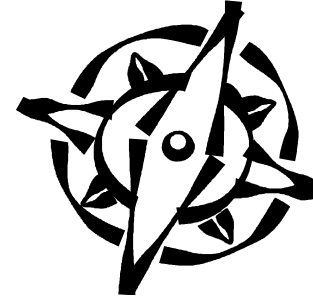

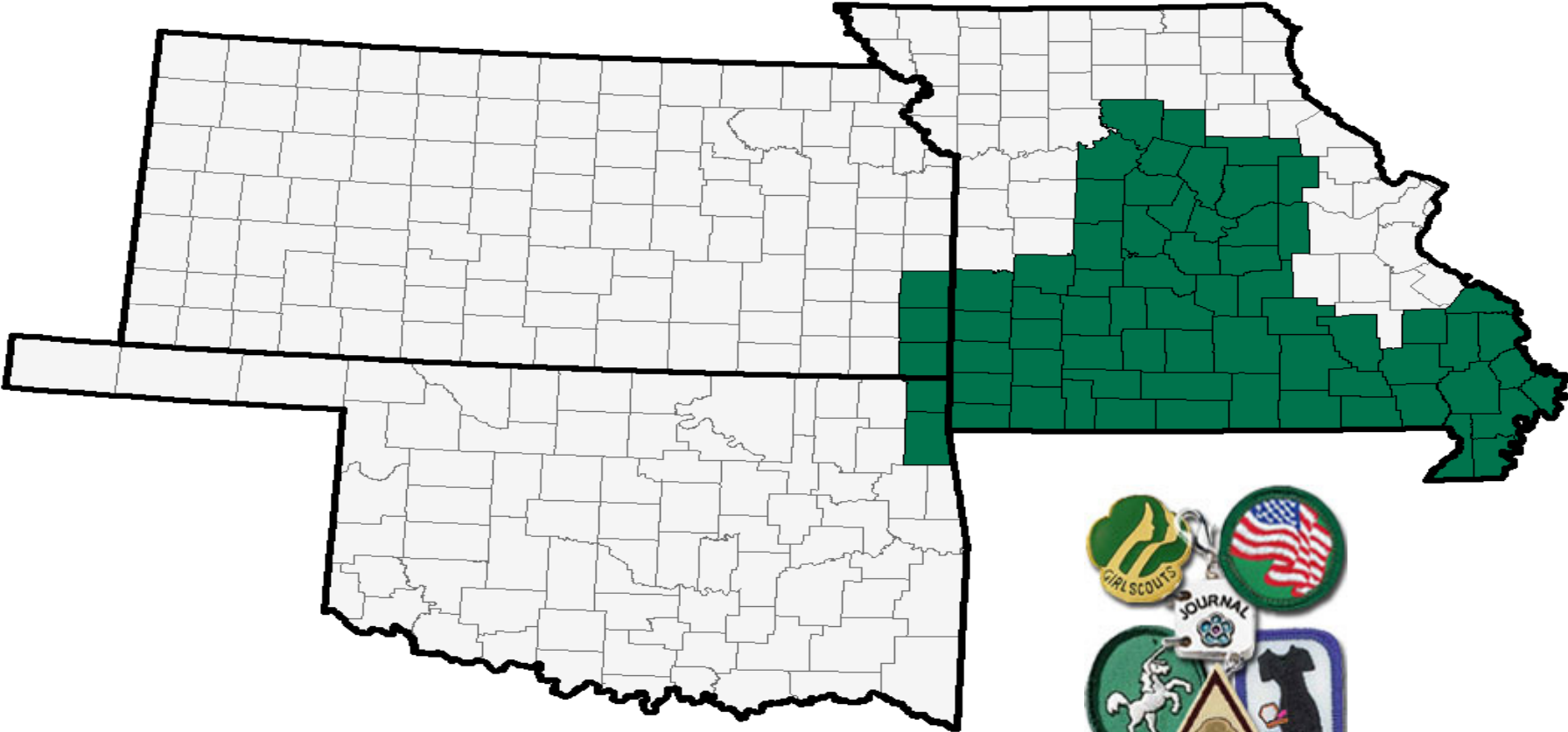

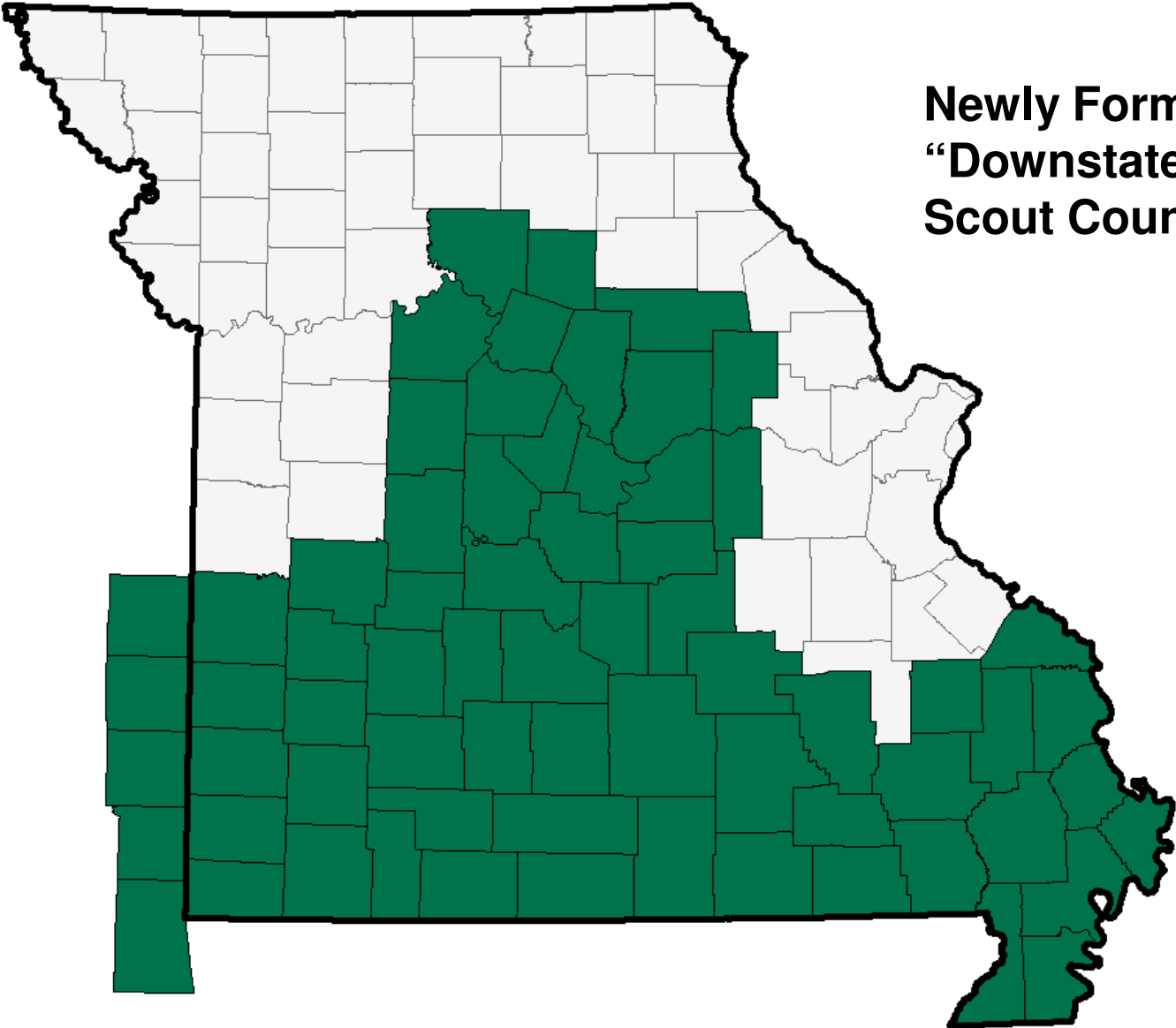
# “Charting our Journey”

- This diversity will require social and economic adjustments in our councils and communities.

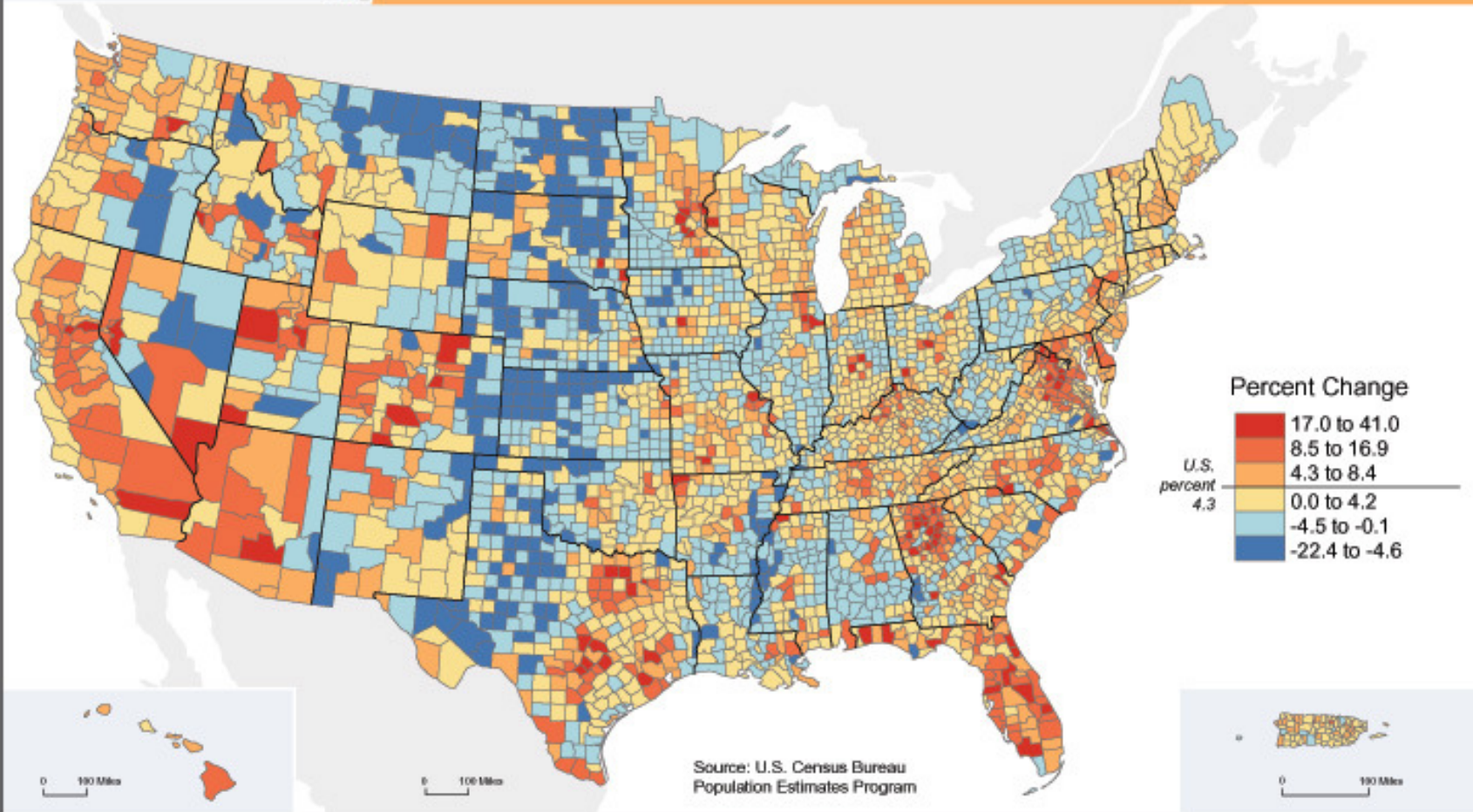
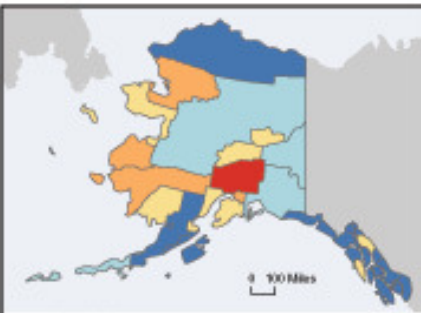

# Percent Change in Population for Counties: April 1, 2000 to July 1, 2004



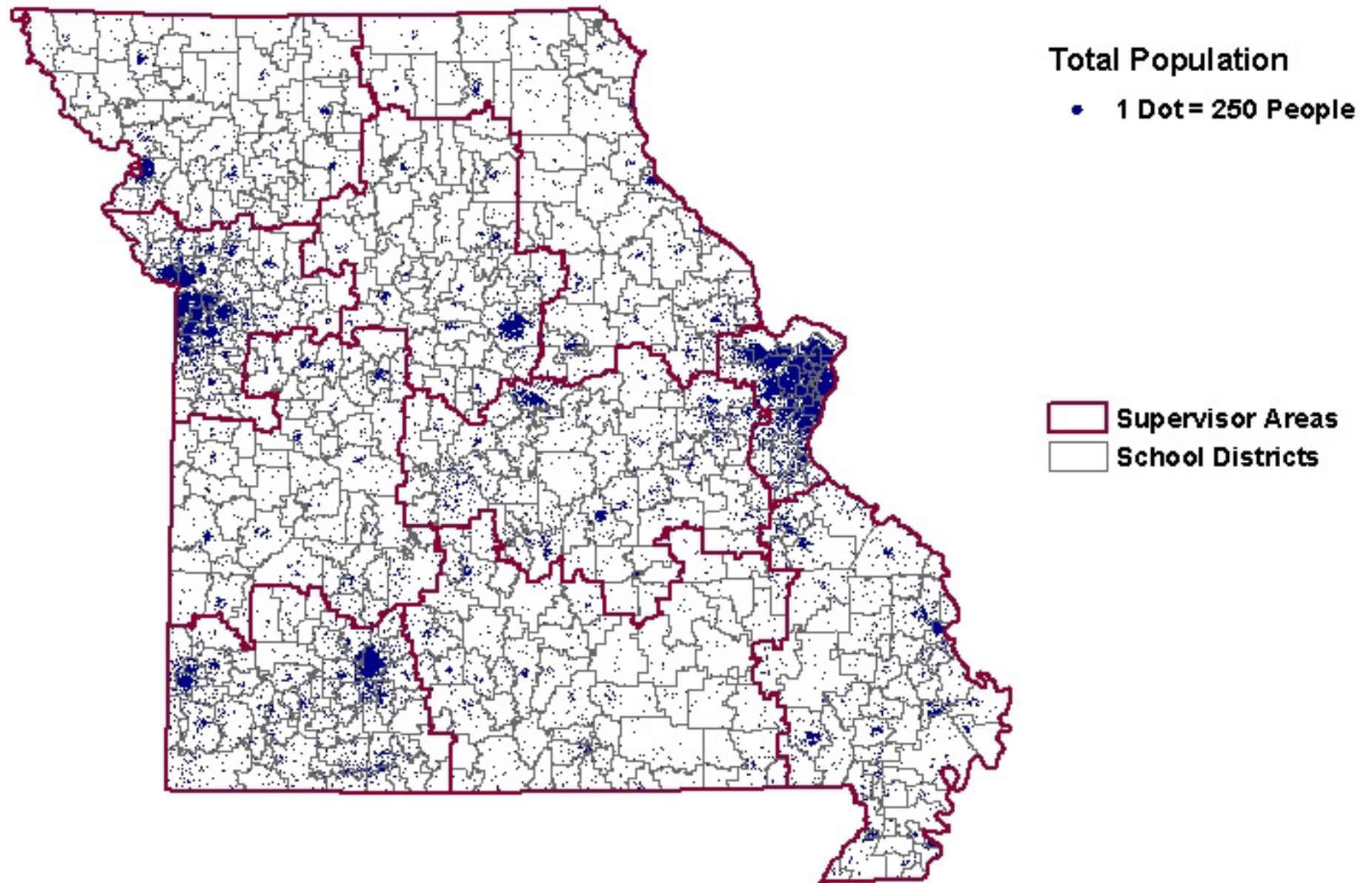


# Missouri population change 1980-1990 and 1990-2000

- From 1980 to 1990 more than 65,000 moved away from Missouri than moved in
- From 1990-2000 more than 250,000 more people to Missouri than moved away
- A majority moving here during the 1990s came from the west coast

