When completed, visitors will be able to view the yearbooks in both image and text format with the collection being fully searchable. We have nine finished, 11 in the correction phase, and 11 left to scan.

eResources: ICOLOC International Meeting Report

Terry Austin recently attended the ICOLOC international meeting in Stockholm, Sweden. Various presentations from participants as well as a few vendor "grill" sessions were included. Everyone is still concerned about licensing/negotiations, open access, scholarly communications/publications, and, of course, pricing. One of the highlights was a report from the Norwegian University Libraries who were successful in getting Blackwell to come back to the negotiation table after saying no to Blackwell's inflexible offer. A presentation was also given on support of the Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ) from Lund University. NELLCO (New England Law Library Consortium) announced funding from IMLS to develop an open source federated search engine.

On the vendor grille side, it was interesting to hear that the American Chemical Society (ACS) will roll out a new pricing model for the international markets based on its often less than successful attempt to change their domestic pricing model. Their domestic model is a value-based model consisting of a Carnegie-like classification scheme, impact factor and usage. This model was unsuccessful for many US academic libraries, including the UM System. This model caused exorbitant increases for us and was not used. Instead, we returned to the old model based on caps for increases for a multi-year deal and a switch to electronic-only from print. Also included in the vendor sessions were Cengage (Gale), Wiley-Blackwell, and Credo Reference.

LSO Begins Maintenance of MERLIN WebPAC

As announced to the UM ILS Coordinators mail list in mid-October, LSO will be taking over maintenance of the MERLIN WebPAC. Here are some details on what that means.

Hardy has sorted through the list of open WebPAC tickets for MERLIN, and has asked the Coordinators for input on that sorting process.

The guiding philosophy of what tickets LSO will take over will be: if the problem is a result of, or can be influenced by, a WebPAC file (either .html or wwwoptions), we'll take it.

MCO will remain the primary point of contact for all issues regarding the MERLIN WebPAC. That doesn't mean that LSO can't be CC'd on incoming ticket notices, but MCO will continue in their help desk role. There are many kinds of problems that will manifest symptoms on the WebPAC. Not all of those problems are due to html or wwwoptions errors. Having a single point of contact will hopefully make things simpler for those reporting problems, and be the most efficient use of all of our resources.

Based on his review of open tickets, Hardy believes his time will be most efficiently spent in organizing how the WebPAC files are manipulated. He plans

to use the Perl Template Toolkit (<http://template-toolkit.org/>) to consolidate duplicate code, keeping everything consistent. Template Toolkit is an open source project, has been around since 1996, and has an active development community. It also has an O'Reilly book, *Perl Template Toolkit*, ISBN 0596004761.

We will utilize LSO's version tracking system, Subversion, to track changes to the WebPAC over time. This will allow us to back out of changes, to a known working state, if necessary.


It is our intention that LSO and MCO will use the same system to manage the WebPAC files. Specifically, both MCO and LSO will use the LSO Subversion code repository to track revisions to these files and Template Toolkit to generate them. This will ensure that changes made to the WebPAC files are made in a consistent, organized way.

Hardy will write Perl scripts to handle publishing the material resulting from the Template Toolkit. These scripts will be coded in such a way that they will work generically, from any of our computers.

Steps will be taken to ensure that changes to the WebPAC files from outside of LSO's system will be detected and either incorporated or discarded.

Electronic Resources Held by the UM Campuses


Each of the UM libraries recently sent LSO a list of their current electronic resources in order to help MCDRSC consider if we could achieve cost savings by purchasing collectively instead of through the individual campuses.

There are a total of 428 electronic resources held by UM libraries:

- ◆ 297/428 are held by only one UM campus
- ◆ 34/428 are held by two UM campuses
- ◆ 11/428 are held by three UM campuses
- ◆ 86/428 are held by all UM campuses (all are subscribed to through LSO or provided by MOREnet)
