


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#### Numeric Change in Population for States and Puerto Rico





#### Percent Change in Population for States and Puerto Rico





- Greater percent of population dependent








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
Natural Increase in Missouri Population by County 2000-2007




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










## **Percent Missouri Population Age 65+:** 1990-2020












#### Population Age 60 to 80 Years, 2005 As A Percent of Total




#### Missouri Senior Report, 2007 Composite County Rankings


























Percent to Births to Mothers with Fewer Than 12 Years Education


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


### Change in Economic Share by County 1996 - 2006






Percent to Births to Mothers with Fewer Than 12 Years Education by County, 2006












#### Graduation Rate by County, 2006

Annual High School Dropout Rate by County, 2006



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


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Percent of Workers Working Outside County of Residence 2000










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Supplemental Sercurity Income Payments as Percent of Total Personal Income 2005
