

THEODORE NEIL NOBLE

(Written text and photographs provided by Theodore Neil Noble). **Theodore Neil Noble (Ted)** was born November 1, 1941, in Polson, Montana, and was the third child, second son, of Richard Harold and Lillian Ruth (Krause) Noble. He attended the first grade in Polson, Montana, and then moved with his family to Darrington, Washington, in 1947. Ted continued his education in Darrington and graduated from Darrington High School in May of 1959. Ted Noble joined the U.S. Army on September 3rd 1959. Ted completed basic training at Fort Ord, California, and Power Equipment Operator School at Fort Gordon, Georgia. He was stationed at the following: Fort Bragg, North Carolina; Fort Churchill, Canada; and Fort Lewis, Washington. Theodore Noble was discharged from the U.S. Army on September 1st, 1962. Ted Noble attended Everett Community College and received an Associate Degree in 1971. Theodore Neil Noble married **Sally Ann Hall** on June 12, 1964, in Darrington, Washington. Sally was born in Atchison, Kansas, on July 31, 1943, and was the daughter of Lillian and Warren Sapp. At the age of two her mother and father divorced. Sally's mother married Albert Eugene Hall in 1946. Eugene Hall adopted Sally and officially changed her name to Sally Ann Hall. Sally attended school from the first grade to the fourth grade in Buffalo, Kansas, and fifth and sixth grades in the Wichita, Kansas area. In 1954 her family moved to Darrington, Washington, where she attended school and graduated from Darrington High School, Darrington, Washington, in 1962. Sally attended Everett Community College and received a certificate in School Service Aide in 1976, graduating with honors. During her working career, Sally worked for J.C. Penny's in Everett, Washington, as a teachers aide in the Marysville Washington School System and for The Boeing Company at Everett, Washington. Sally enjoyed drawing and painting. She also enjoyed sewing and made numerous Halloween costumes for both son Rick and daughter Becky and for her grandsons. In addition, Sally made numerous quilts giving them to hospice in Sedro Woolley, Washington and to *Friends For Life*, a cancer support group in Yates Center, Kansas. Following their marriage Ted and Sally (Hall) Noble moved to Marysville, Washington, in 1965, where they lived until 2001. Ted Noble worked at Western Gear (Heavy Machinery Division) in Everett, Washington, from 1965 to 1987. Ted was then employed by Boeing in Everett, Washington, from 1987 until 2001 when he retired. Ted Noble was the *Boeing tooling employee of the year* in 1990. Following his retirement Ted and Sally Noble moved to Toronto, Kansas. In 2007, they moved to Yates Center, Kansas. Theodore Neil and Sally Ann (Hall) Noble had two children: a son, **Richard Eugene Noble**, born June 14, 1966, in Everett, Washington, and a daughter, **Rebecca Ann Noble**, born December 9, 1968, in Everett, Washington. Ted Noble enjoyed bicycling and running. Ted rode his bicycle across Kansas twice and once across Missouri and Idaho. He was a competitive runner and ran numerous foot races in Washington, Montana, and Kansas. He competed in distances of 800 meters, mile, two mile, 5K, 10K, 13.1 miles, 18.6 miles and 26.2 miles. Although Ted mainly enjoyed shorter runs, he did run four marathons. He ran a 3:11 in the Seattle marathon. Ted Noble's best times were as follows: 2:18 (800 meters), 4:29 (metric mile at the University of Washington), 4:43 (mile at the University of Washington), 16:11 (5K), 34:16 (10K), 1:21 (half-marathon), 1:58 (30K). Ted Noble participated in setting a national record at a track meet between the University of Washington and UCLA. The competition had invited the 12 fastest masters and eleven of them, including Ted Noble, finished the metric mile under 5 minutes. During his working career in Washington, Ted helped coach and train High School runners at Marysville, Washington, for over 25 years. Four of these athletes went on to become All-Americans at the University level. Ted was associated with the girl's High School cross country of Marysville, Washington, that won the State Championship in 1998. Prior to his leaving Marysville, Washington, the athletic director of Marysville High School presented Ted Noble with a varsity letter prior to the tip off of a high school basket ball game. An excerpt of this moving story was published on HeraldNet (Everett Herald) on Sunday, February 4, 2001. Ted remarked that this was a very humbling and rewarding experience for him. After to moving to Yates Center, Kansas, in 2007, Ted set up a training schedule for a young runner there that won the first ever state cross country metal in the history of the High School. The last known address for Theodore Neil and Sally Ann (Hall) Noble was Yates Center, Kansas.

