1995 UM System United Way Campaign

UNITED WAY AGENCY TOUR

Nearly two dozen UM System United Way volunteers took a bus tour of six agencies supported by Columbia Area United Way Tuesday morning, May 16.

They visited The Shelter, Family Counseling Center, two Community Nursery Schools, the Salvation Army Harbor House, and Meals on Wheels. The tour was organized and led by Kathi Posch, Marketing Director for Columbia Area United Way, and Dave Lendt, Director of University Relations and UMSystem Campaign Leader.

"Several participants told me it was an eye-opening experience," Lendt said. "I can understand that, because when I took a similar tour it made me a zealot for United Way. I came away from that tour — and this one — convinced that many of the real heroes in our society are the people who run the human service agencies supported by United Way."

In a recent letter to UM System staff members, President George Russell noted that UM System last year achieved just 79% of its fairly modest goal. "Because I have seen the enthusiasm and goodwill of our people expressed in so many other ways, I can only conclude that any lack of support results from a lack of information," he said.

The tour, which was designed to help inform staff members of United Way activities, included Cuba Plain, chair of Staff Advisory Council, and Vivian Mason, UM Staff Advisory Council member, who represent SAC on the UM System Campaign Steering Committee.

Keypersons from various units within UM System Administration have also been appointed. Those who participated in the tour were: Jan Thornton, Academic Affairs; Sherri Helm, Administrative Affairs; MaryAnn Williamson, Business Services; Cindy Cover, Human Resource Services; Sherry Kilgore, Investment and Banking; Ellen Palmer, Outreach and Extension; Donna Johanning, Accounting Services; Marilyn Selovich, Governmental Relations; Mary Smith, Outreach and Extension; Jean Sundet, Outreach and Extension; Marilynn Keil, University Press; Janet Waibel, University Relations; Sandi Wells, State Historical Society, and Norma Rhodes, Chief Information Office. Keypersons unable to attend included: Jean Hough, Records Management; Debbie Ricker, Outreach and Extension; Memoree DeSpain, Facilities Planning and Development, and Laurie Wilson, Outreach and Extension.

Other Steering Committee members on the tour included: Ralph Caruso, Chief Information Officer; Phil Harrison, President's Office; David Russell, University Relations, and Sandy Stegall, Outreach and Extension. Blake Danuser, Human Resource Services, also serves on the Steering Committee.

Although the campaign will not take place until next fall, Lendt said, staff members and volunteers representing United Way would be happy to join staff meetings to talk about the organization and to answer questions about its operations.

"I appreciate the support of the President and the General Officers and, of course, the willingness of the Steering Committee members and Keypersons to learn more about United Way," Lendt said. "I am persuaded that the better we understand this very efficient way of looking after the needs of those around us, the more likely we will be to support it."


