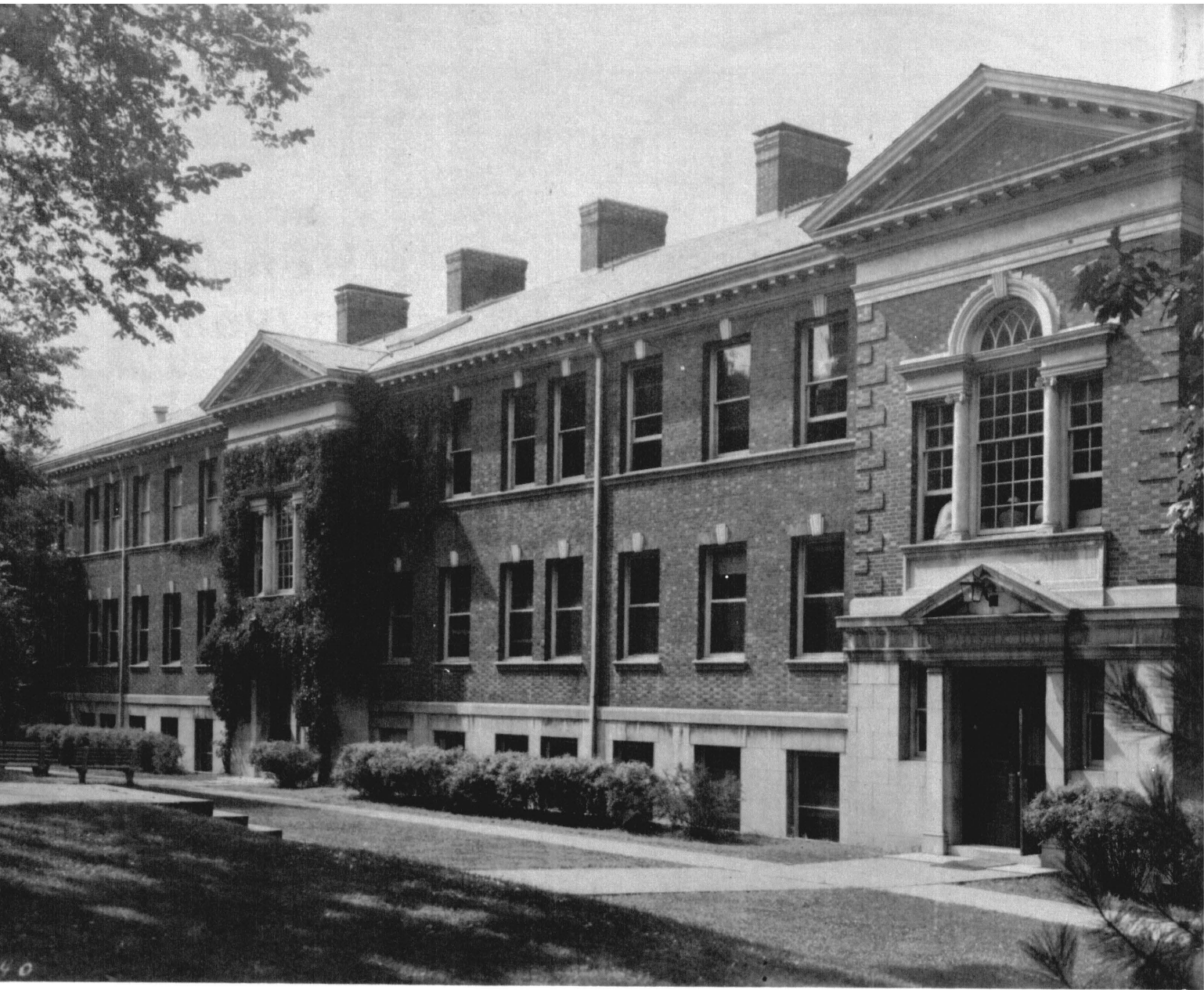

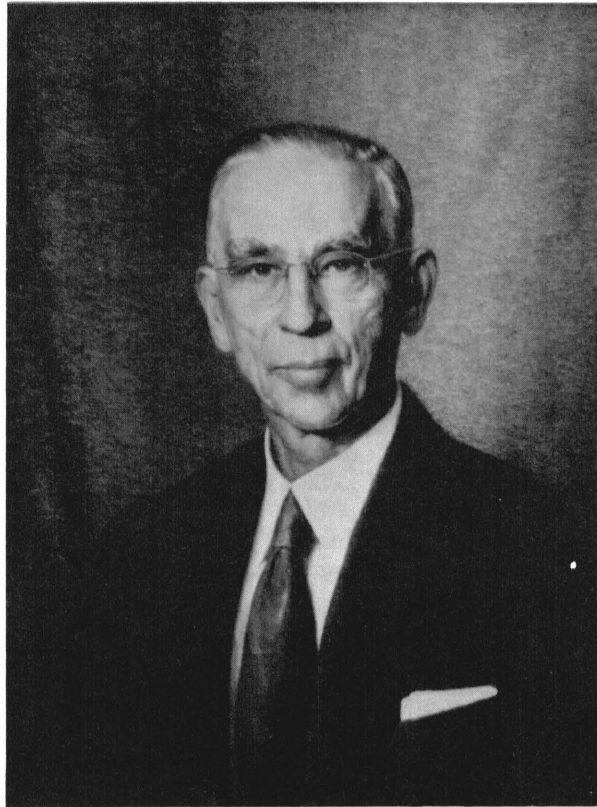

The School of Medicine of the University of Missouri was built upon the Medical Department of Kemper College ("McDowell Medical College") founded in St. Louis in 1840. This was the first medical school established west of the Mississippi River. In 1845 it became a department of the University of Missouri. As such it functioned for ten years, being discontinued in 1855. The School of Medicine was re-established on the University campus in Columbia in December, 1872, with a curriculum, like most medical schools in the country, of only two years. In 1891 the curriculum was extended to three years and in 1899, to the full four years. In 1910 the last two years were discontinued because of inability to finance the expansion necessary for teaching the clinical subjects. From 1910 to 1955, the University maintained only the preclinical years of the regular medical course.

In 1951, the legislature of the state of Missouri appropriated monies to enable the University of Missouri to undertake expansion of its two-year program to a full four-year curriculum leading to the degree of Doctor of