

GULLICK FADNESS KRAUSE

(Written text and photographs provided by Arlene (Romig) Krause Heacox). **Gullick Fadness Krause (Goldie)** was born on March 8, 1917, in West Fork, Sheridan County, Montana. He was the son of Otto Franz Krause and Lillian (Fadness) Krause. Gullick had three sisters; Frances Mylla was two years older, Lillian Ruth (Bunny) a year younger and Dorothy Arlene Krause twenty-four years younger. When Gullick Krause and his first two sisters were just little, Otto Francis and Lillian (Fadness) Krause owned and ran a horse ranch near Scobey, Montana. The horses were trained (broken) for riding and also used as working horses for the farms/ranches in the area. The home they built on the ranch was destroyed by fire and when they rebuilt, tragically, it was destroyed by fire again. The family then moved from Scobey to Wolf Point, Montana, where Otto F. Krause worked for the Great Northern Railroad. During the middle or late 1920's they moved to Glasgow, Montana, where Otto Krause had the distributorship for Westland Oil Company. The Krause family home was a nice home on Fourth Avenue North in Glasgow. Otto Krause's work with the Westland Oil Company brought in a good income for the family. One of Gullick's memories of his childhood was that of his grandmother, Augusta (Richter) Krause. The family visited her in Fergus Fall, Minnesota, when he was a boy of about nine years old. Then during his high school years she visited them at their home in Glasgow, Montana for several weeks. He had fun, loving memories of her. During his high school years, Gullick Krause worked part time for his father, Otto F. Krause, at the Westland Oil Company and service stations in Glasgow, Montana.

Glasgow High School had a very good Music Department and an exceptionally good Music Director, Henry Scheisher. Gullick was a first clarinetist in both the band and the orchestra. The marching band wore kilts in honor of the name 'Glasgow' and were referred to as the 'Glasgow Scotties'. Gullick twirled baton in the marching band. He graduated from Glasgow High School in 1936. Gullick attended college in Bozeman, Montana, for part of the first year after graduating from high school, but returned home to work full time with his father, Otto F. Krause, at the Westland Oil Company later that year.

Gullick Fadness Krause married **Arlene Romig** at the Krause home in Glasgow, Montana, on April 17, 1940. Arlene Romig was born in Casper, Wyoming, on April 26, 1920, and was the daughter of Frank E. and Jeannette (Gagen) Romig both of which were from Nashua, Montana. The Romig family moved to Great Falls, Montana, when Arlene was four years old. She attended school through the eighth grade in Great Falls, Montana. Her father, Frank Romig, was a carpenter and carpenter foreman and did well, but with the depression there was less and less work. The construction of the Fort Peck Dam on the Missouri River was one of the 'New Deal' projects of President Franklin Roosevelt and was located near Glasgow, Montana. In 1934 Frank Romig became employed as a superintendent of construction on the Fort Peck Dam and the family moved to Glasgow, Montana. Gullick Krause and Arlene Romig became acquainted during their High School years in Glasgow. Arlene also was a first clarinetist in her Junior and Senior years. By her sophomore year the family moved to the newly built town at Fort Peck, Montana, which meant riding the school bus twenty miles to Glasgow, Montana, to high school. Winter months were much colder than at the present time (60 degrees below at times). During the coldest winter months some students (from farm families as well) boarded with families of fellow students in Glasgow during the week which was better for school activities as well as convenience and safety. Arlene Romig graduated from Glasgow High School in 1938.

The (1936-38) alumni of Glasgow School are remembered for starting the Glasgow High School Trust Fund. Cecil Toftness (1938) started it with a lot of help from another classmate, Lois Markle (1938) and others. It was started in 1965. The Trust grew and gained more and more support from all the alumni and has continued to grow. It has helped many high school graduates with their education, as well as given educational equipment improvements in the High School and it continues to grow. The managing of the Trust was handed on to the next generation a few years ago.

Following their wedding in Glasgow on April 17, 1940, Gullick Fadness and Arlene (Romig) Krause left Glasgow, Montana, to live near Arlington, Washington. Within just a few months they moved from Arlington to Portland, Oregon, where Gullick learned welding. In May of 1941, they moved to Long Beach, California. Gullick Krause worked for the California Shipbuilding Corporation in San Pedro, California, as a welder and welding foreman and was 'frozen to his job' during the war years. Arlene (Romig) Krause worked for the California Shipbuilding Corporation as a typist.

