

UM United Way Campaign


UM System and MU United Way Campaign officially began at an 8 a.m. rally Tuesday, Sept. 17, at the Reynolds Alumni Center. The Columbia Area United Way kickoff occured Friday, Sept. 27, with a breakfast, following which "Day of Caring" volunteers worked on projects for United Way agencies.

Dave Lendt, who coordinates the UM System campaign, says "Last year UM became a contender by exceeding its United Way goal by 13 percent." He credits improved communication, expanded involvement of Staff Advisory Council, the commitment of the administration and "the can-do attitude of UM System people."



Lendt says the 1996 campaign will "raise the bar" to a goal of \$29,500 compared with last year's \$25,500. "The more people become acquainted with United Way " through volunteering for Day of Caring, through visiting United Way agencies and learning what they do, through attending information sessions about the United Way concept of putting local dollars to work locally "the more supportive they become."

Several reminders: (1) United Way puts local dollars to work locally; (2) United Way's 30 agencies help more than 70,000 persons in Central Missouri each year; (3) Donors may select agencies they want to support with their gifts or pledges.



Employees Tour United Way Agencies

Seventeen UM System Administration employees, joined by two administrators from MU, toured four United Way-supported agencies Friday morning, Sept. 20, to become better acquainted with the services provided and United Way's role in making the services available. The group of 19 visited Advent Enterprises, Meals on Wheels, Central Missouri Food Bank and Rainbow House.

Dave Lendt said the tour "again underscored the fact that giving to these agencies through United Way is the easy part. The people running the agencies and providing human services, in often desperate circumstances, are mid-Missouri's answers to Mother Teresa."

Nearly 40 volunteer for "Day of Caring"

Nearly 40 employees of the UM System signed up to participate in the 1996 "Day of Caring" Friday, Sept. 27. President Mel George joined the volunteers at the Columbia Area United Way Campaign Kickoff at Columbia Mall. Volunteers were assigned to Bethlehem Home to perform a variety of chores.





"Last year, 18 UM System employees volunteered for a work project for 'Day of Caring'," said Dave Lendt. "I think it says a lot about the kind of people we work with when that number doubles in one year." Lendt notes that, although UM is very supportive of Day of Caring, it cannot give public employees time off for that purpose. "So, these volunteers give not only their time and effort, but they give their own vacation time to participate."