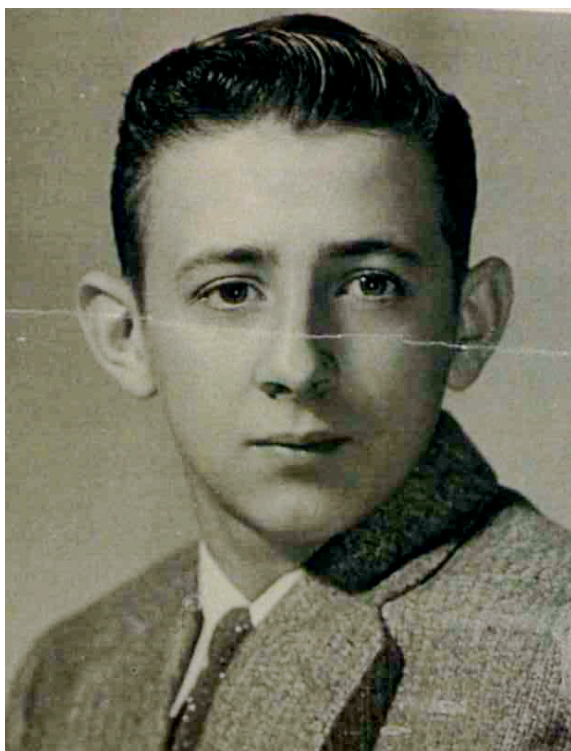

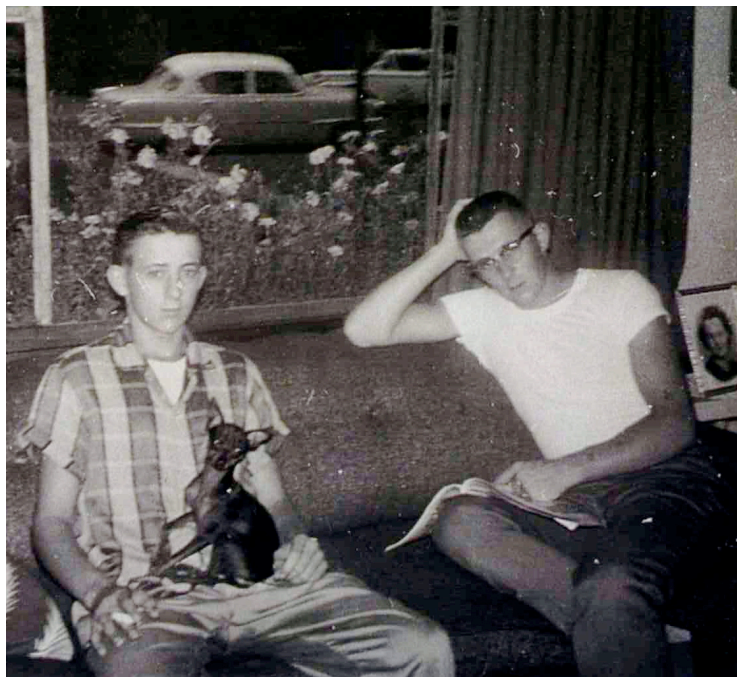

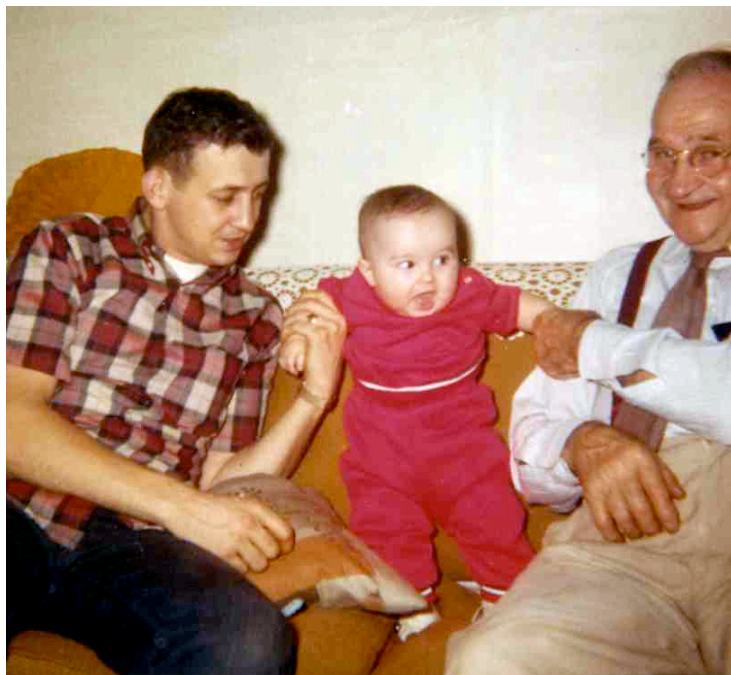

RICHARD EUGENE NOBLE

He was the son of Theodore Neil and Sally Ann (Hall) Noble. Richard Noble attended elementary school in Marysville, Washington, and graduated from Marysville-Pilchuck High School in 1984. Following graduation from High School, Richard enlisted in the United States Air Force and served four years. He left the military in 1988 and was employed by The Boeing Company in Everett, Washington. Richard Eugene Noble married **Cyndee Ann (Haug) Sanders** on July 8th, 2000.

Cyndee was born to Janine Thomas-Obstrupt on January 14, 1961, in Everett Washington. She was adopted by Patricia Ann and Robert Richard Haug at birth. She and her brother Kevin, who was also adopted, lived with their parents in parts of Washington and Oregon while growing up. Cynthia went to many elementary schools until her family finally settled in Marysville, Washington, where she graduated from Marysville-Pilchuck High School in 1979. Cynthia worked for The Boeing Company from 1979 -2003. During that time she married and had two children **Cynthia Michelle Sanders** and **Stewart Bradley Sanders**. Cyndee divorced in 1988 and then met Richard Eugene Noble in the late 1990s. Richard Eugene and Cyndee Ann (Haug, Sanders) Noble had a son, **Lucas Richard Noble**, born March 8th, 2004, in Bothell, Washington.