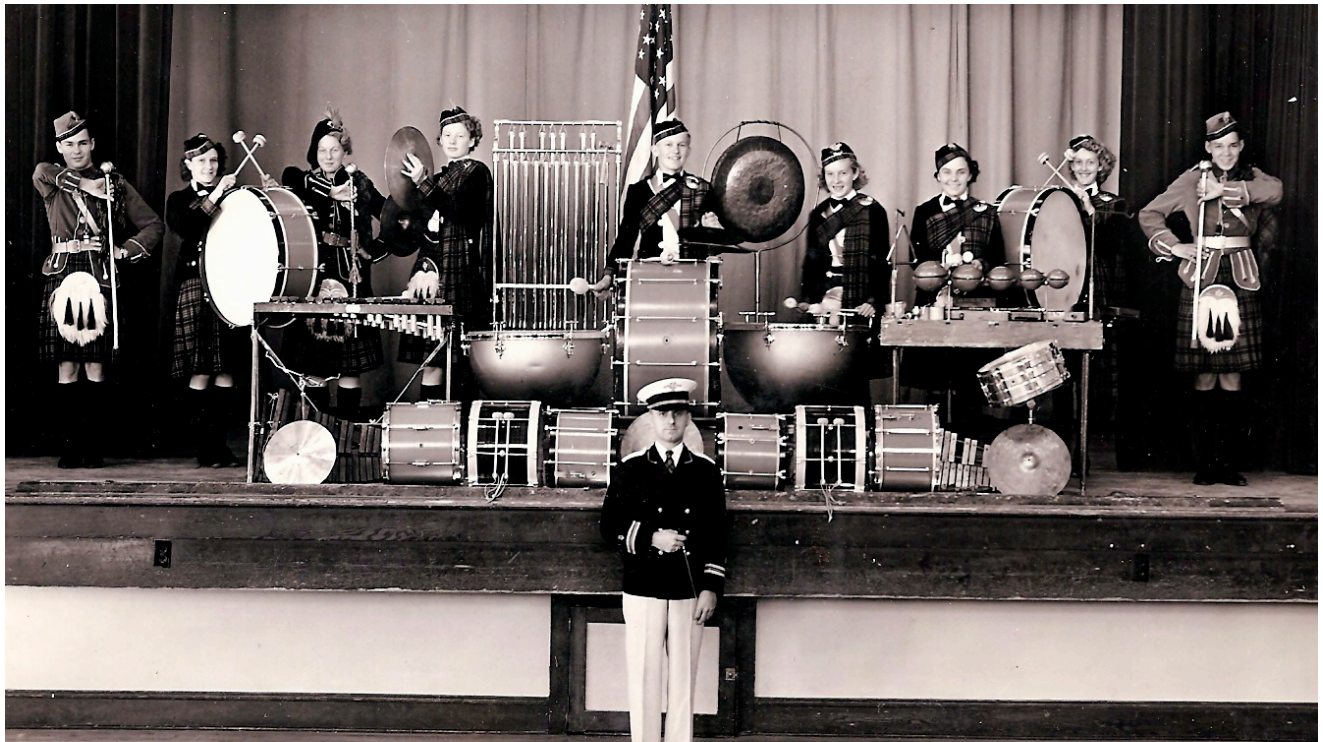
After the war, Gullick F. and Arlene (Romig) Krause returned to the Pacific Northwest. Their daughter, **Linda Joy Krause**, was born in Seattle, Washington, on August 16, 1948. Their son, **David Lee Krause**, was born in Eugene, Oregon, on October 10, 1951. The Gullick Krause family lived in Oregon, in the Eugene and Medford areas. Gullick's little sister, Dorothy Arlene Krause, spent considerable time with the Gullick Krause family and became an important part of their family. Gullick Krause (Goldie) then worked in the timber and sawmill industry as a Millwright and then as a Sales Representative. Arlene (Romig) Krause taught piano and organ lessons when their children were still in school and later became a Real Estate Salesperson in Eugene, Oregon. In 1976 Gullick (Goldie) and Arlene (Romig) Krause moved to Sitka, Alaska. In Sitka, Gullick Krause worked as the Supervisor of the Sawmill Wood Room for Alaska Lumber and Pulp Company. Arlene also was employed by Alaska Lumber and Pulp Company as a secretary. Gullick and Arlene both retired in 1982. Gullick was 65 years old, Arlene was 62. They purchased a motor home and traveled, visiting family and friends for a couple of years prior to purchasing a home in Mesa, Arizona. They continued to enjoy their motor home for travel and visiting family and enjoyed the Mesa, Arizona area and its activities. Gullick was very active and seemed in very good health, but suddenly died of a heart attack on January 9, 1989. Gullick's parents, Otto F. and Lillian (Fadness) Krause had always been loving, generous parents and grandparents. Gullick, too was a wonderful, loving generous husband, father and grandparent.

