
MIs Welcomed to the Medical Profession with the Presentation of White Coats




Hunter Group Profits \$30 Million for Hospital in first Week
































Commencement

We are gathered here today to celebrate. We are here to celebrate four years of hard work, sacrifice and achievement. We are here to celebrate the consummation of a dream that has been decades in the making and to thank those whose support has made this possible. But I think that we are mostly here to celebrate a promise.

A little less than four years ago, we were given our white coats. Gleaming white coats. Like us, untarnished by sweat, unencumbered by instrument, and completely naïve to the world we were about to enter. We made a promise that day. By taking the Oath of Geneva we pledged to consecrate our lives to the service of humanity.

That oath was originally written in 1948. In the fifty-five years that have followed, medical sciences have made advances that have rivaled our cumulative progress from 1948 back to the age of Hippocrates. We are now able to obtain high resolution images of the brain, perform transplantation of most of the body's organs, and even clear blockages in the arteries of the heart. Our progress into the understanding of our own genetics has opened up new doors of diagnostics and therapy. With the completion of the Human Genome Project, we now have the blue prints of our own function and we have begun to decipher it. Now more than ever, we have the knowledge and tools to live up to the promise we made four years ago and will make again today. The world into which we are about to embark is filled with possibility.

This is a world that may see an end to diseases that have plagued mankind throughout the history of humanity. This is a world that has an unparalleled capacity to fend off new threats to our wellbeing. However, this is also a world where the majority of children do not have access to adequate health care. Where sanitation, vaccination, and education are available only to those born into privilege. Even in this country, where many of these technical advances were made, differences in socioeconomic status underlie most key determinants of health including infant mortality and overall life expectancy. So, as we enter this world, is it our duty, in our service of humanity, to try to do something about this? Absolutely.

As we embark on our journey in the service of humanity, it gives me great pride to be part of MU's graduating class of physicians. We are privileged to have gone to school here. Those of you familiar with the problem based learning curriculum here at Mizzou, know that its adaptive nature is what brings strength to the University of Missouri School of Medicine. Beyond the science of medicine, the progressive nature of our school has instilled in us several values. As medical fields become more and more specialized, the need for teamwork and communication become absolutely essential in order to coordinate the care of our patients. Also the expansive nature of the research requires for physicians to be equipped with the mental dexterity to continue to teach themselves. These values were not presented to us as addenda, but were the foundation of our entire education.

Like many innovations, implementing PBL took courage, perseverance, and more than a little faith. I would like to thank this university for having the vision to realize that as the world of medicine changes, we must change with it; for we are better equipped for the complexities of medicine than any class that came before us, and subsequent classes will be better prepared than we. Equipped not just with biomedical knowledge, but with psychosocial understanding and, above all else, compassion.

The strength of our curriculum is second only to the strength of our faculty. Throughout every step of medical school we were guided by physicians whose obvious passion was teaching. Although formal lectures were informative and informal bedside talks were enlightening, what we learned most from our faculty mentors was how they treated their patients and, in turn, how the patients treated them. As I leave the halls of this great institution I feel truly blessed to have been taught by some of the greatest educators and role models I have yet encountered. So, for all your years of tireless dedication, I thank you.

This school has prepared us to be physicians. When I think about that as what I will be doing for the rest of my life, I think about it as an exciting and rewarding job. I do not think that the rest of this society sees it in this way. A recent poll lists doctors at the top of its lists of most respectable professions, most trustworthy professions, and most honest professions. Why is that and what does that mean? Although we may not like to think about it, our patients will be putting their lives in our hands. We will know many of their deepest secrets, they will seek our advice on their lives, and we will be the bearers of good news and bad. Our job is to be stewards of their trust, guardians of their dreams, and messengers of the Fates. Even though the responsibility is immense, our patients will willingly place it in our hands because of their faith in our profession. Because of this, it not a burden, but a great honor every time a patient allows us to take part in their life.

I look out over my fellow classmates, and I think about what it takes to carry out the duties that we are about to accept. I think about the values that are inherent in us and have been instilled in us. I think about the compassion, respect, and determination of the physicians who have touched my life. However, their lasting effects will have little impact unless we make an effort to share our knowledge and experiences with the next generation.

It is true that our efforts are what give us our drive, but it is our mentors who give us direction. I think about my personal career goals and I know that the study of Infectious Diseases is what is most appealing to me. If one were to ask me why, I could probably come up with a number of reasons ranging from its historical role in mortality to its rapidly changing nature. But I wonder if the real reasons for my interest are actually the faculty of the Infectious Diseases department, who have had such a profound impact on my education. I wonder if I would be interested in patient care, research, teaching, and university involvement if it wasn't for great role models like Dr. Christensen. The opportunities for involvement are endless, but also absolutely vital.

As I bring this little speech to end, I would to thank my class for giving me the opportunity to do this. These last four years have been the most rewarding years of my life I am privileged to be able to call you my colleagues. I would also like to thank my friends and family for their support throughout my education. Medical school was not easy, but having their support made it enjoyable.

As we walk across this stage and enter our new lives, most of us are leaving only with our memories. So let us remember this day, for it is a good day, but they are only going to get better and better.