Richard Eugene Noble was a practicing Martial Artist. He owned an Aikijutsu School which opened in 1993 under the name of Yama Kei Aikijutsu, with the authorization and support of his instructor Soke Loyd Lovell. In April 2008 he was awarded a Kaiden Menkyo, promoting him to the level of eighth degree black belt and was given the title of Shihan (master). He instructed many of his students to the level of Shodan (black belt) at the time he was an instructor. Richard had an amazing intuition for energy healing and was a Reiki Master in Usui Reiki.

Cyndee enjoyed watching her children do their many activities while growing up and was always involved in either coaching or mentoring. Cyndee loved reading, working in the yard, getting together with friends, watching movies with Richard and their children, and going to the Ocean. In October 2005 Cyndee began her career as an Independent Associate with Pre-Paid Legal Services and enjoyed educating families and business how to gain access to the legal system and how to protect themselves against Identity Theft. She also studied the Art of Feng Shui and Qi-Gong and was a Reiki Master in Usui Reiki.

Richard also volunteered his time and energy to a street defense and self awareness course call "The Leap of Faith". Rich enjoyed running for exercise, riding his bicycle while pulling his son Lucas Noble in a bike trailer, and watching movies.

The last known address for Richard Eugene and Cyndee Ann (Haug, Sanders) Noble was Bothell, Washington.