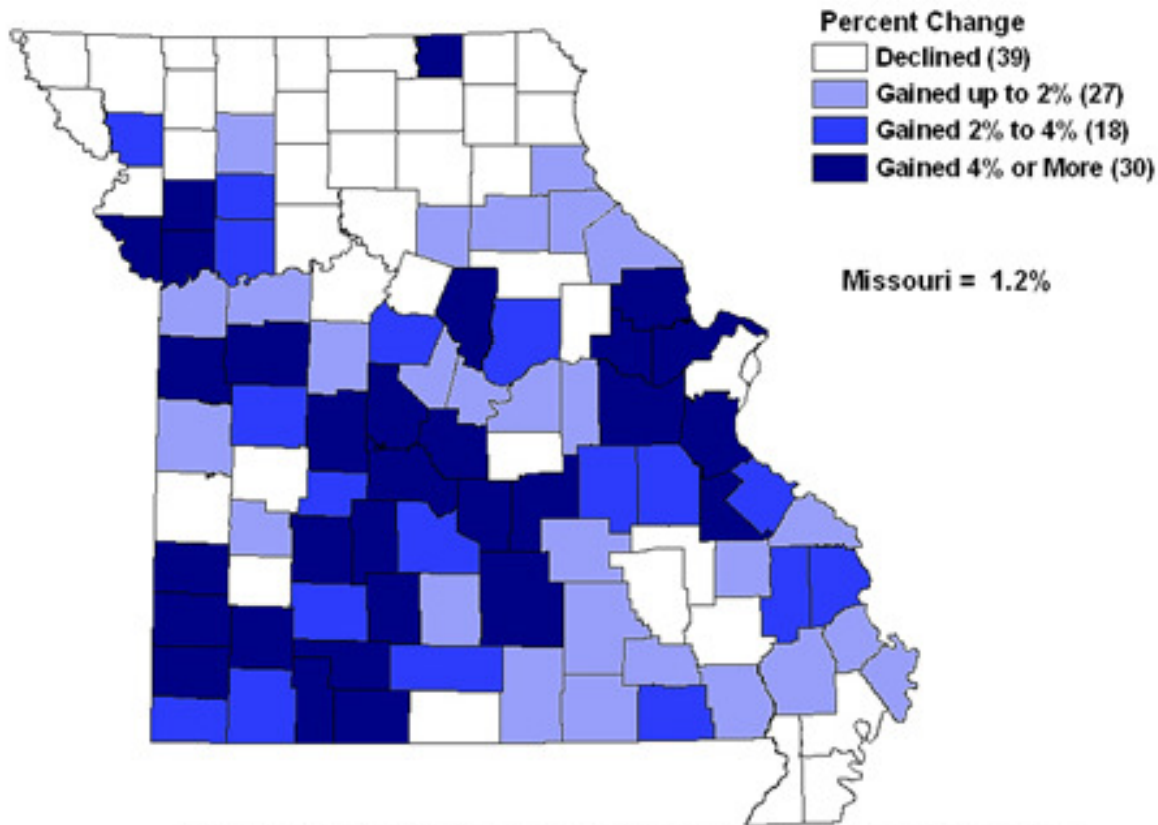


# Total Population by Block Group, 2000

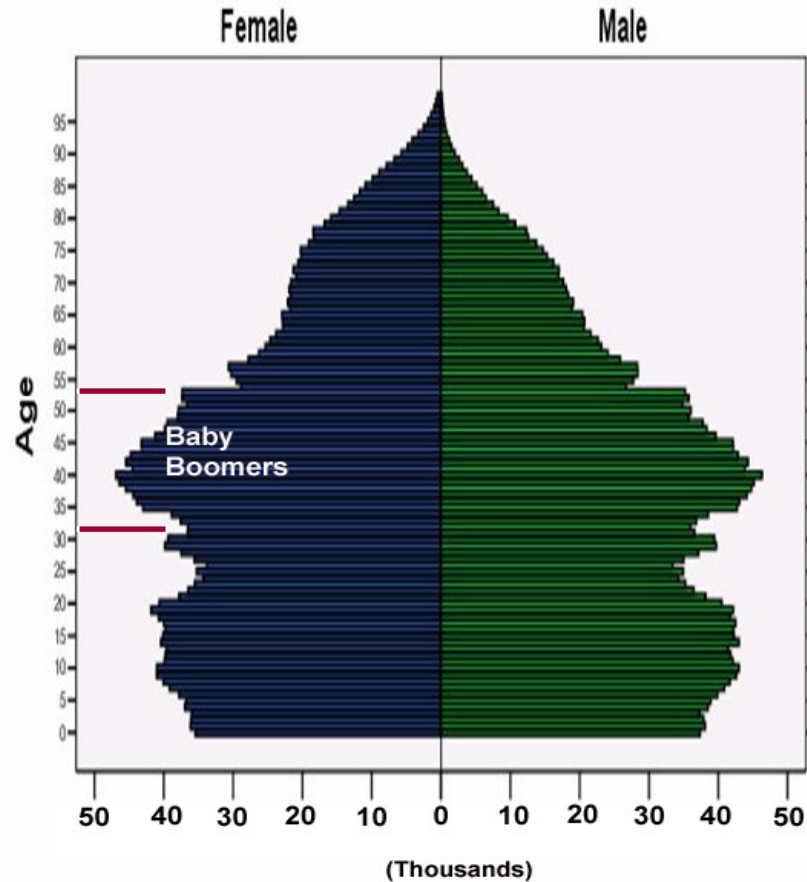

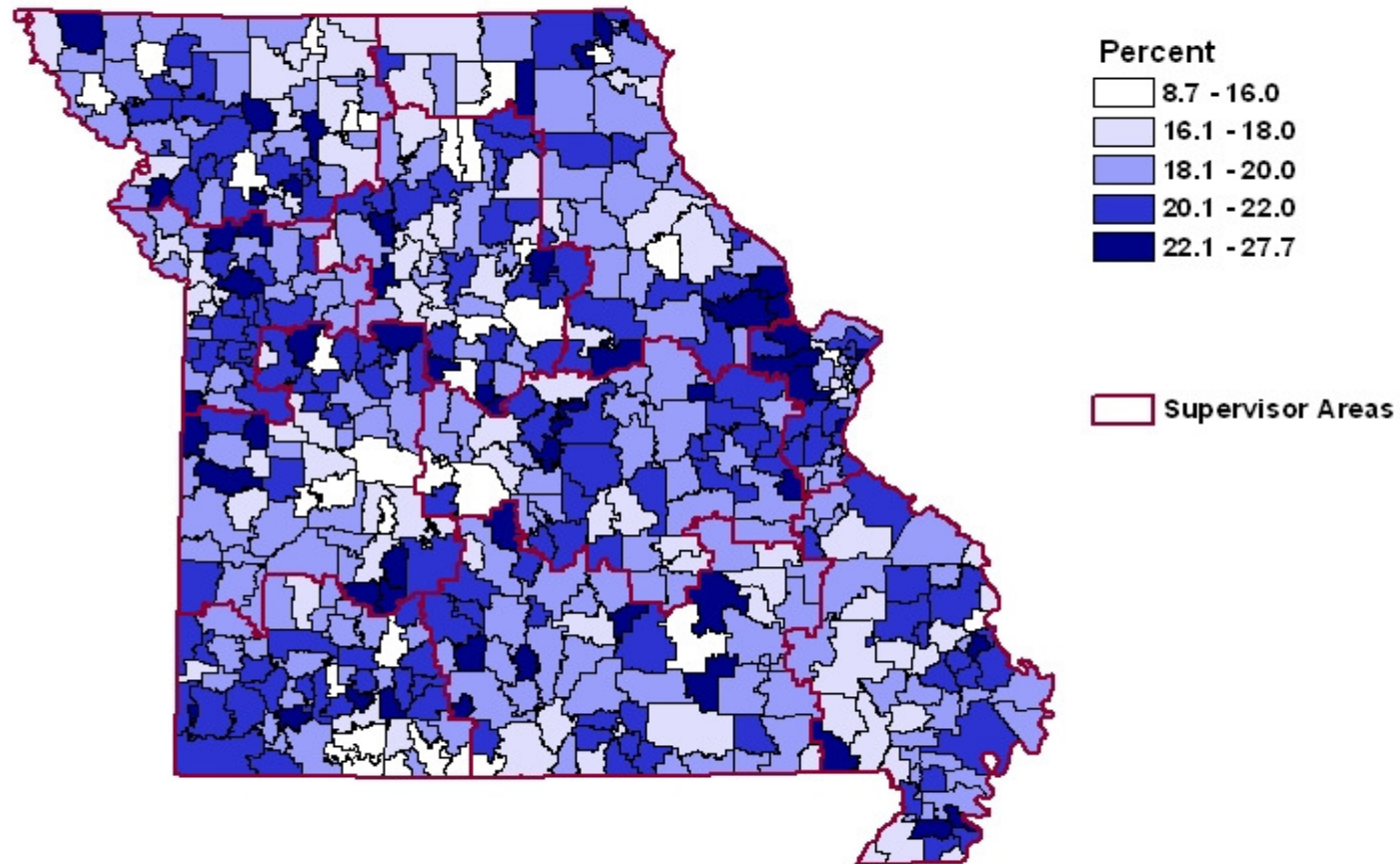


## Missouri Population by Age and Sex: 2000



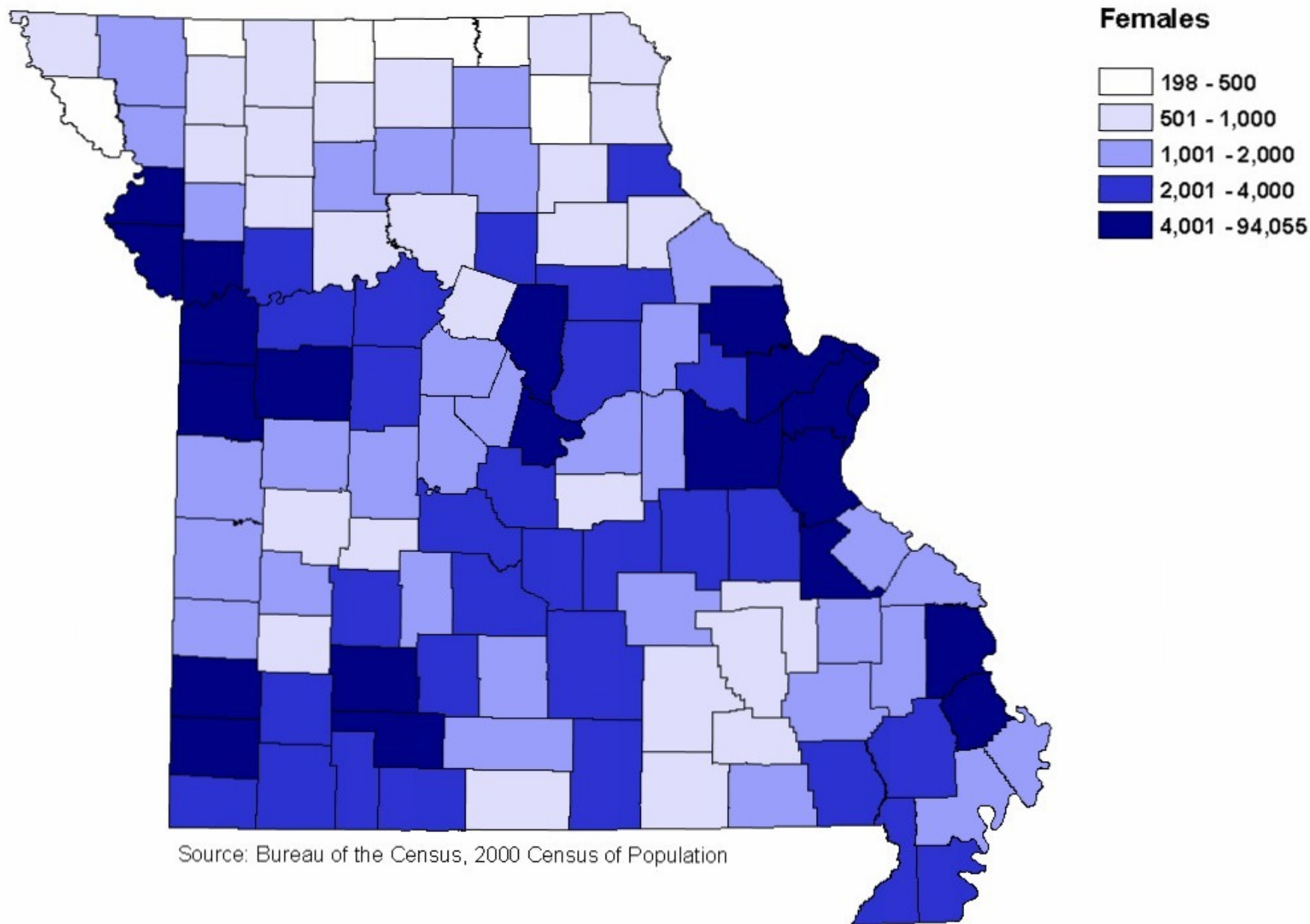

## Percent Population Ages 5 to 17 by School District, 2000



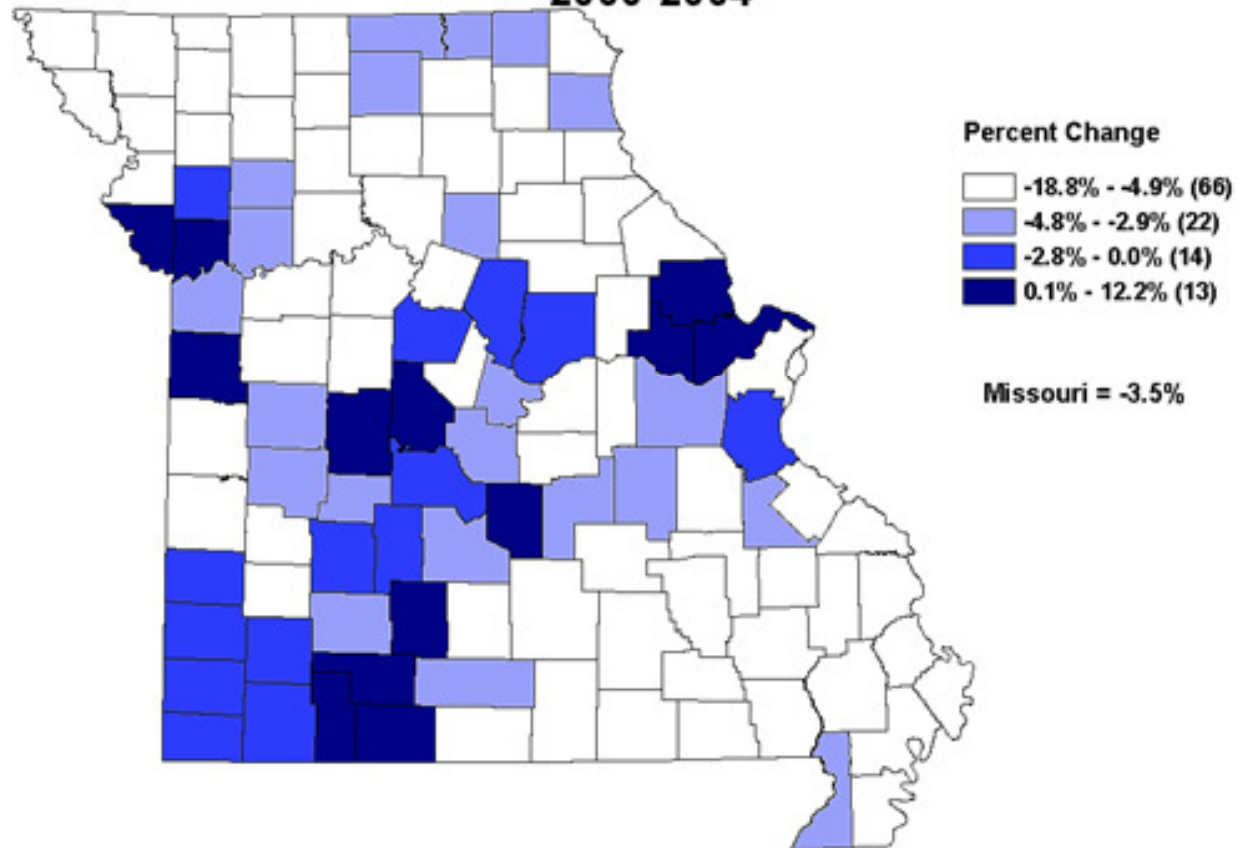

## Percent Change in Missouri Population Age 5 to 19 2000-2004

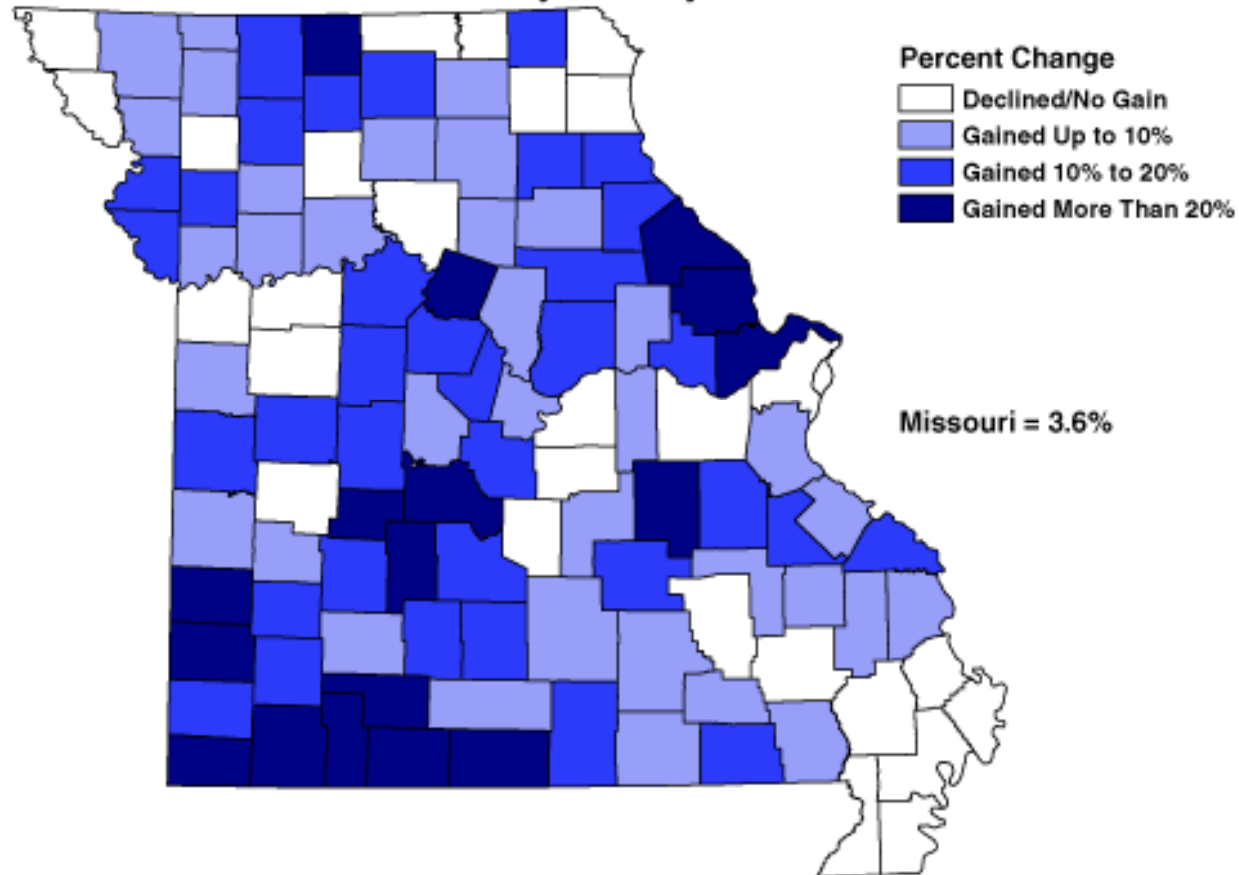