Gullick and Arlene Krause had many good, close family years. While they were in the Medford, Oregon area they had a 40-acre place with a nice farm type home. Their daughter, Linda Joy Krause, loved horses so her parents searched and bought her one. Then they bought a registered Quarter Horse mare and she had colts. There were five horses at one time. Their son, David Lee Krause, also loved the horses, and really enjoyed living in the rural atmosphere with wonderful friends. The family moved back to Eugene, Oregon, after Dave Lee Krause graduated from High School. Following his High School graduation, Dave attended Lane Community College and the University of Oregon in Eugene. In Eugene, Oregon the Gullick Krause family had a home on 40 acres also. Gullick had a real talent for building and remodeling and used his skills to improve their homes. They had a son and daughter, five grand children, and four great grand children.

In January of 1989 Arlene (Romig) Krause continued to live in Mesa, Arizona, visiting family in Washington, Dorothy Arlene (Krause) Hayter, and in Alaska a son, Dave Lee Krause and family, during the summer months.

In April 1997 there was a Glasgow High School Trust Fund Meeting and Reunion in Laughlin, Nevada. Arlene went with some Glasgow, Montana friends for the meeting and activities. Russel Heacox, a Glasgow High School classmate, and Arlene became re-acquainted there. Arlene (Romig) Krause and **Russel Heacox** were married in September of that same year. They enjoyed many precious, good times. Russel Heacox died in February of 2005. They were living in Chico, California when he died. Arlene moved to Anchorage, Alaska, to be with Dave Lee and Margaret Krause, her son and daughter-in-law. Arlene continued to live independently in good health. She enjoyed being close to her family during the autumn of her life.