Medicine. Additional appropriations were made by the legislature in 1953 and the new University of Missouri Medical Center was completed and occupied in September, 1956. In the fall of 1956, the fourth-year curriculum was initiated and graduation exercises took place on June 8, 1957--the first time that the University of Missouri had conferred the degree of Doctor of Medicine since 1908.

The Oath of Hippocrates

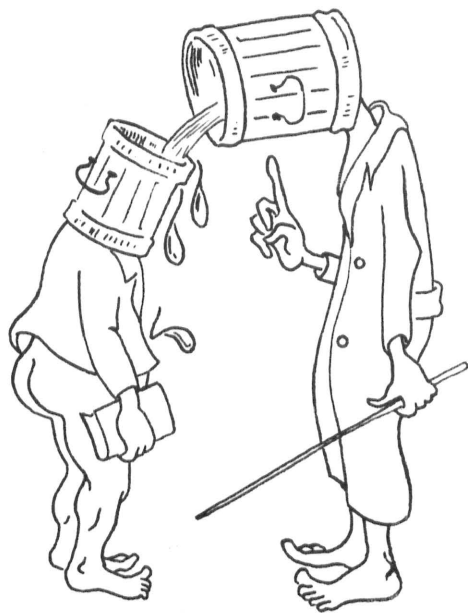
I Swear by Apollo, the physician, and Aesculapius, and Health, and All-heal, and all the gods and goddesses, that, according to my ability and judgment, I will keep this oath and stipulation: to reckon him who taught me this art equally dear to me as my parents, to share my substance with him and relieve his necessities if required; to regard his offspring as on the same footing with my own brothers, and to teach them this art if they should wish to learn it, without fee or stipulation, and that by precept, lecture and every other mode of instruction, I will impart a knowledge of the art to my own sons and to those of my teachers, and to disciples bound by a stipulation and oath, according to the law of medicine, but to none others.