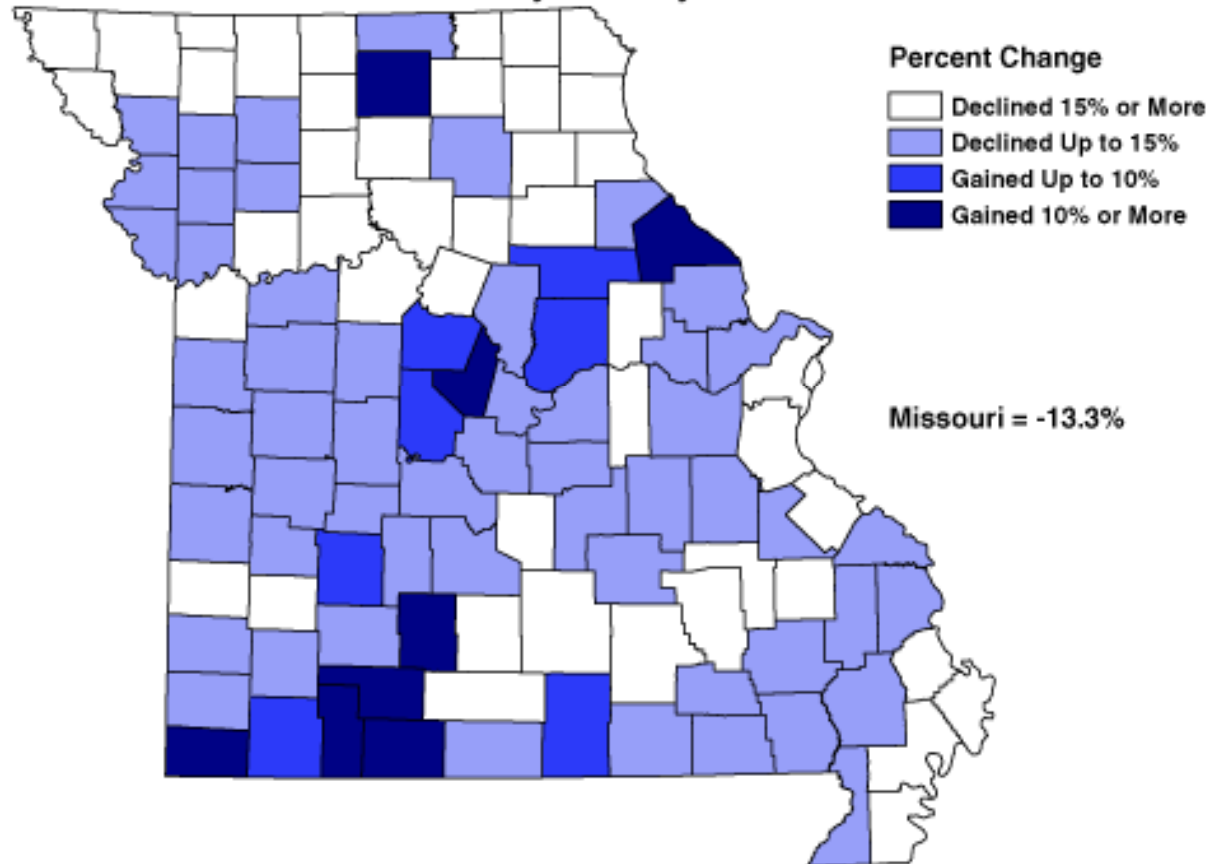


## Percent Change in Population Age 18 to 24 Years In Missouri, by County 1990 - 2000



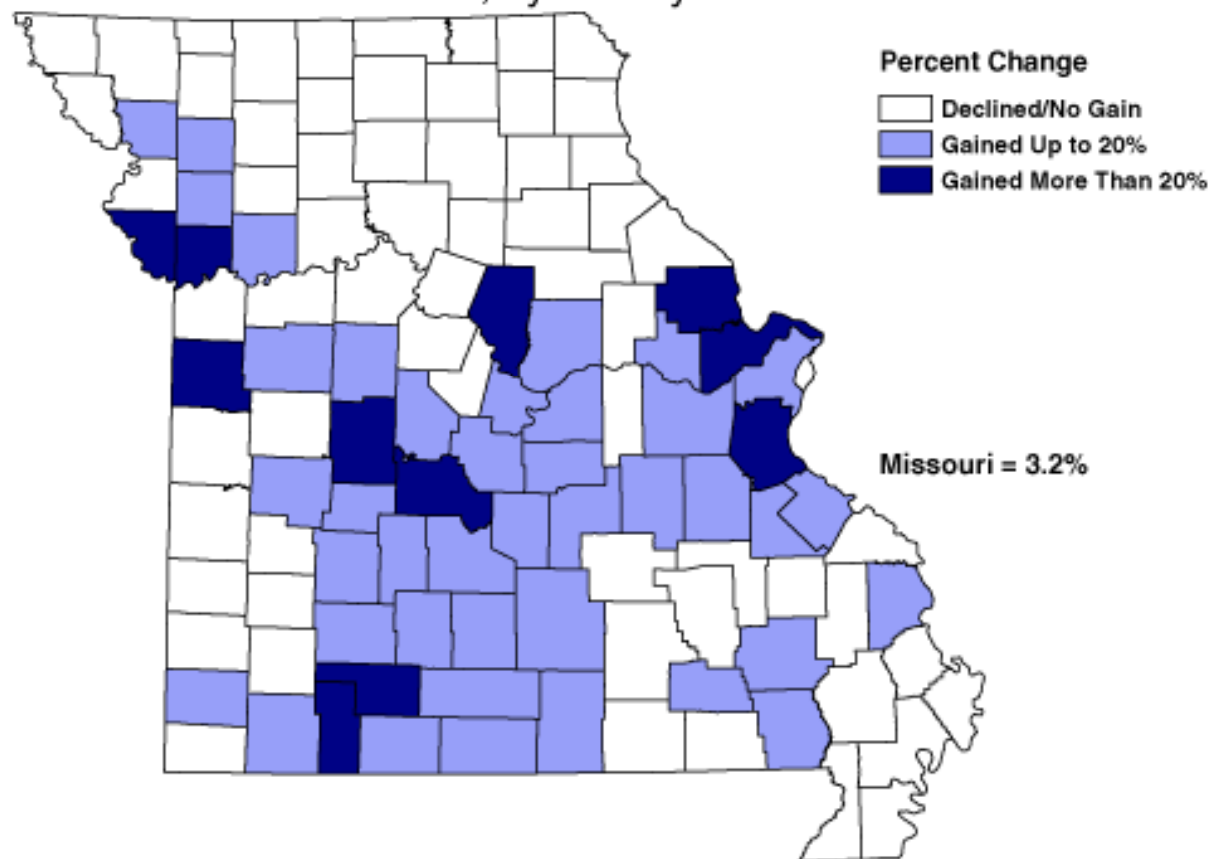

## Percent Change in Population Age 25 to 34 Years In Missouri, by County 1990 - 2000



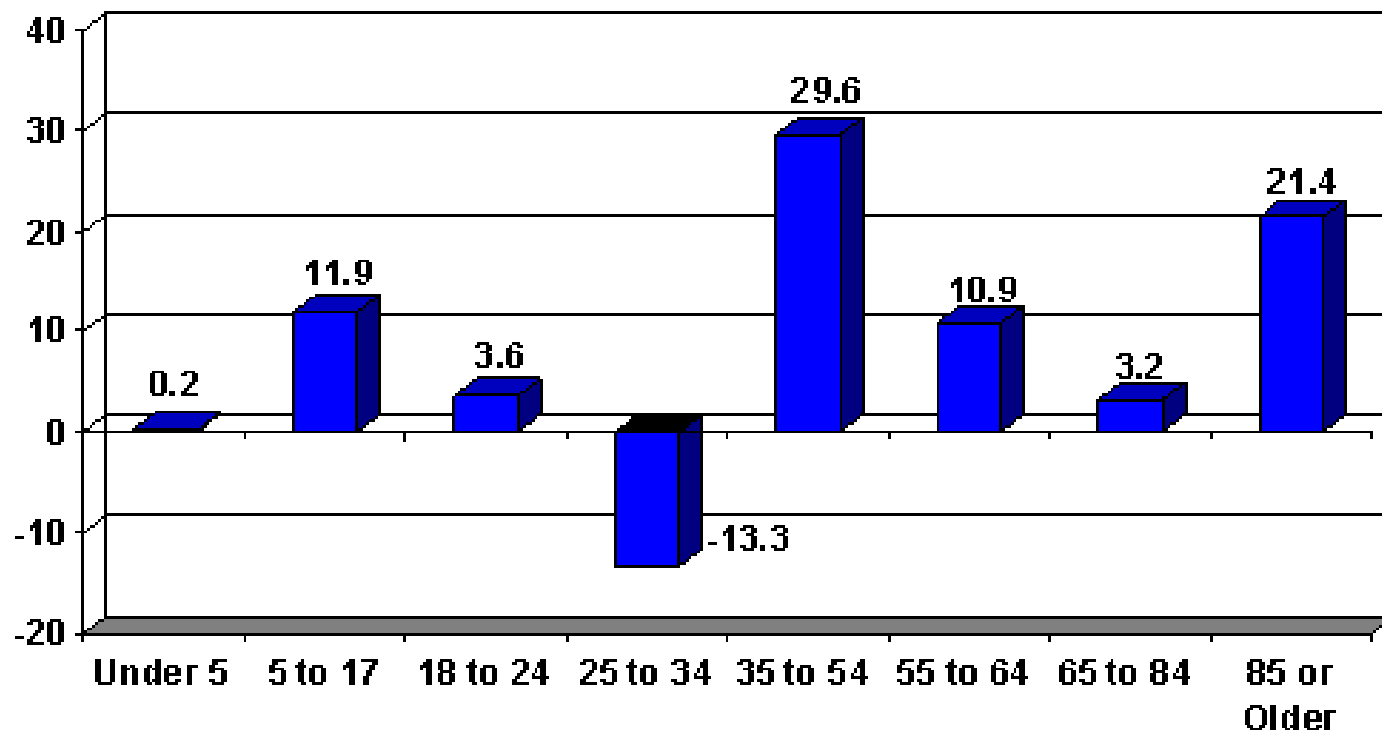

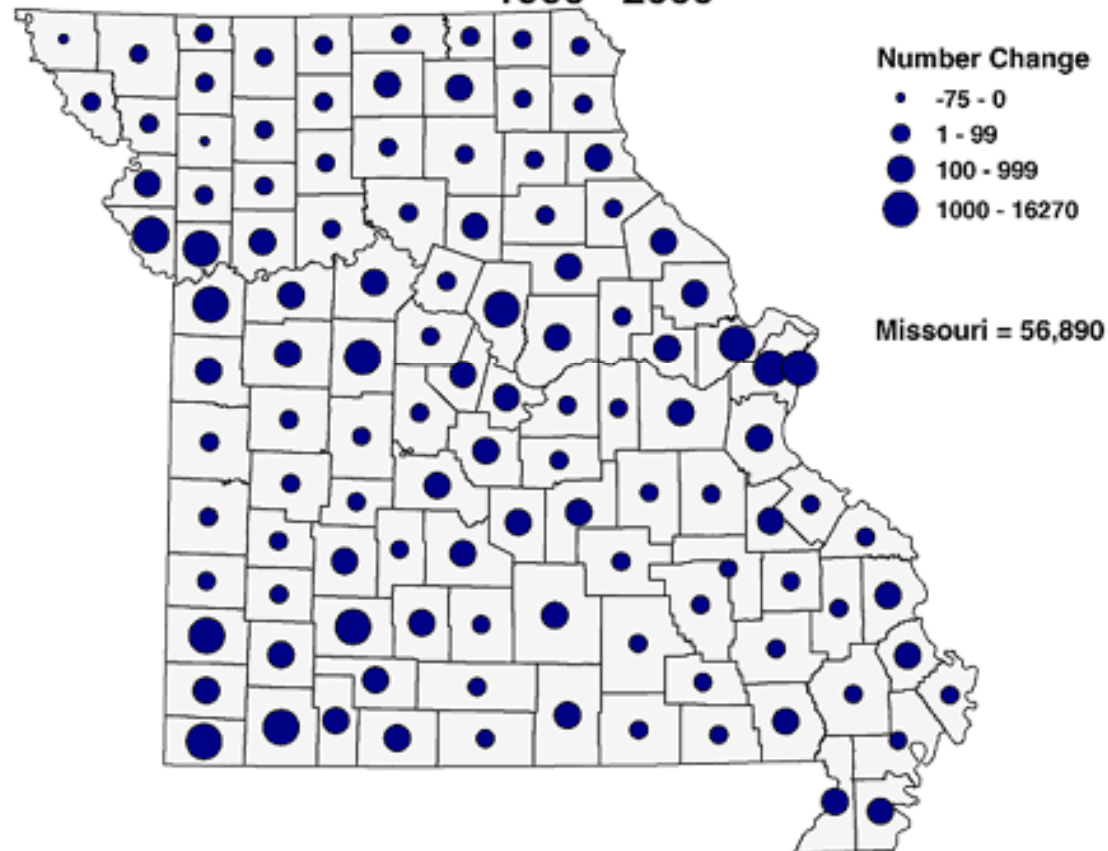

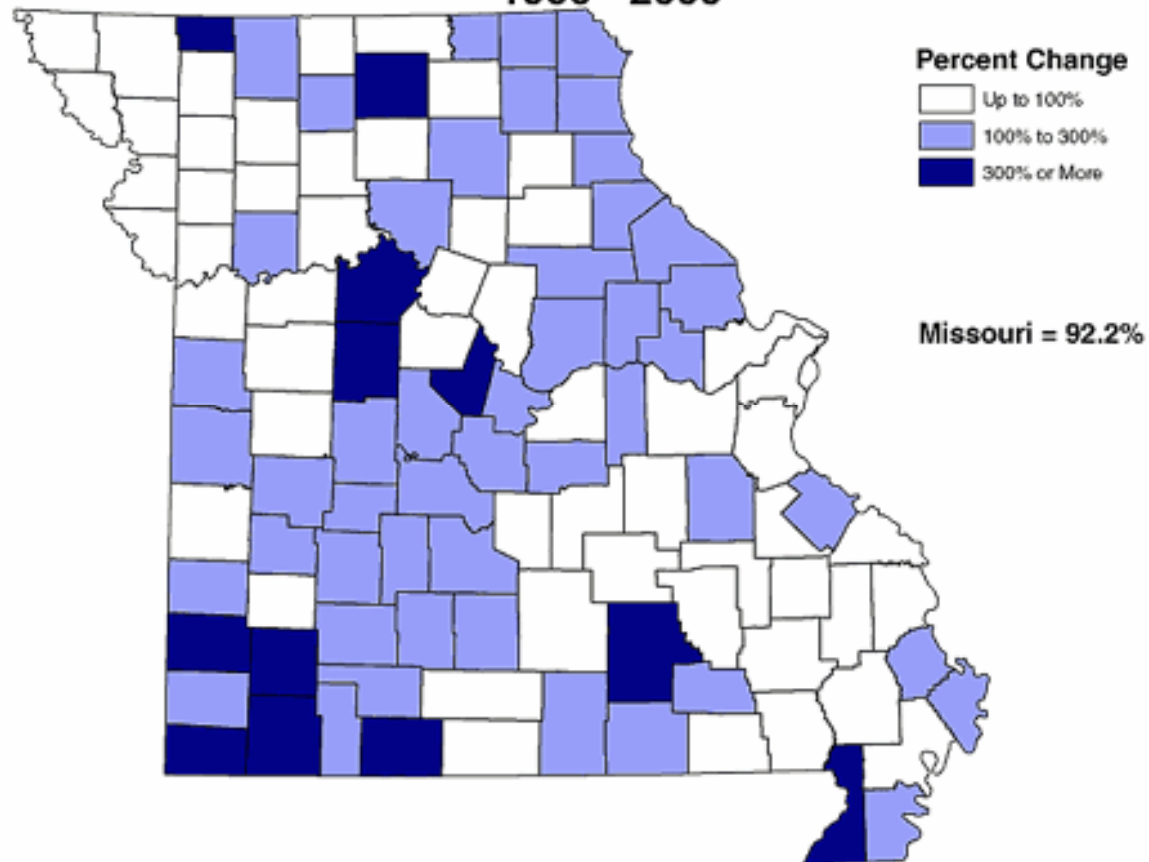