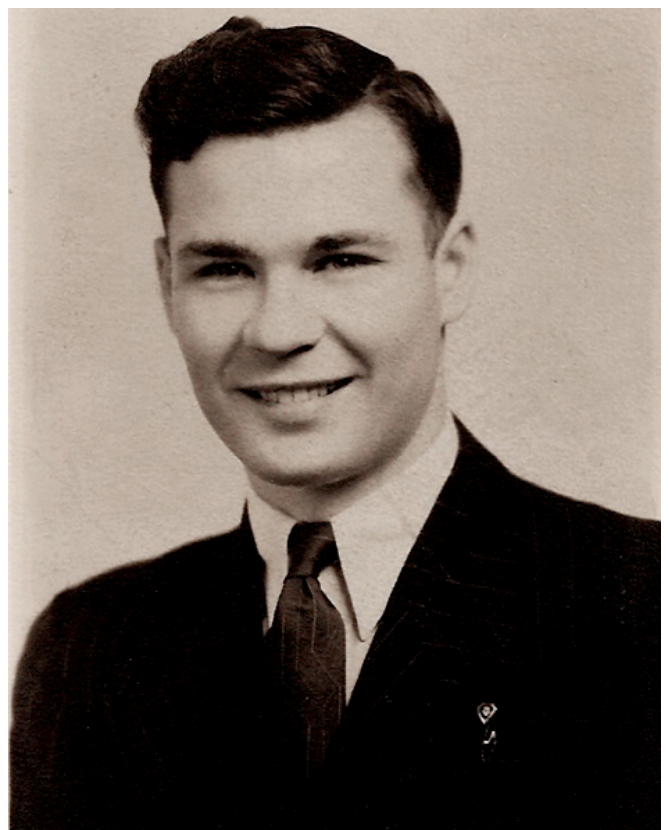

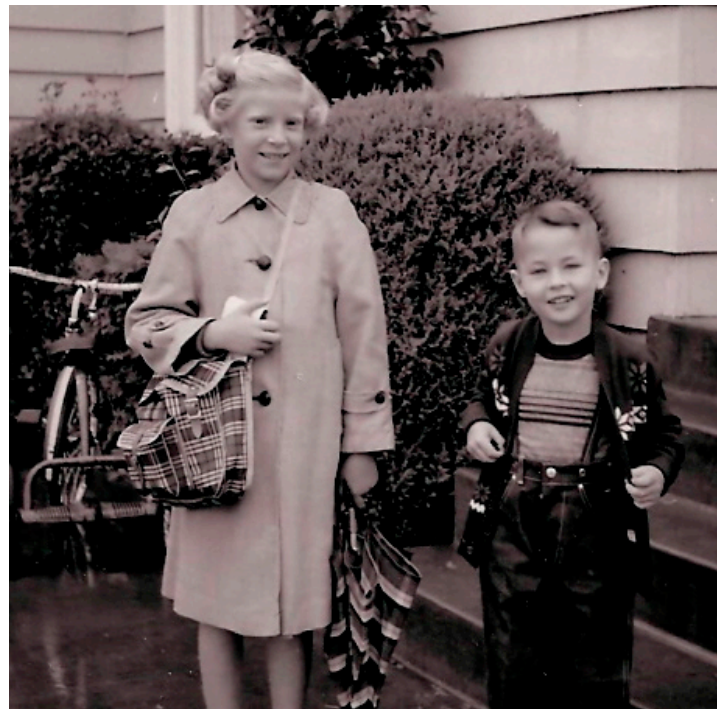

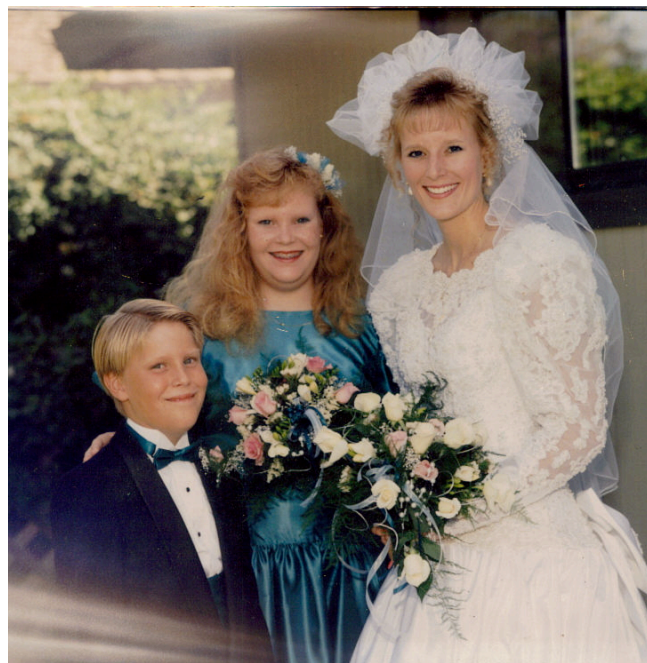

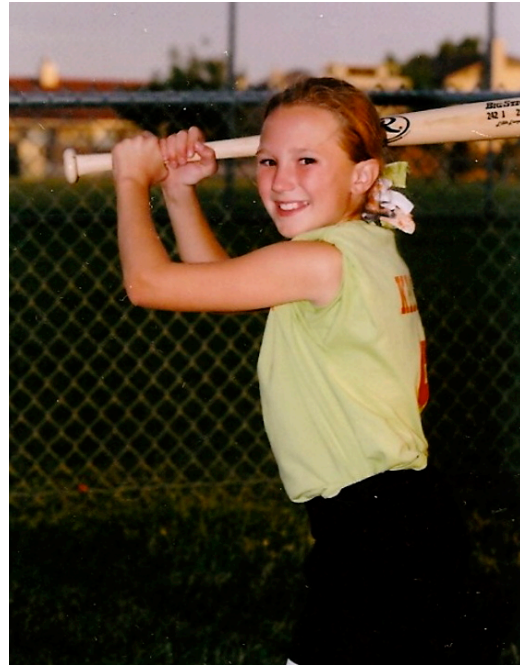