C. I Will follow that method of treatment which, according to my ability and judgment, I consider for the benefit of my patients, and abstain from whatever is deleterious and mischievous. I will give no deadly medicine to anyone if asked, nor suggest any such counsel; furthermore, I will not give to a woman an instrument to produce abortion.

C. With Purity and with holiness I will pass my life and practice my art. I will not cut a person who is suffering with a stone, but will leave this to be done by practitioners of this work. Into whatever houses I enter I will go into them for the benefit of the sick and will abstain from every voluntary act of mischief and corruption; and further from the seduction of females or males, bond or free.

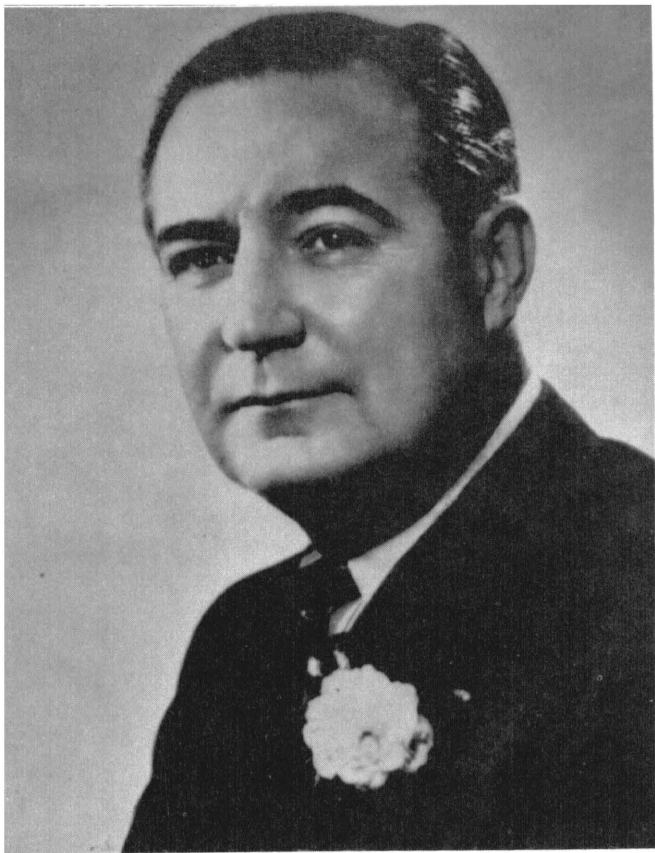
C. Whatever, in connection with my professional practice, or not in connection with it, I may see or hear in the lives of men which ought not to be spoken abroad, I will not divulge, as reckoning that all such should be kept secret.

C. While I Continue to keep this oath unviolated, may it be granted to me to enjoy life and the practice of the art, respected by all men at all times, but should I trespass and violate this oath, may the reverse be my lot.