## Number Change in Missouri's Hispanic Population, by County 1990 - 2000



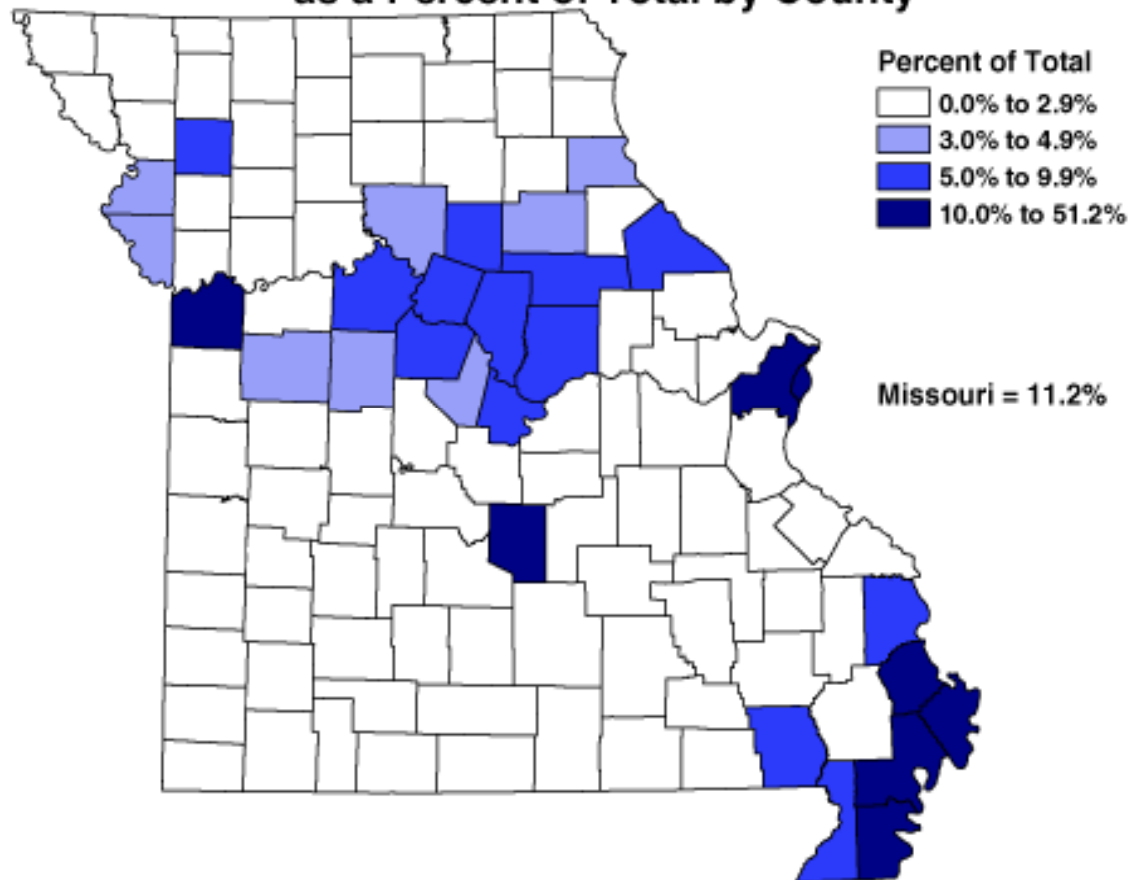

## Percent Change in Missouri's Hispanic Population, by County 1990 - 2000



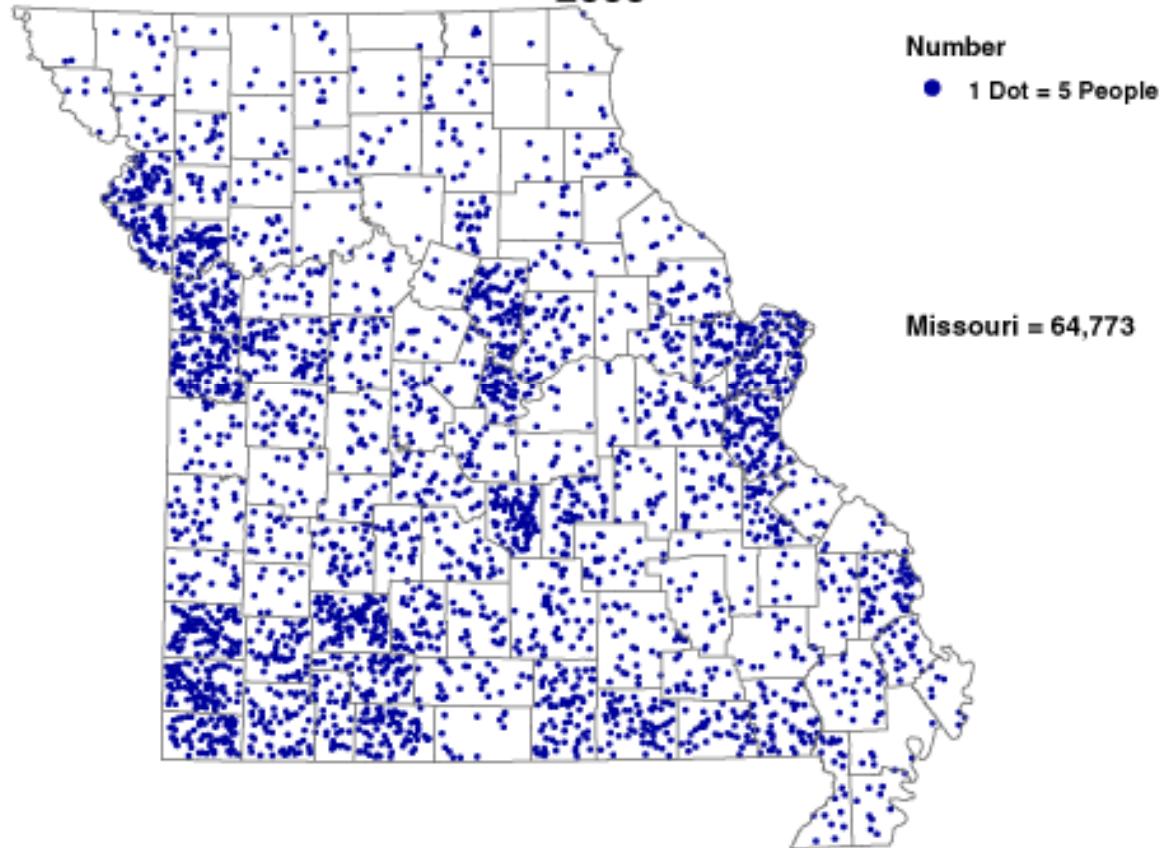

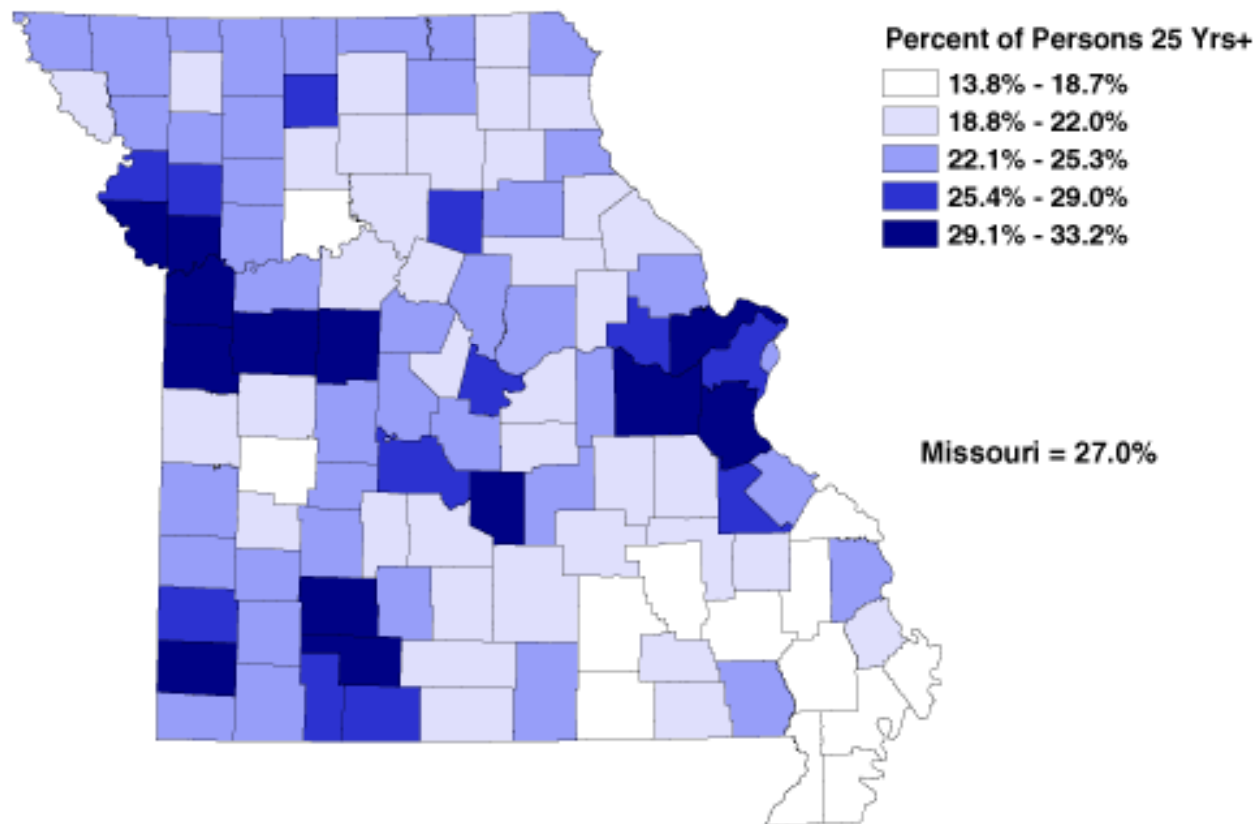

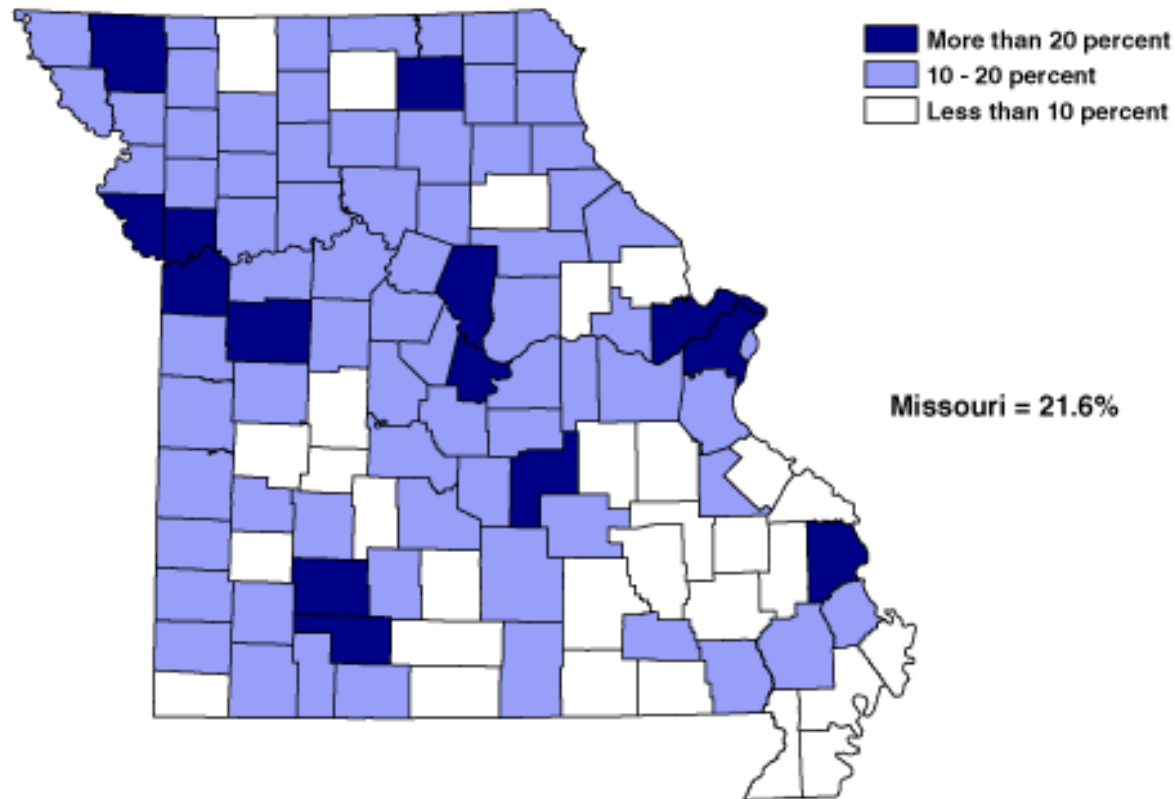


## Percent of Adult Population Having Some College or an Associate Degree 2000

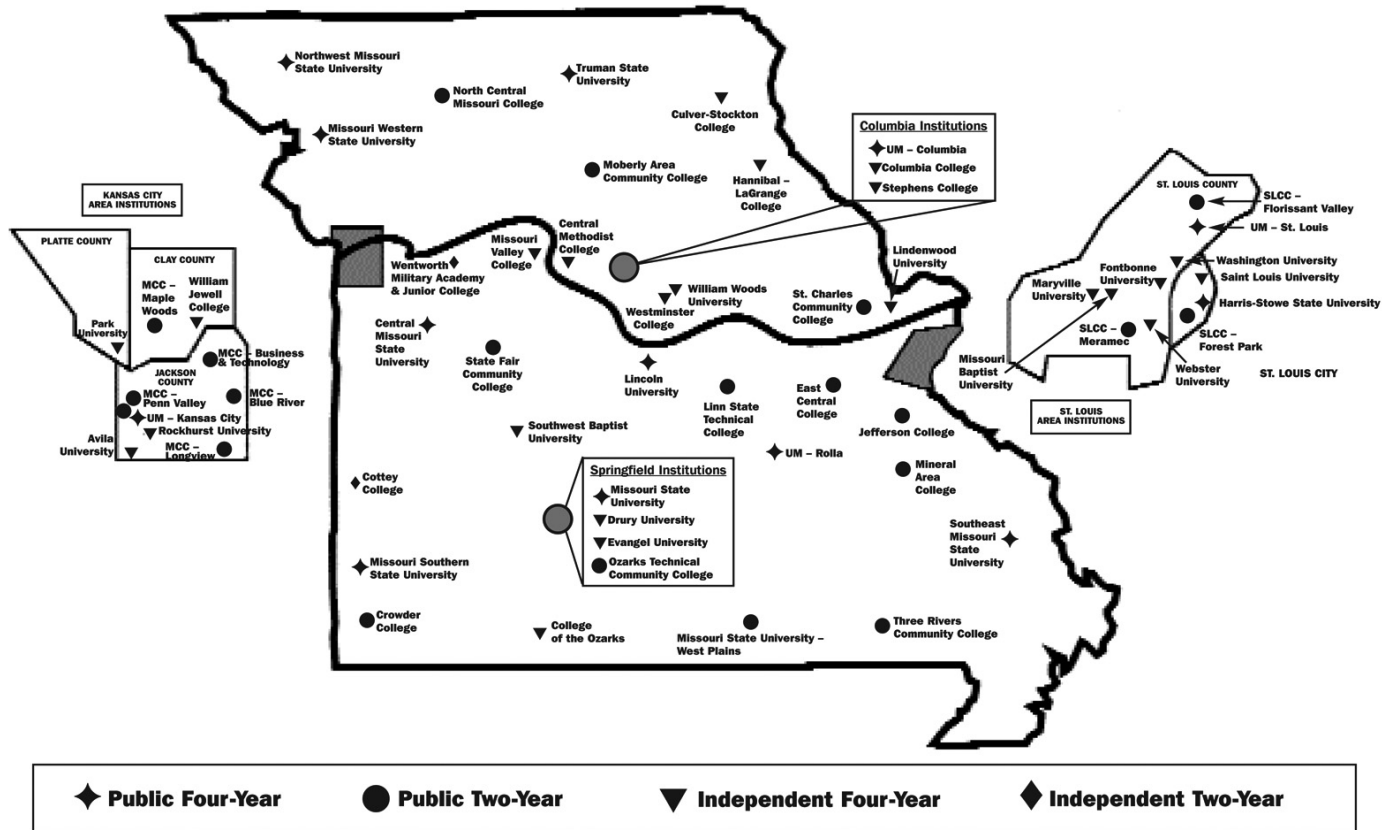
