









Total Population by Block Group, 2000



Population by Age & Sex: 2004 United States




Percent Change in Missouri Population by Selected Age Cohorts, 2000-2004





Percent Change in Missouri Population by County 2000-2004





Percent Change in Missouri Population by County 2000-2004





Percent Natural Increase* in Missouri, by County 2000-2004





Percent Net Migration* in Missouri, by County 2000-2004





Dead Reckoning Plot ... where we think we ought to be each hour (our plan)


Fix ... where we really are (our data)


New Course...Taking into account set and drift the new course we need to sail to reach port


Statistical indicators are like navigational aids – they help us know where we are and what course we need to sail to reach port.

But for data to be useful we have to decide upon a destination – a goal. Then data can be used to help us make decisions—"steer more northerly."


Without a goal—any course will do and data are not very useful.













Ombudsman by Service Area, 2004




Care Connection Information and Assistance Services by Service Area, 2004




Community Cash Match Summary by Service Area, 2004 Total Community Match




Community Cash Match Summary by Service Area, 2004 Net Community Match




Community Cash Match Summary by Service Area, 2004 Community Match by Average Daily Unduplicated Individuals




Care Connection Medicaid Dollars by Service Area, 2004





Care Connection Grant Dollars by Service Area, 2004










Total Population by Block Group Within the 13-County Region 2000




Percent Population 65 & Older Living Alone by Service Area Within the 13-County Region 2000








Percent Population 65 & Older Below Poverty by Service Area Within the 13-County Region, 2000



Percent of the Population Age 65 and Older Below Poverty Care Connection Senior Center Service Areas






Percent of Householders Age 65 to 74 that Own their Home Care Connection Senior Center Service Areas






Percent of Householders Age 75 and Older that Own their Home Care Connection Senior Center Service Areas









Ratio of Disabilities Tallied to Population 65 & Older by Service Area Within the 13-County Region 2000




Percent Population 65 & Older With a Physical Disability by Service Area Within the 13-County Region 2000




Percent Population 65 & Older With a Go-out-of-home Disability by Service Area Within the 13-County Region 2000




Percent Population 65 & Older With a Sensory Disability by Service Area Within the 13-County Region 2000