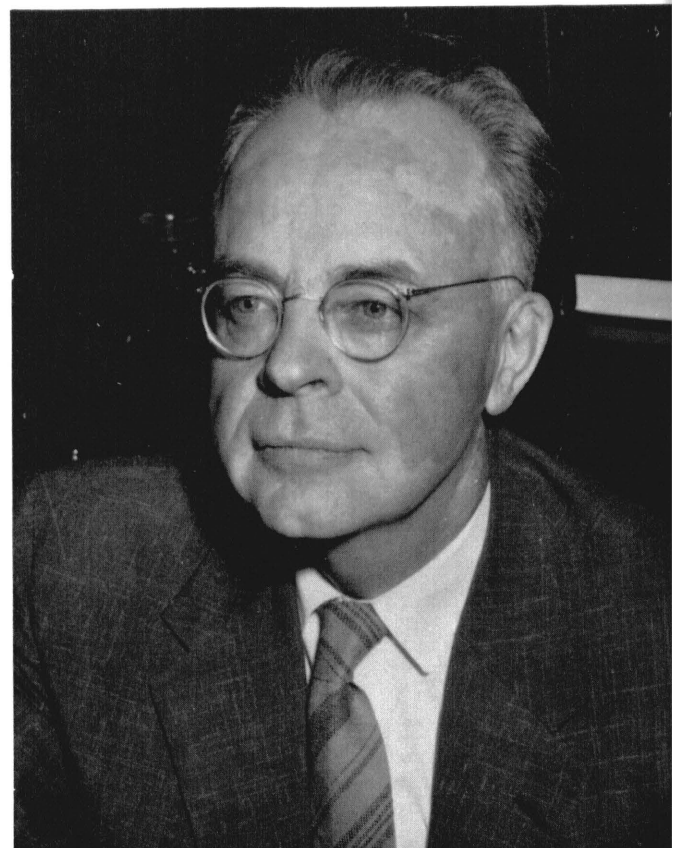

The Halloween party was a blast, with an outstanding dramatic performance of "Macbeth," starring Dr. Vickers and his Victorian players.

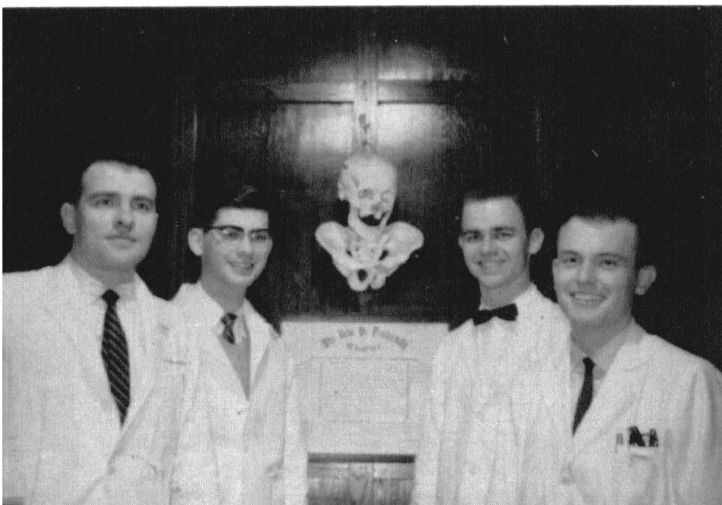
At the Christmas party Santa paid us a visit and left goodies for all. Bernie did the honors, and the red nose he had that night was quite appropriate.

School of Nursing



The University of Missouri, created in 1839, was the first state university established in the Louisiana Purchase Territory. The school of Nursing is a professional school functioning within the general frame-work and policies of the University and reflecting the purposes of the University in its educational services and programs for the State. The School of Nursing is built on a long tradition originating in 1901 when Parker Hospital Training School for Nurses was established. In 1920 the University assumed responsibility for this school and established a three year curriculum combining Arts and Science and Nursing. Between 1939 and 1947 a five year program, leading to the degree Bachelor of Science in Nursing was offered. In 1949 the Board of Curators established the Department of Nursing Education within the School of Medicine. The name was changed to School of Nursing in 1954.

THE INTERNAL CLOCK

The ability to judge intervals of time is a basic mental function. In order to learn how drugs affect this "internal clock," SK&F scientists use a test in which a monkey must hit a lever after an interval of 20 seconds to obtain food.

When he is under the influence of certain drugs, "time flies" and he misses the pay-off period by hitting the lever too late. Other drugs make "time drag" and he misses the pay-off period by hitting the lever too soon.

Because one of the characteristics of many mental disorders is a distortion of the time sense, observing how drugs affect this primary psychological process may reveal valuable information that will help SK&F scientists in discovering effective treatments for mental illness.