## Percent of Adult Population Having a College Degree and/or Beyond 2000

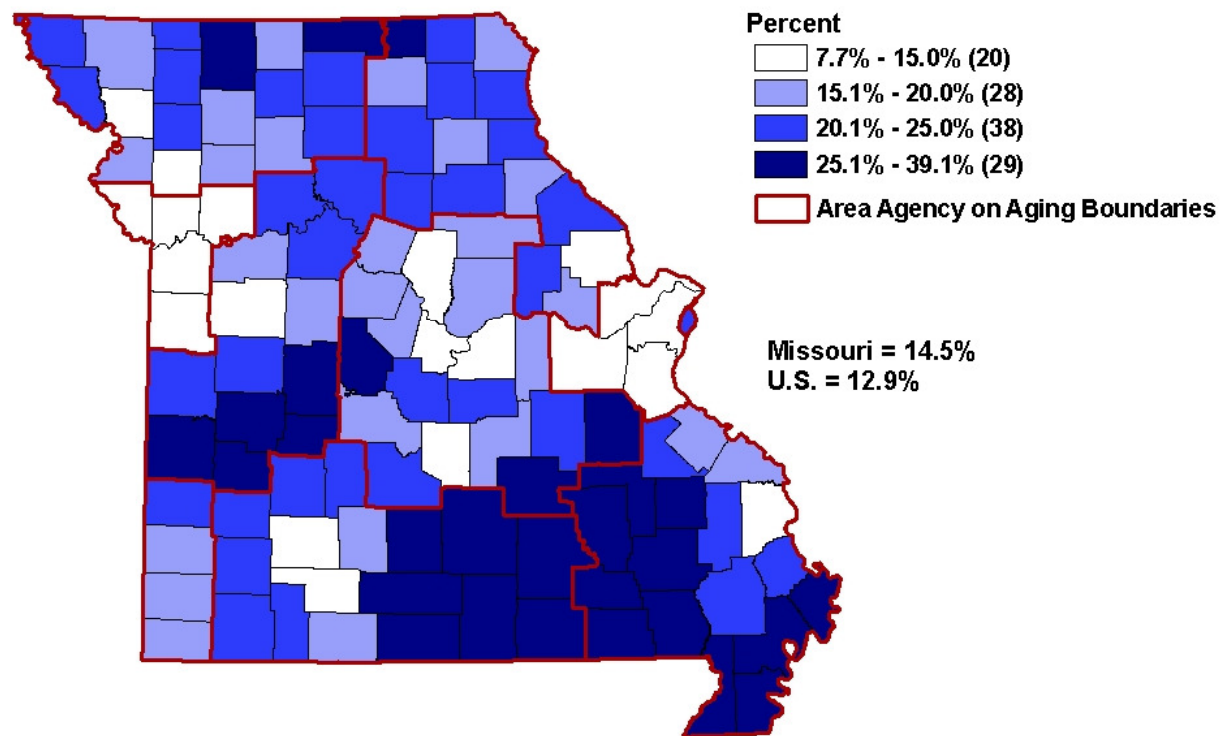

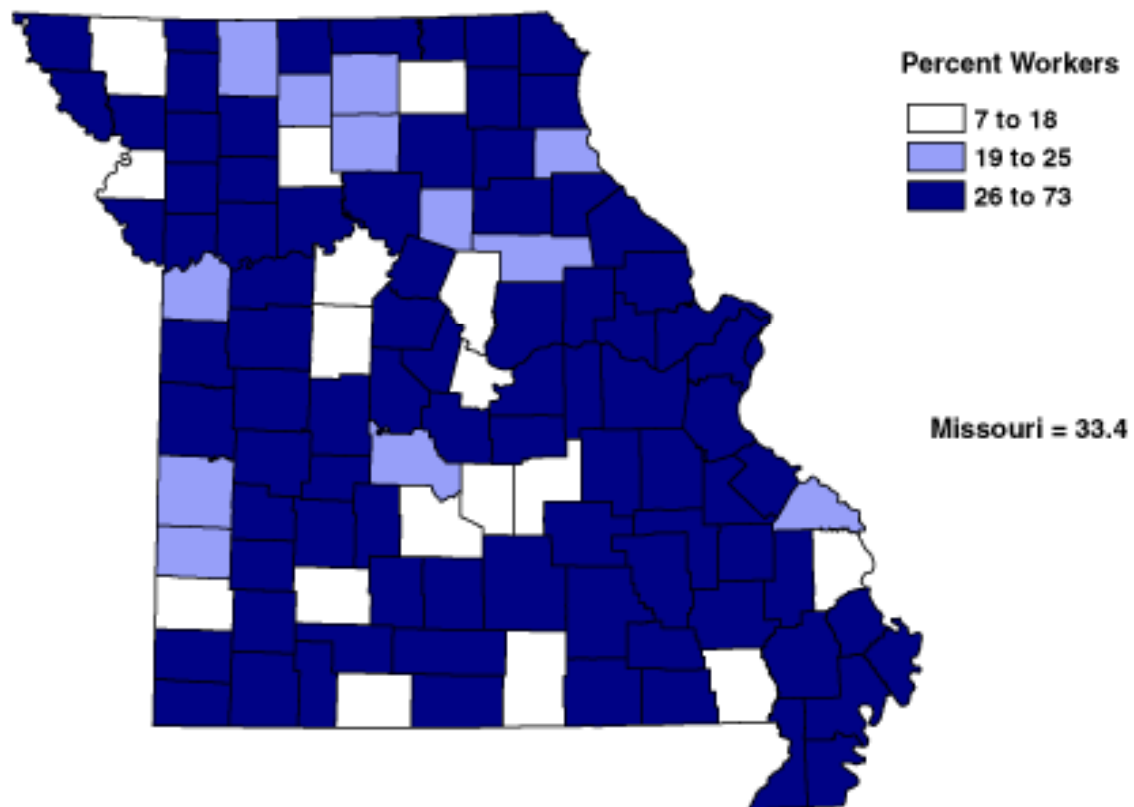


## Transfer Payments as a Percent of Personal Income, 2000

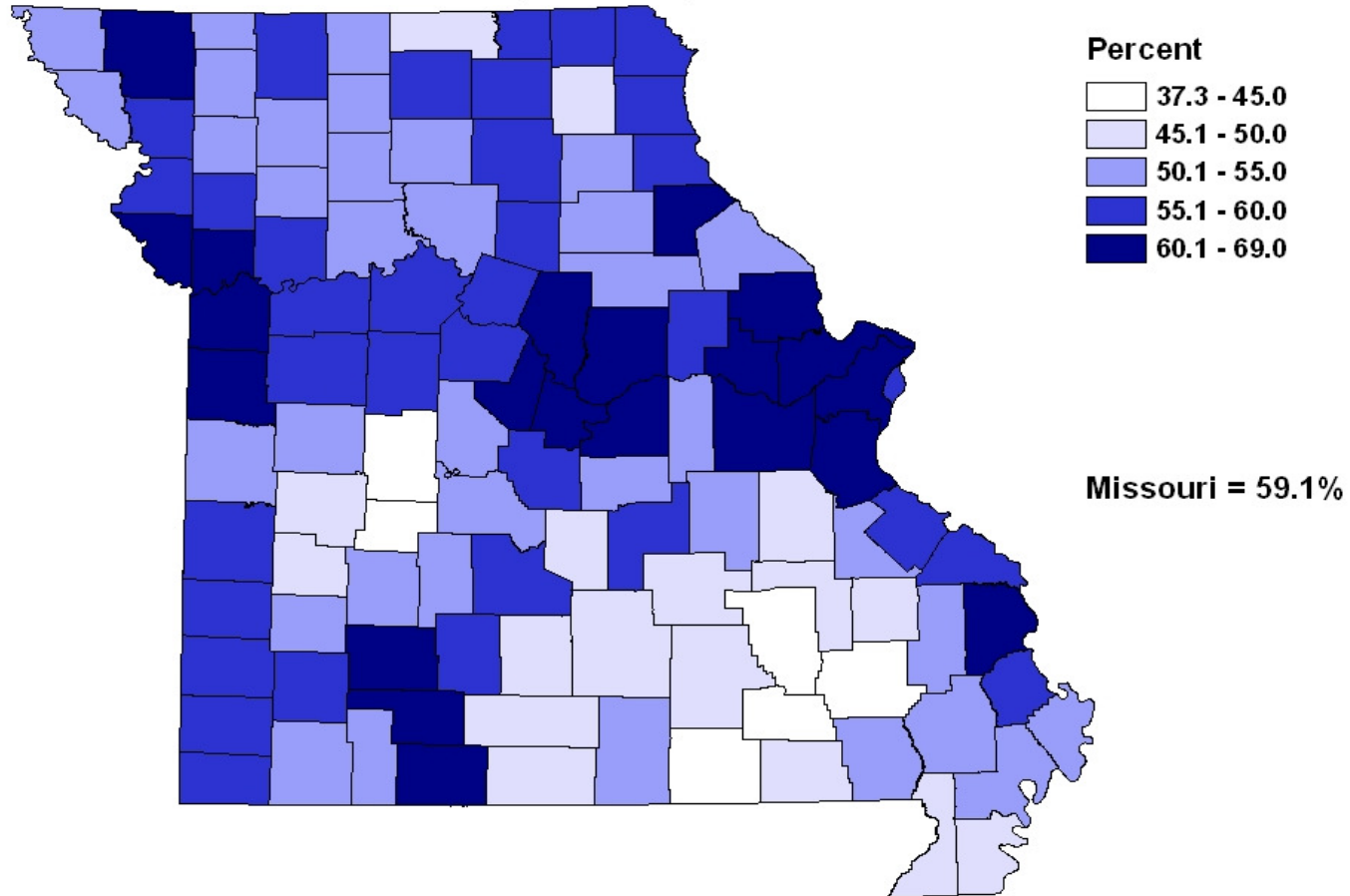
## Workers Commuting Outside County of Residence 2000

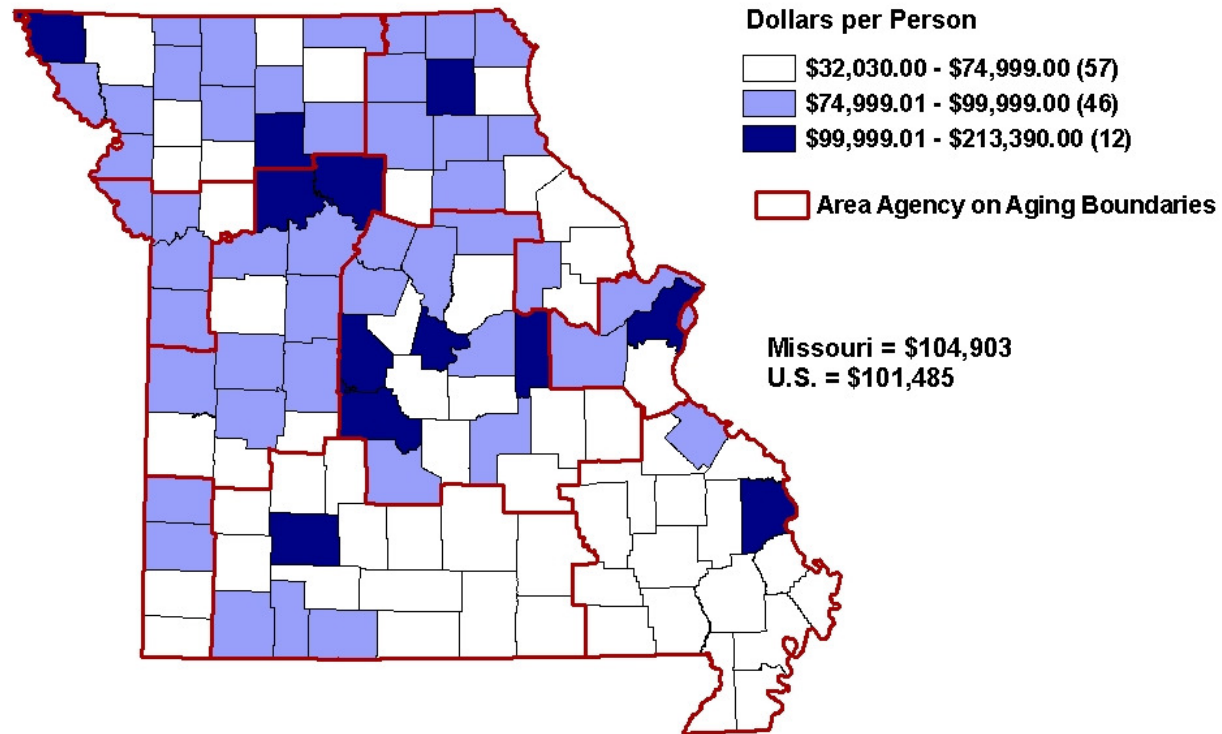
## Percent of Females 16 Years and Older in the Labor Force in Missouri, by County 2000

