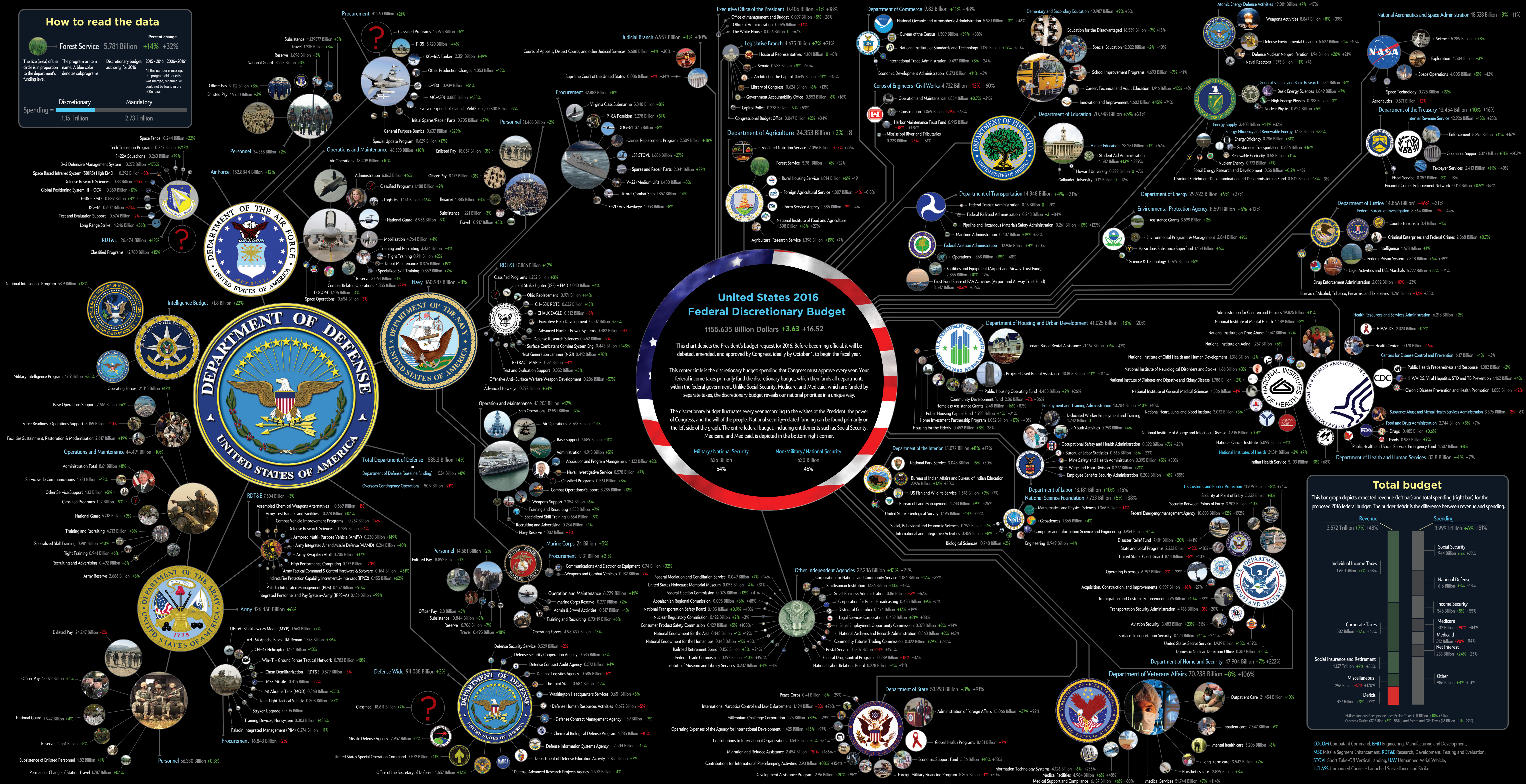

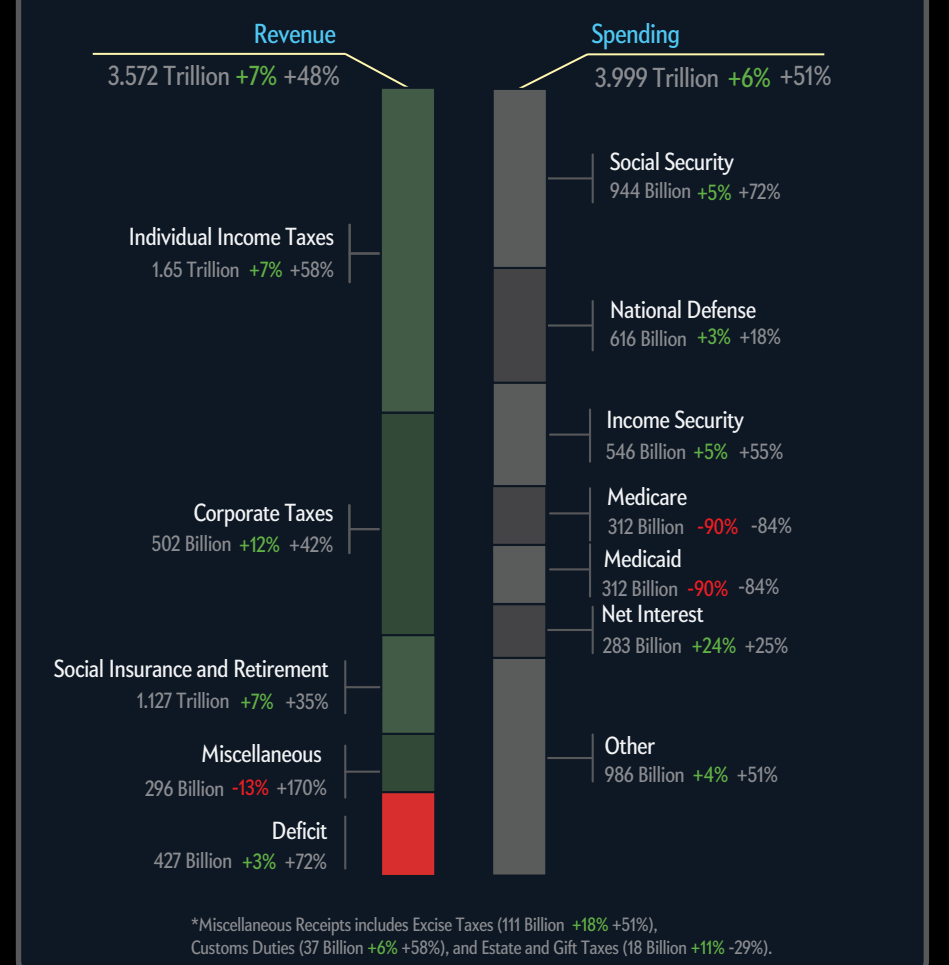
United States 2016 Federal Budget

How to read the data



Total budget

This bar graph depicts expected revenue (left bar) and total spending (right bar) for the proposed 2016 federal budget. The budget deficit is the difference between revenue and spending.

Footnotes: 1. The Debt Held by the Public is all federal debt held by individuals, corporations, state or local governments, Federal Reserve Banks, foreign governments, and other entities outside the United States Government less Federal Financing Bank securities. Types of securities held by the public include, but are not limited to, Treasury Bills, Notes, Bonds, TIPS, United States Savings Bonds, and State and Local Government Securities securities.

2. The US Intelligence budget comprises all the funding for the 16 agencies of the US Intelligence Community. Since 2012, the President's aggregate funding request for the intelligence programs has been disclosed, but the agency-level funding remains undisclosed. 3. The FY2016 request does not yet include a detailed budget for Overseas Contingency Operations (OCO) as of April 2015. A separate OCO budget will be released at a later date. The number used in this poster is an estimate from the Office of the Under Secretary of Defense. 4. Budget "screencaping" allow fund balances above a spending cap to be counted as "savings." Without offsets from the Crime Victims Fund and Asset Forfeiture Fund, DOJ's budget is \$28.7 Billion.

General Notes: All figures are in US dollars. These totals may not add up due to rounding, non-depicted programs with comparatively small budgets, or the presence of offsetting receipts or fees. In this chart, large blue text denotes a major category and smaller blue text denotes a subcategory. This data was obtained from the Office of Management and Budget, or the Office of the Under Secretary of Defense, unless otherwise noted. Data in this chart accurately depicts the April 2014 budget request by the President. Greys are sized in proportion to the total budget by area. The one-year and two-year budget differences have not been adjusted for inflation. The administration used 2.2% as its inflation assumption for FY2015, this year or department that grows less than 2.2% is subject to a loss of spending power.
