



Missouri Elderly Population Trends: Mostly Slow but Steady Increases

The number of Missourians 65 and older increased slowly between 1990 and 2007, although with considerable variation by location, a new Missouri Census Data Center (MCDC) Web site application shows. The state's senior population (those 65 years of age and older) grew at an annualized rate of 0.5 percent from 1990 to 2000 and by 0.6 percent from 2000 to 2007, compared to 1,2 and 1.1 percent rises nationally. **Read more...**


















States Gaining/Losing Seats based upon 2010 Projections




Using the 2008 **Population Estimates** Missouri retains the 9th.


Using projections to 2010 Missouri loses the 9th.

But, migration is being impacted by the recession, and "Complete Count" issues may make the difference.




The projected growth rates for LA, MS and TX are based upon a one-year rate (2007-2008) only. Map: ST008NCA.STPOPS08.Est010m











Natural Increase of Missouri Population by County, 2000-2008










Net Migration of Missouri Population by County, 2000-2008




Population Pyramids of Missouri 2000 2020








Percent of Missouri's Population, 2005: Age 65 and Older





Missouri Senior Report, 2008 Composite County Rankings





- Mother of all address lists (enumeration)
- Only "Short Form" in 2010 (the count)
- Reapportionment and redistricting file by the end of 2010.
- Representation and Resource Allocation
- "Complete Count" Programs
- Instead of "Long Form" we have the
 - "The American Community Survey"



American Community Survey

- Nationwide, continuous annual survey collecting ${}^{\bullet}$ the information on the 2000 Census "long form"
 - Demographic, Economic, Social and Housing
 - From 1 in 6 households in 2000 to 1 in 8 now.
 - Three Million households a year.
- Most definitive source of such data (allocations)
- Involves Margins of Error --- (+/-) •
- Three types of estimates •
 - 1-Year 65,000 population or more
 - 3-Year 20,000 population or more
 - 5-year Less than 20,000 population (coming next year)