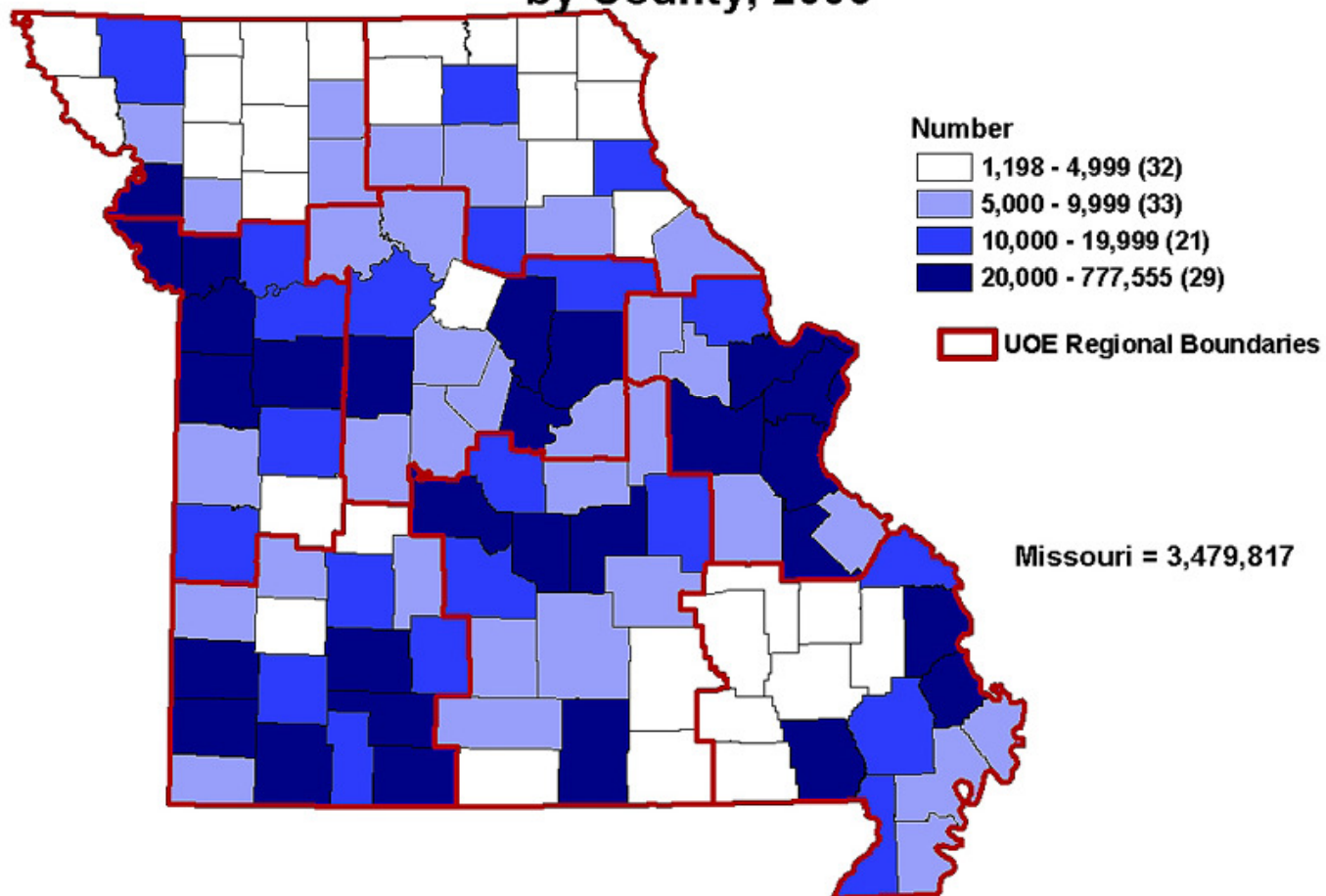
## Net Worth Per Capita, 2003

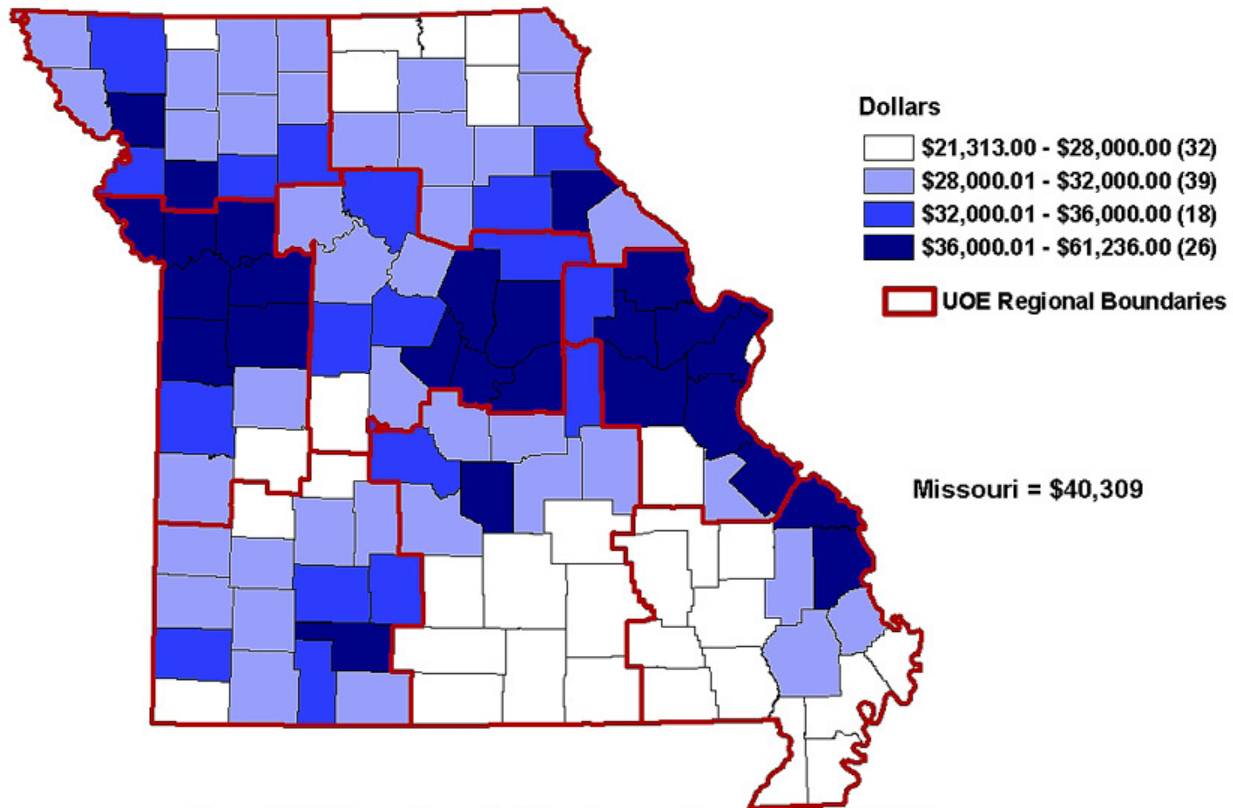
## Total Full-time and Part-time Employment by County, 2003

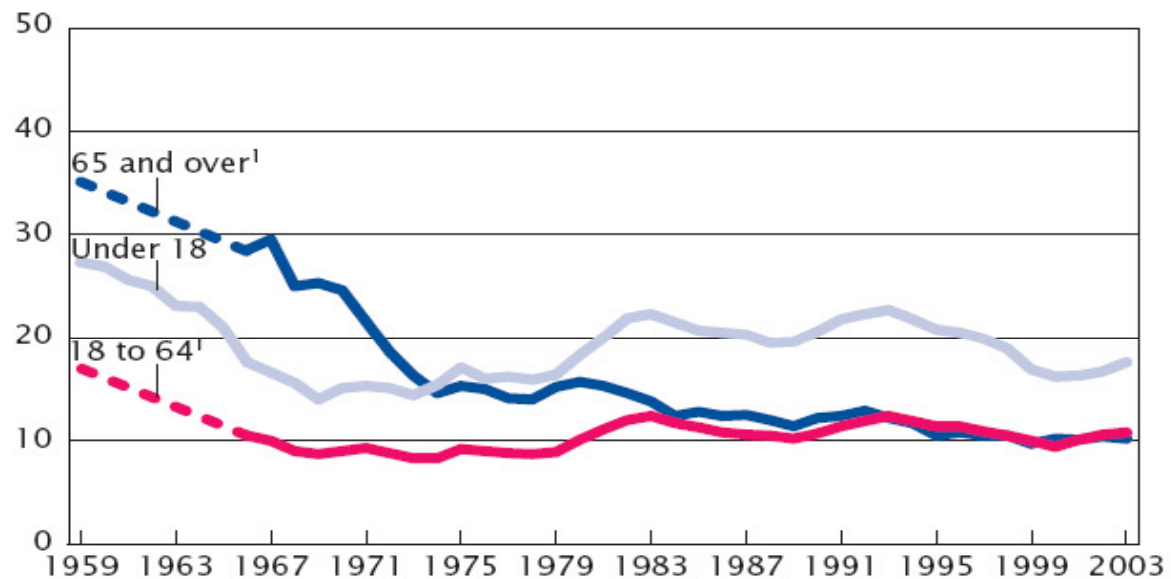
## Median Household Income, by County, 2002

