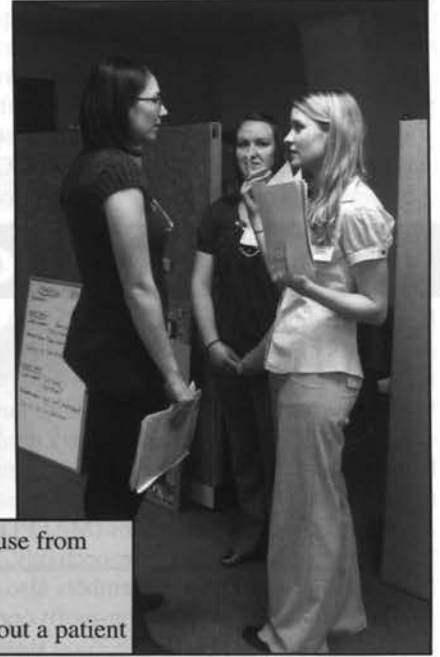

- Who has the most difficult job?

-I believe that it is the patient. They are in a foreign world, trusting complete strangers to make some of the most important decisions in their life. They sleep worse than the residents do, getting awakened by machines, nurses checking their vitals, and medical students greeting them at 5AM. Remember this on your difficult days, that their job is much harder than yours, and do all you can to support the patient.

A story of a patient with metastatic breast cancer, given a poor prognosis. She is dealing with pain, what to say to her young children, and struggling with whether to undertake further treatment. When asked what the hardest part for her was, she responded with something that I will never forget. I won't forget because her response was nowhere on my list of what I thought was best for this patient, and what I thought I could do for her. She said "losing my hair." She explained that the thing she wanted most was to be treated "normally" for the rest of her life, and not as a sick person.

-You cannot know what a patient needs most unless you ask, and more importantly listen to what they say.

On a more personal note, a word on priorities. Each of us has varied priorities, and those will change throughout our lives. On those days that you are feeling stressed or overwhelmed, write down your priorities and what is most important to you. Don't spend your time worrying about the things that aren't on that list -- life is just too short.
