

I. PRISON GROWTH

1980: 5,726 INMATES

1990: 14,943 INMATES

2001: 28,735 INMATES

II. COSTS OF IMPRISONMENT

\$500 MILLION (EXCLUDING CAPITAL COSTS)

ABOUT \$40 PER DAY PER INMATE

> \$50 MILLION IN MEDICAL SERVICES

III. COMMUNITY SUPERVISION

ABOUT 64,000 (TWICE THE PRISON POPULATION)

53,000 ON PROBATION 11,000 ON PAROLE

54,000 UNDER "REGULAR" SUPERVISION 10,000 UNDER "INTENSIVE" SUPERVISION

COSTS: \$86 MILLION (17% OF PRISON BUDGET)

\$3.50 PER PERSON PER DAY \$2.00 REGULAR \$12.00 INTENSIVE