**Percent of People in Poverty by Age: 1959 to 2003**

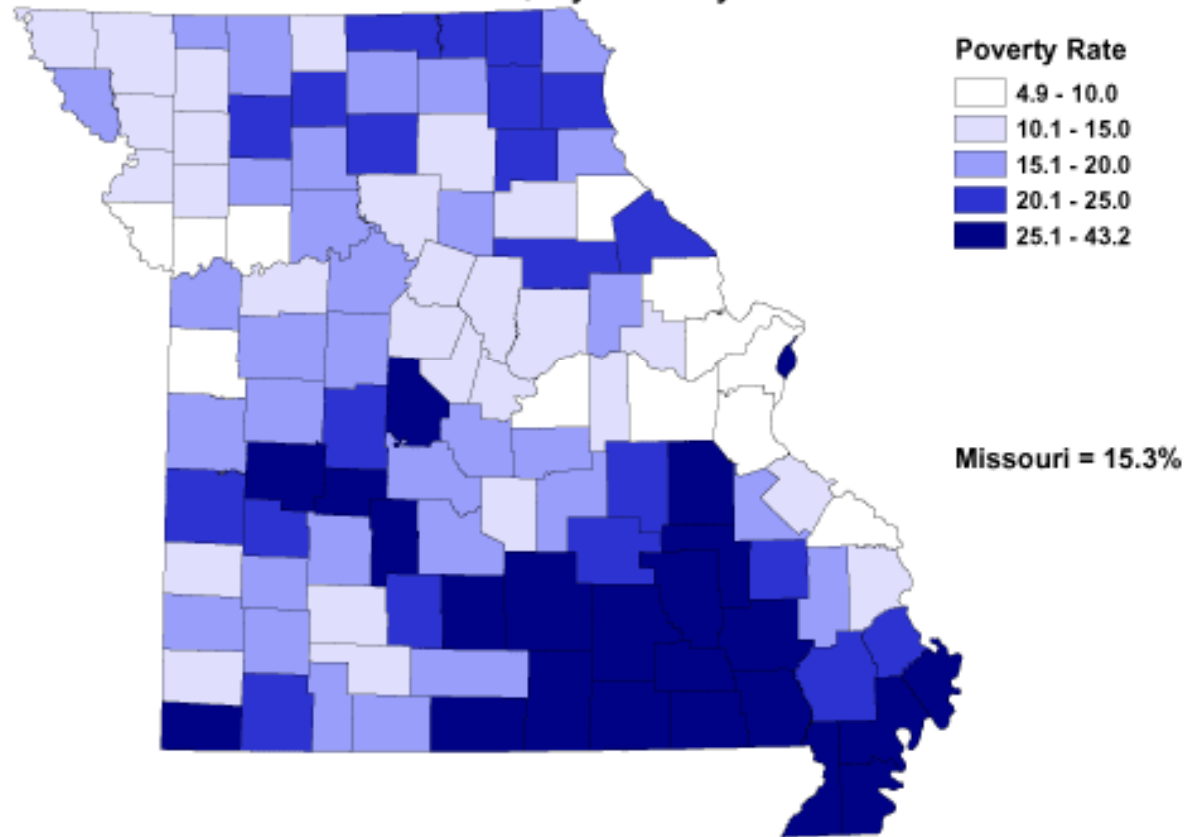

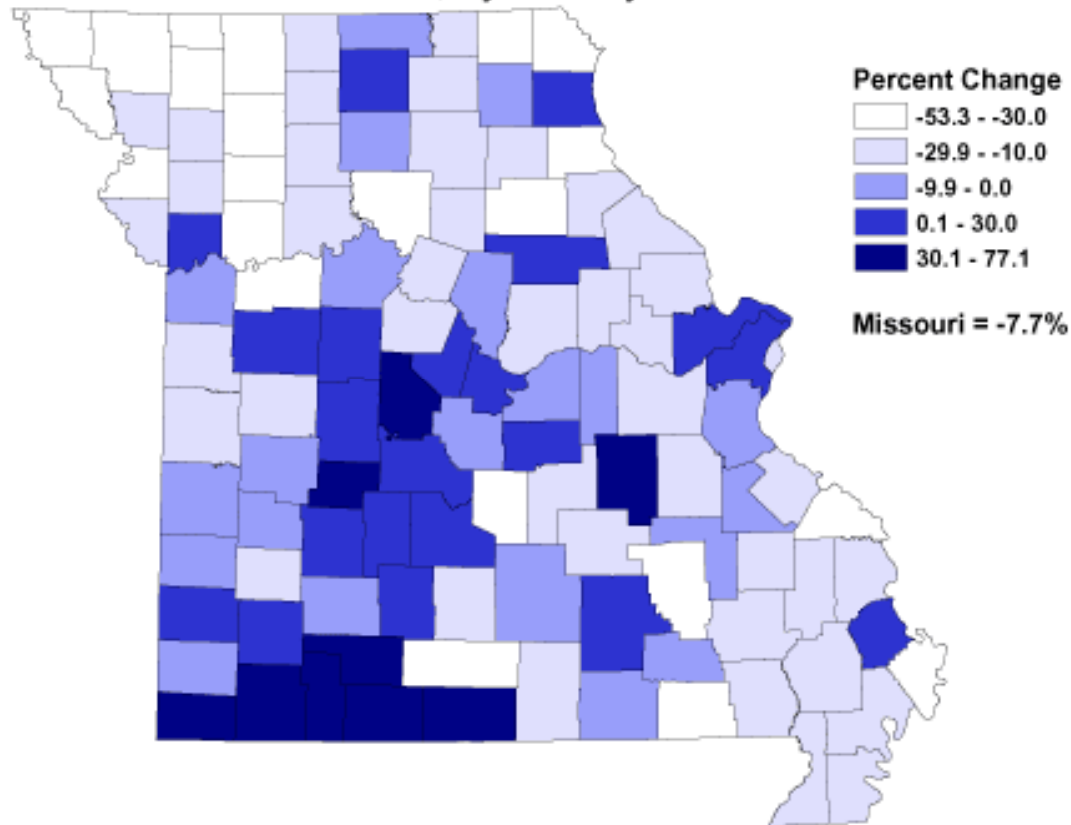

## Percent Change of Related Children Under 18 Below Poverty in Missouri, by County 1990 - 2000

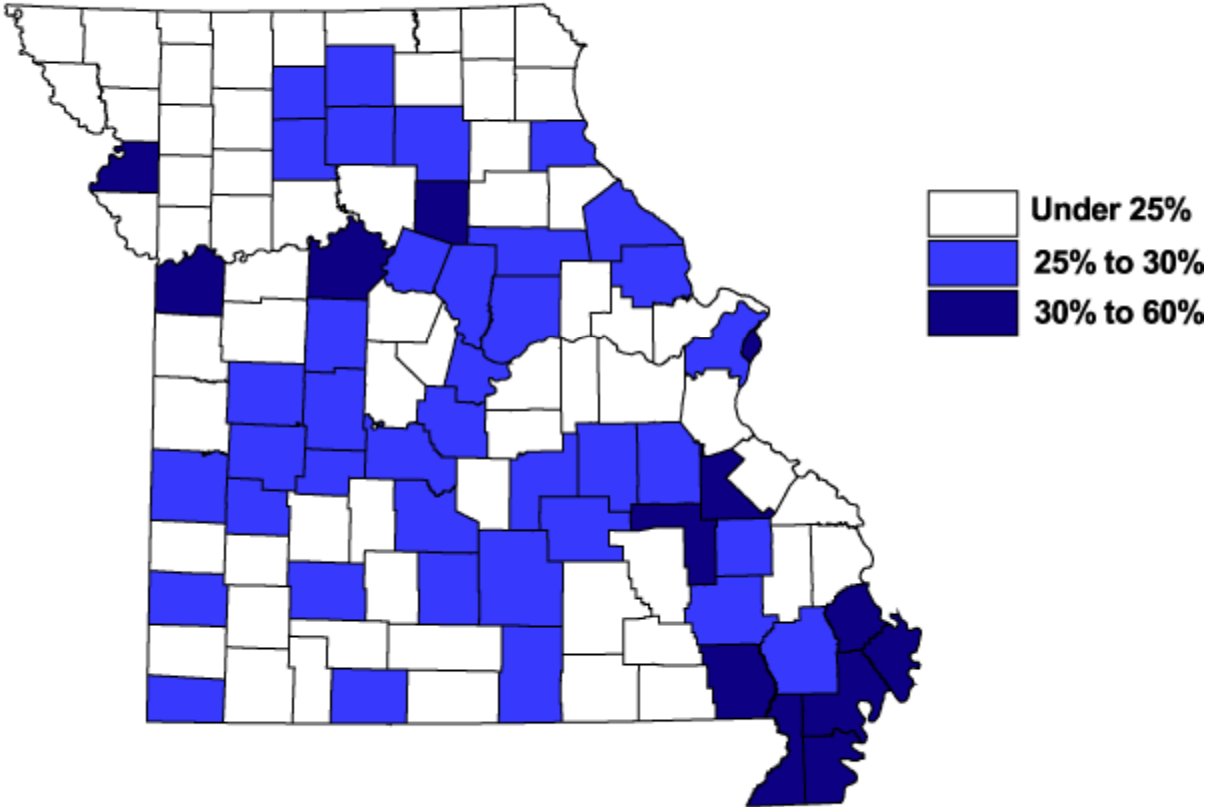

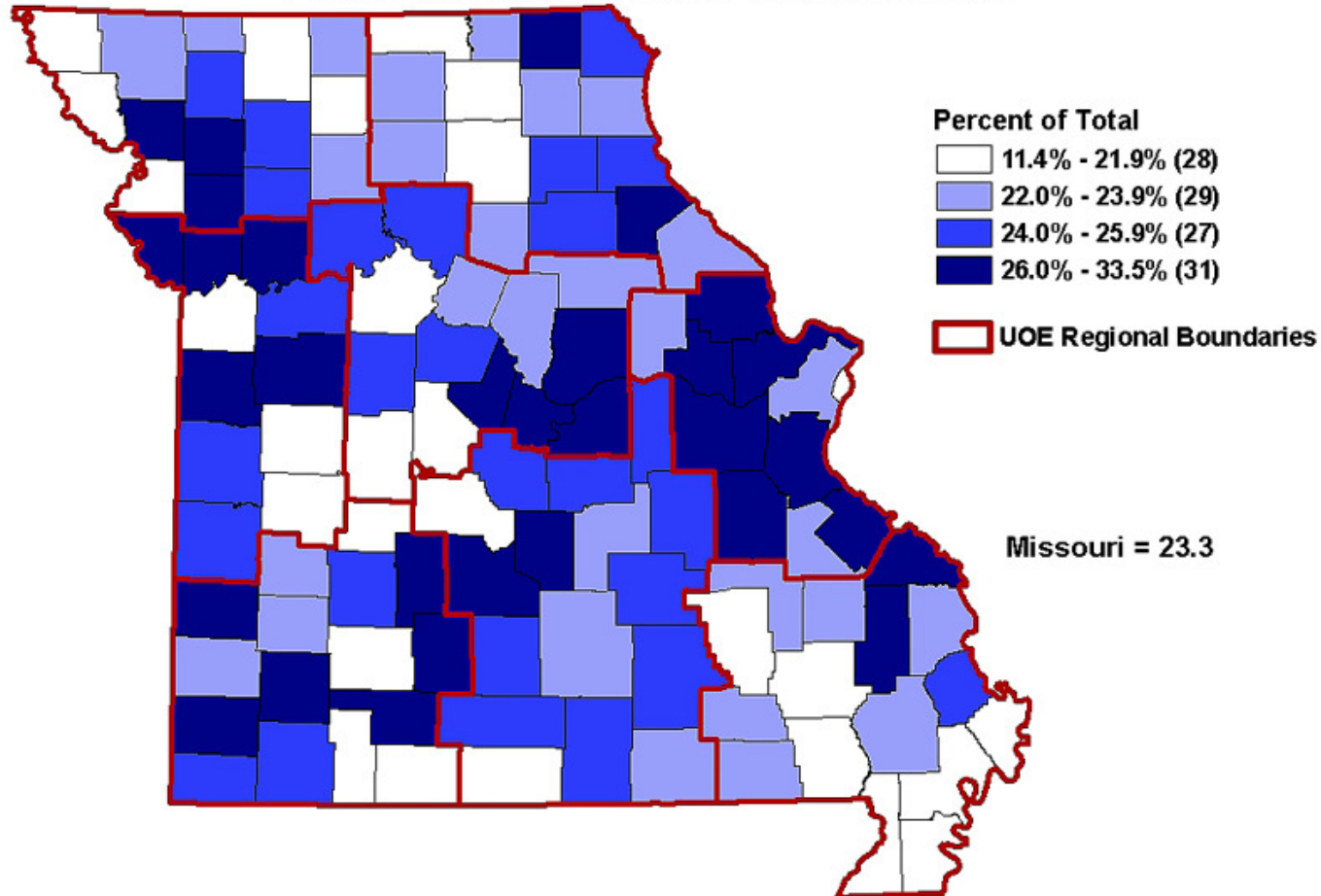
# Single Parent Families as a Percent of all Families with Children, 2000

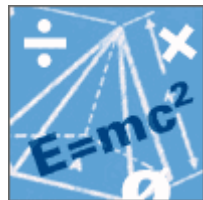
## Married Couples With Kids Under 18, by County, 2000 As a Percent of Total Households

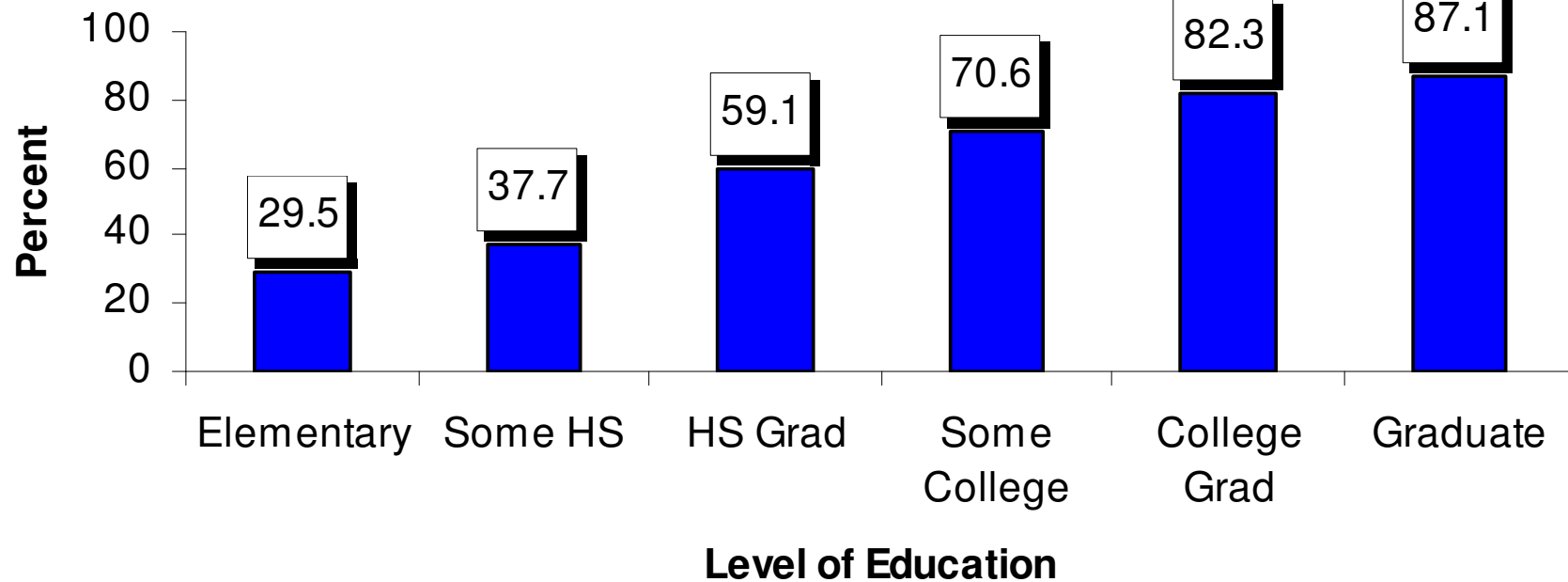

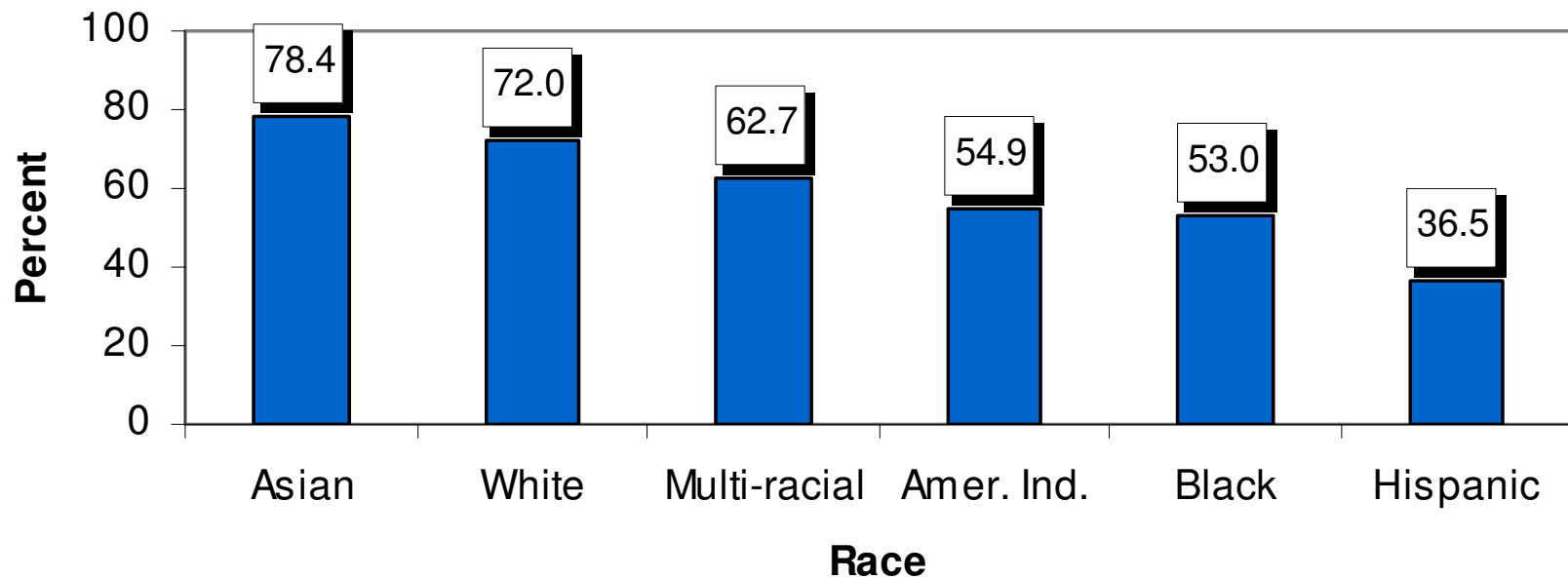
What one thing is likely to take the largest share of your child's time in the year after high school?