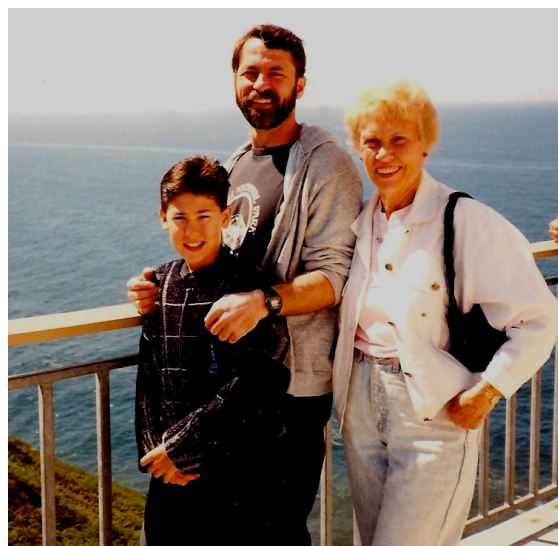

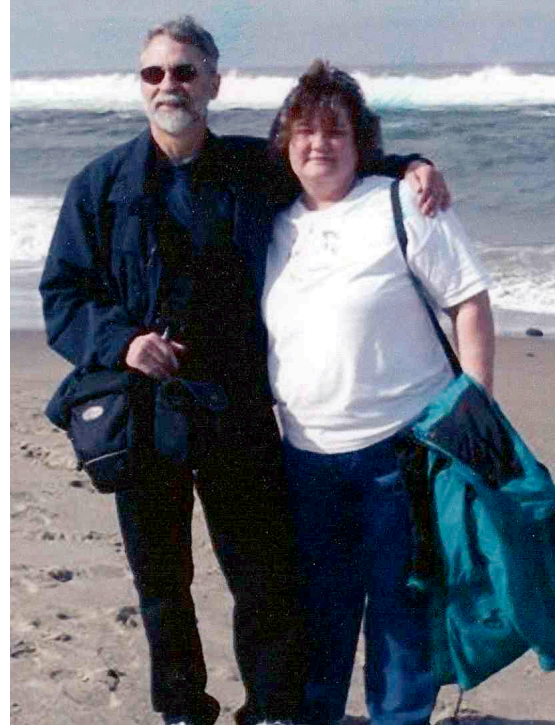

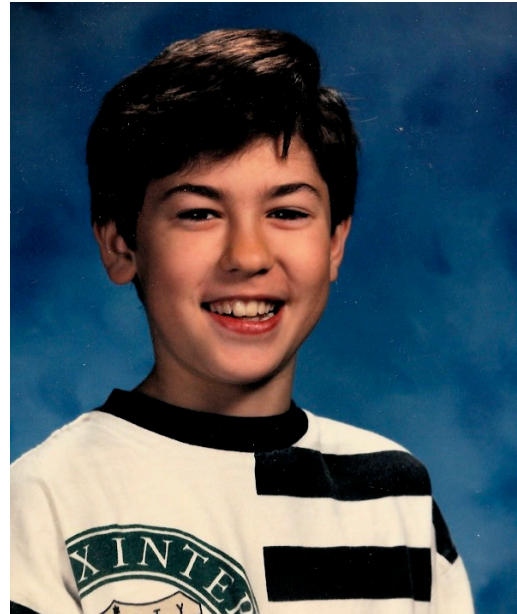

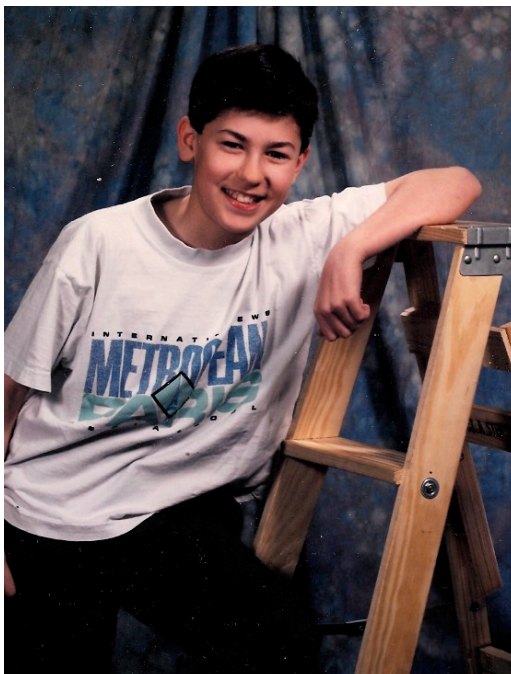

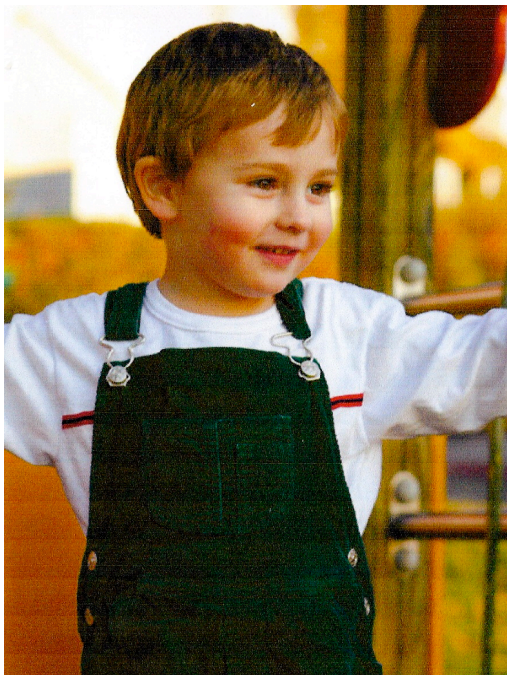