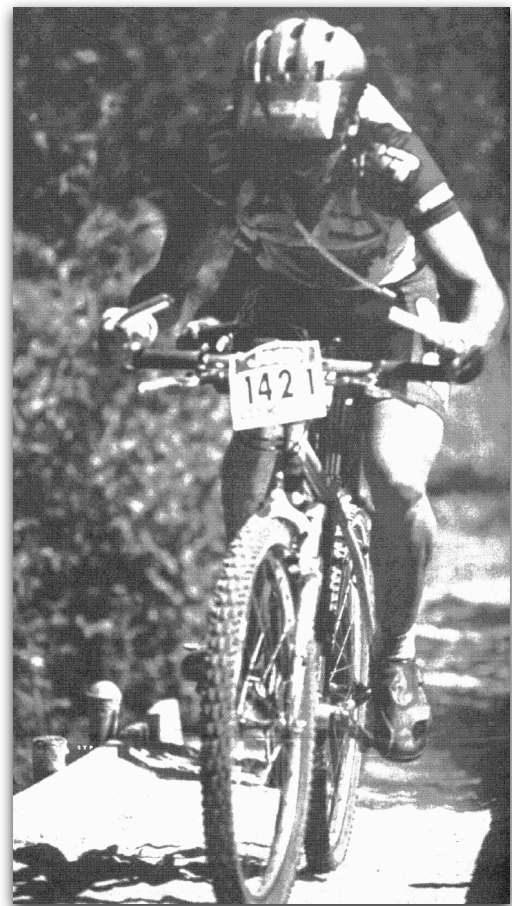

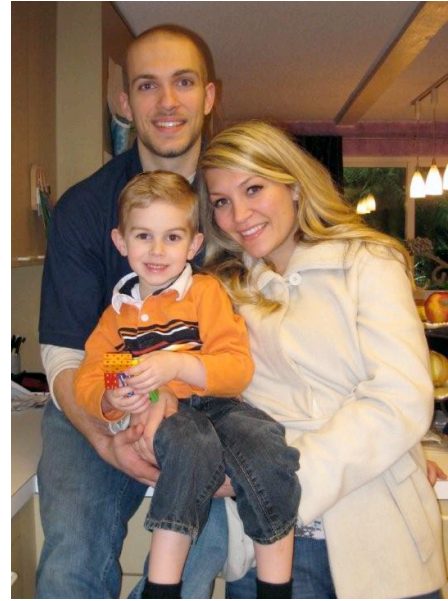

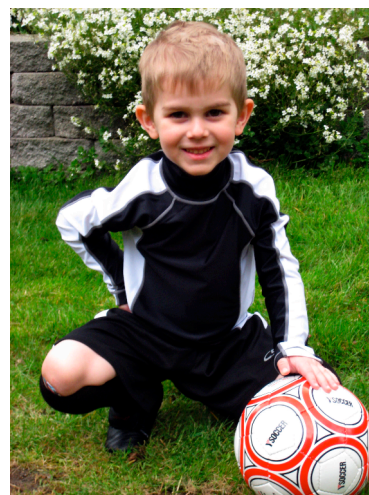
LUCAS RICHARD NOBLE

REBECCA ANN (NOBLE) WISE

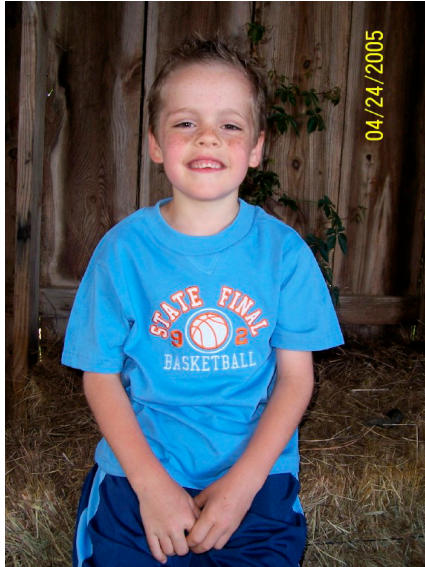

She was the daughter of Theodore Neil and Sally Ann (Hall) Noble. Rebecca Ann Noble attended elementary school in Marysville, Washington, and graduated from Marysville-Pilchuck High School in 1987. Rebecca Ann Noble married **Gary Lee Wise Jr.** on June 8th, 1996, in Marysville, Washington. Gary Lee Wise Jr. was born on January 1, 1973, in Frankfurt, Germany, and was the son of Gary Lee Wise Sr of El Dorado, Kansas and Debra Sue (Martin) Vogt of Eureka, Kansas. Gary was born overseas while his father was serving in the Army and stationed in Germany. Gary Lee and Rebecca Ann (Noble) Wise had three sons. *Identical twin sons*, **Jacob Neil Wise** and **Zachary Eugene Wise**, born one minute apart on April 15, 1998, in Everett, Washington. Both weighed 5 pounds 3 ounces. They were born pre-mature by c-section at 34 weeks. Neither baby had any medical problems at birth. The boys were so identical that mom and dad were afraid that they would mix the babies up. Jacob wore blue nail polish on his pinkie finger until their hair came in. The twins have cowlicks on opposite sides of the back of their heads. (Jake's is on the right hand side, Zacks' is on the left). Their youngest son, **Joshua Richard Wise**, was born on April 30, 2000, in El Dorado, Kansas. Josh weighed 6 pounds 15-ounces. He was born by emergency c-section four weeks early. Gary Lee Wise Jr. and Rebecca Ann Noble met in Kansas while Becky was on vacation visiting family. Carlene Hall (Becky's aunt) owned a small bait shop/gas station/deli/grocery store in the middle of nowhere. On the walls of the store were pictures of a huge catfish that the locals caught. Becky wanted to catch one of these huge fish. Carlene couldn't take the time off to go so she found someone else to take Becky fishing. Gary Wise was a full time working cowboy for one of the local ranchers. Gary would come into the store almost every day for lunch.