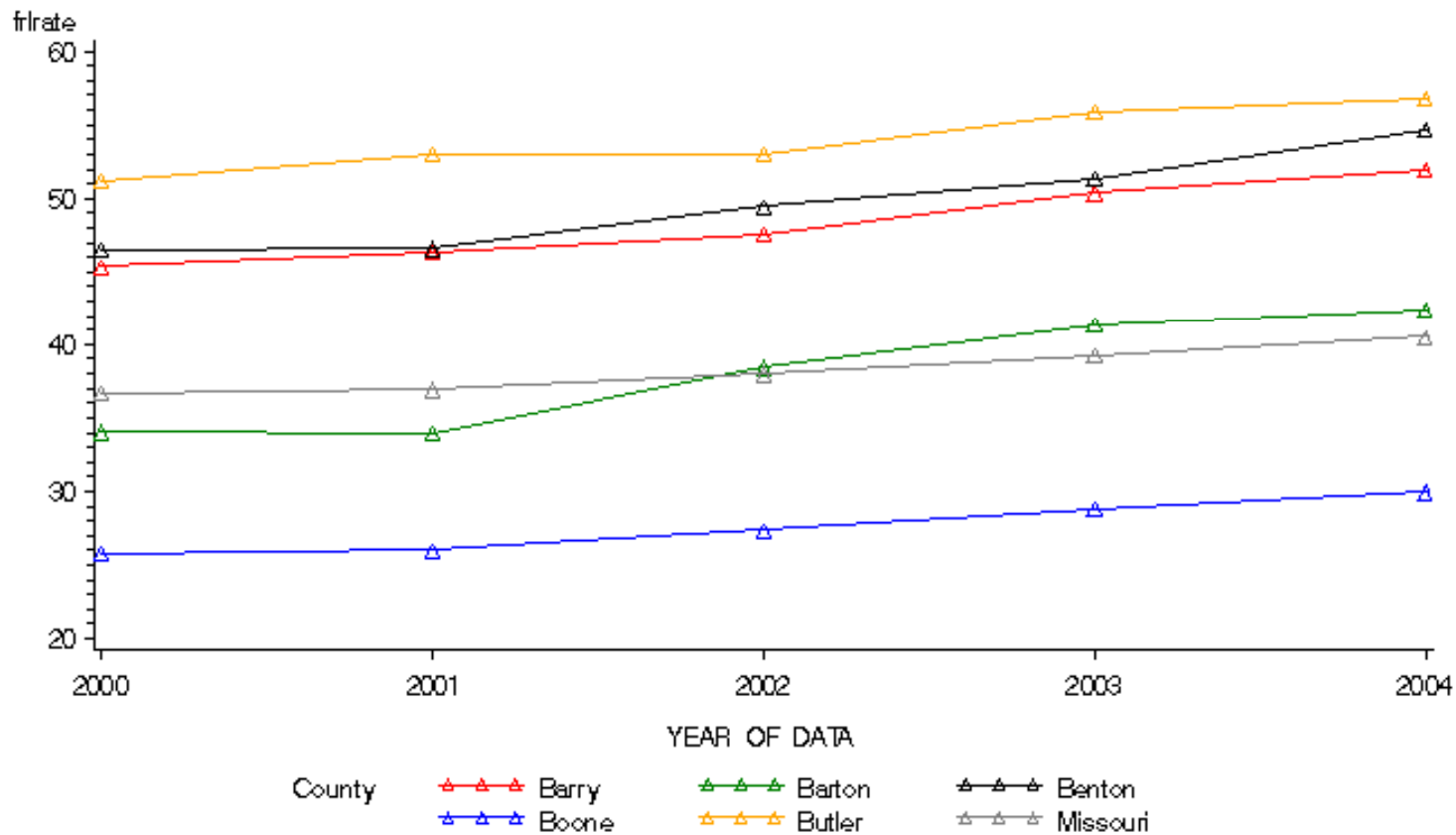




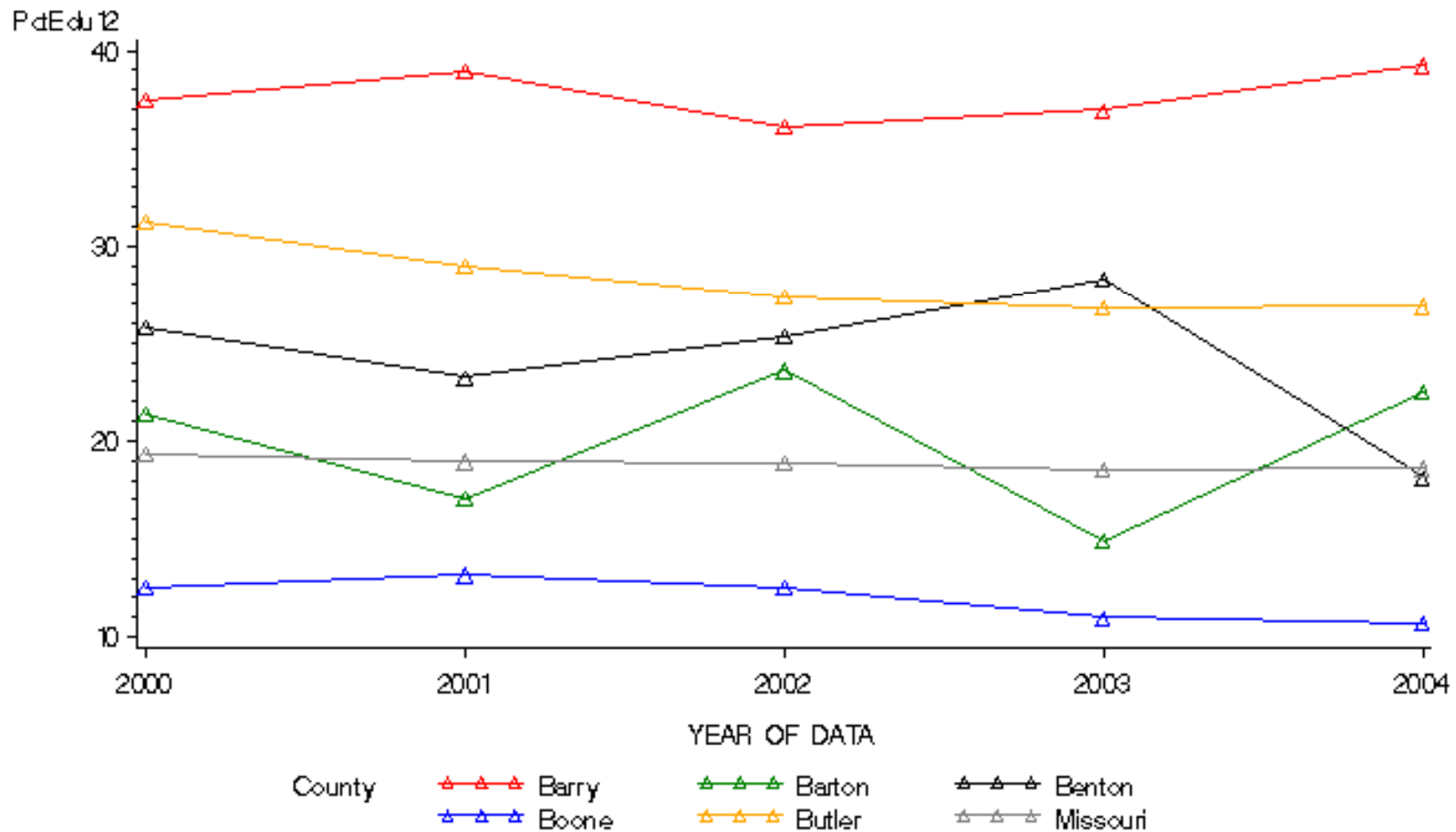

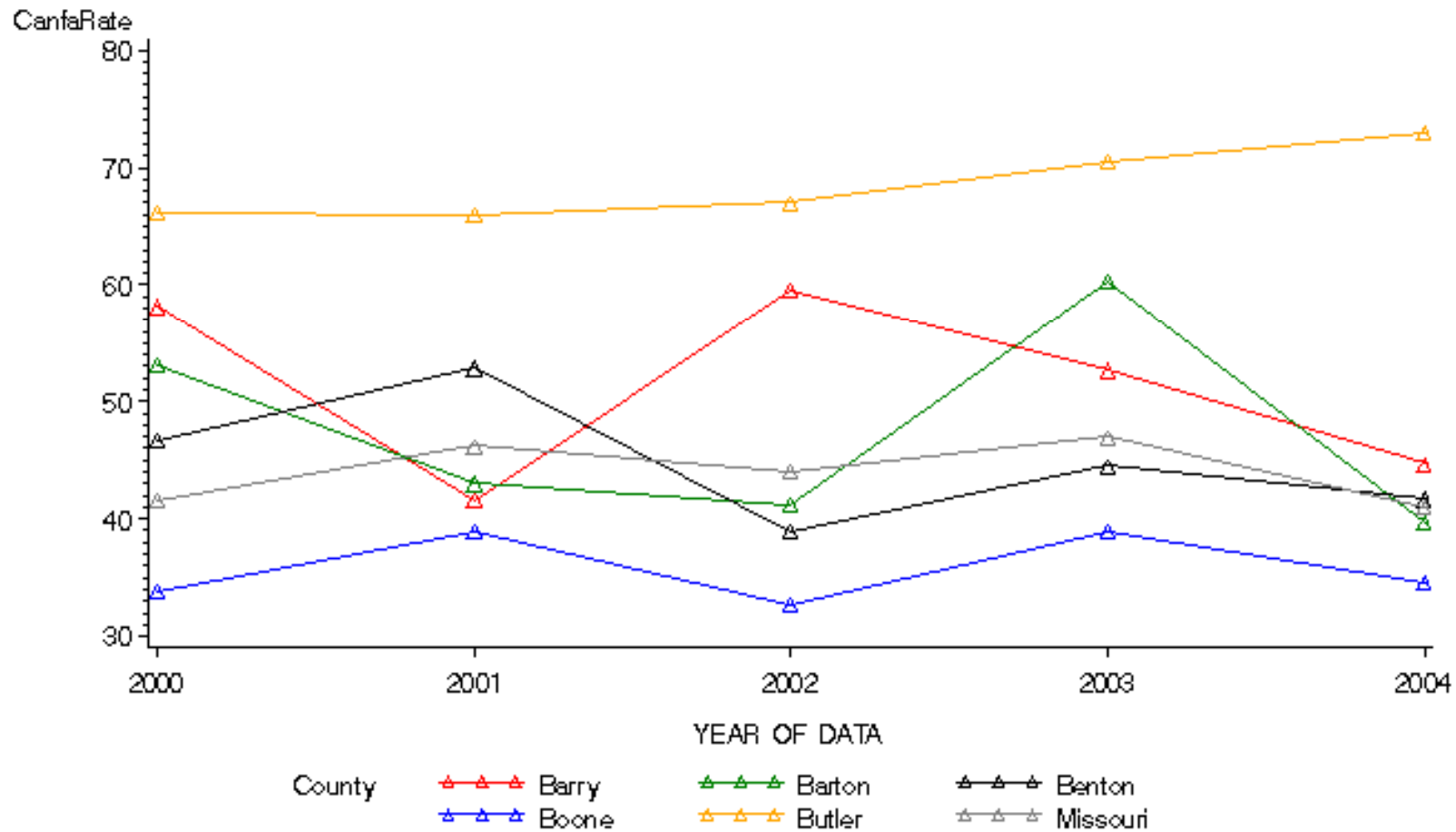
## Percent of Children Enrolled for Free/Reduced Lunches



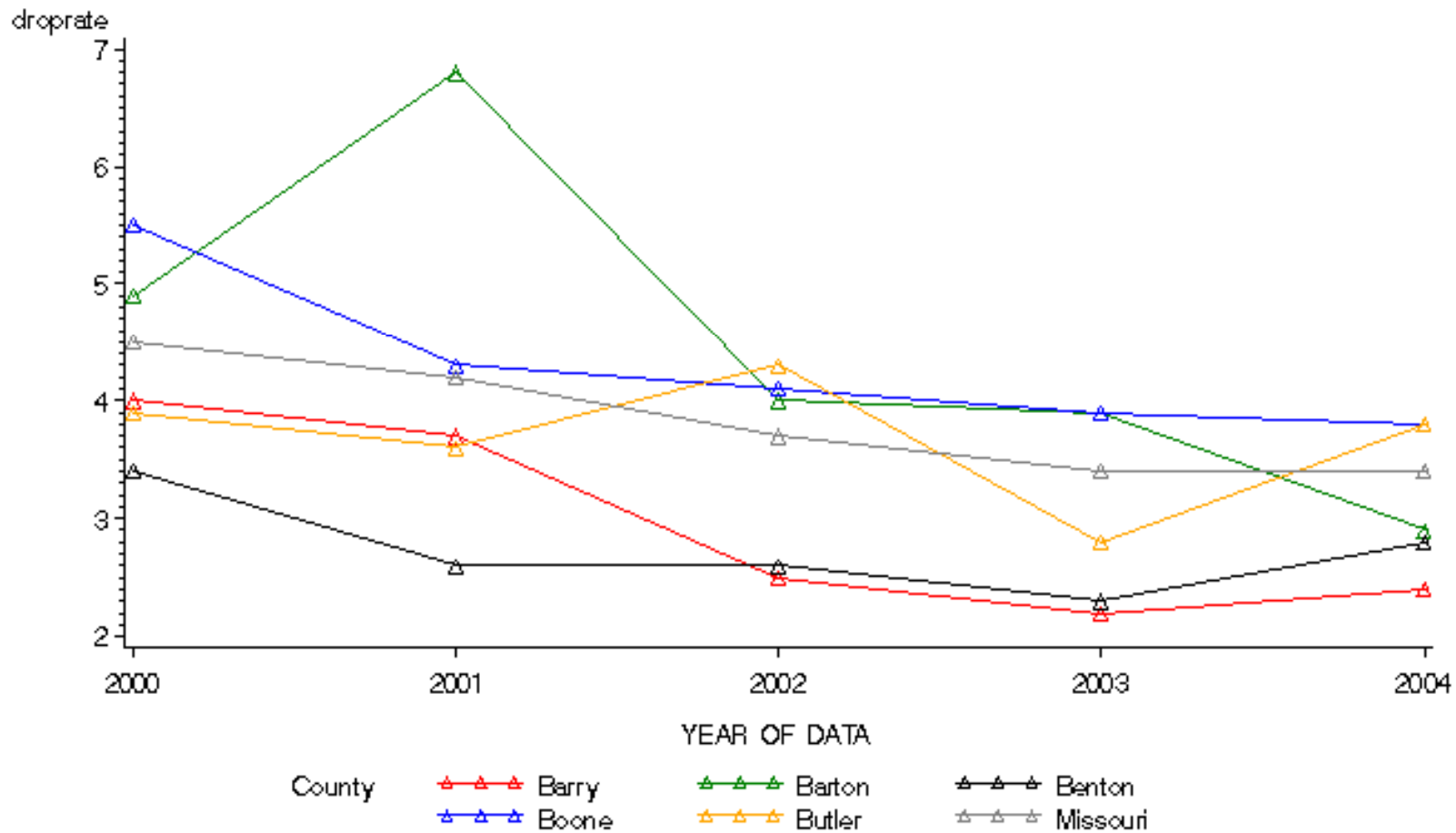
## Percent of Births to Moms with Under 12 Years Education



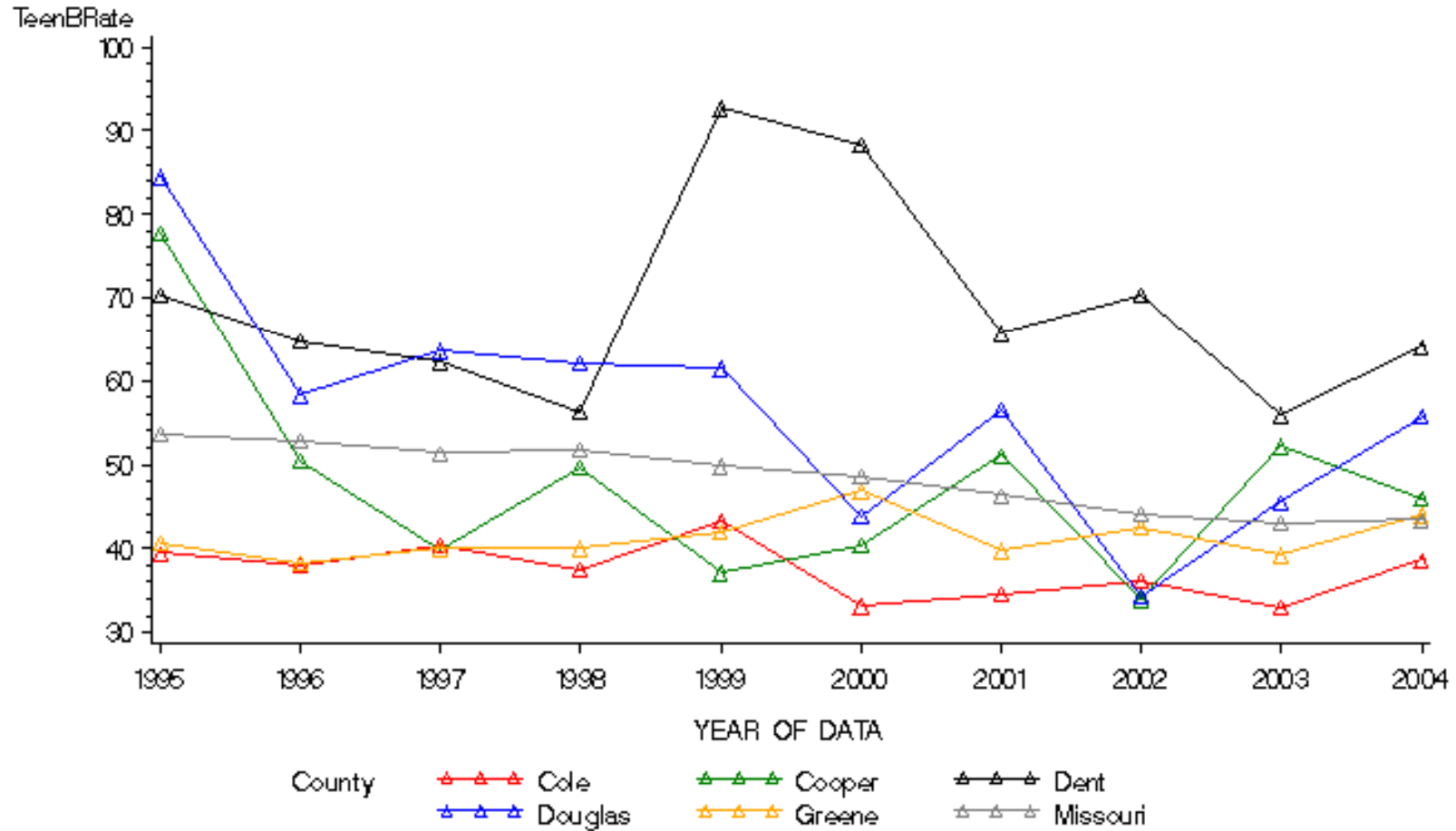
## Child Abuse/Neglect per 1,000 Children

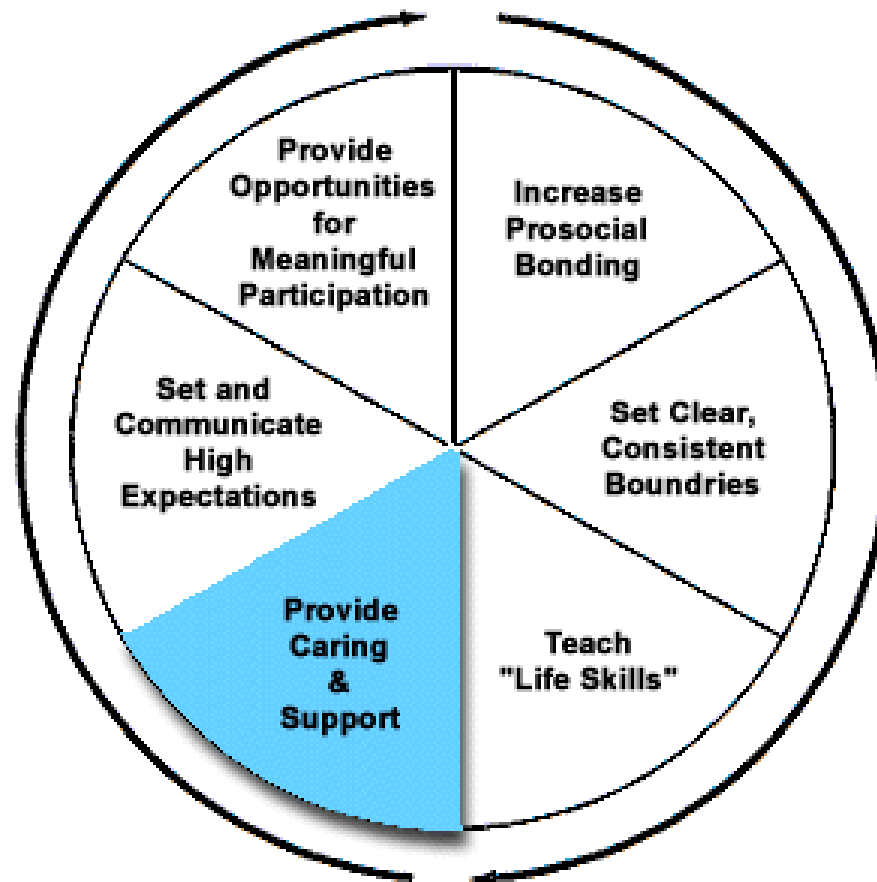
