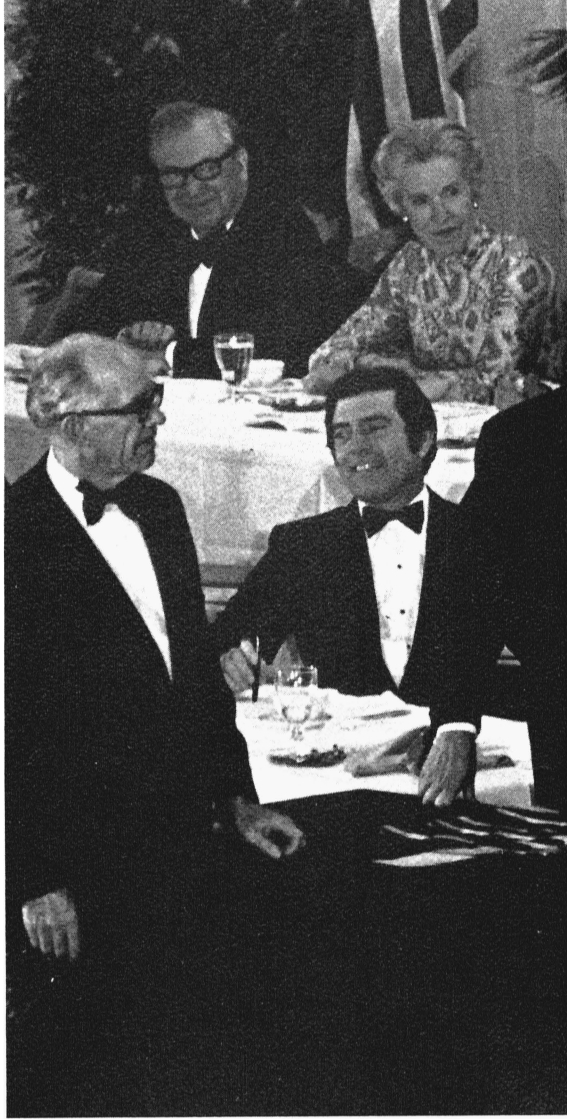

THE MISSOURI MEDAL

Ever since 1930, the University of Missouri, in cooperation with its School of Journalism, has awarded approximately seven journalism honor medals "for distinguished service in journalism," to be presented during the annual Journalism Week.

Considered one of the highest honors in journalism, the Missouri medal recognizes continuing performance rather than a single

achievement.

As stipulated when the awards were established by the University of Missouri School of Journalism in 1930, the medals are awarded to newspapers, or periodicals, or editors or publishers of newspapers and periodicals, or broadcasters, or persons engaged in the practice of journalism, for distinguished service performed in such lines of journalistic endeavor



as shall be selected each year for consideration.

Through the years, the medal's heritage remains the same—quality journalism.

A Journalism School committee each year considers nominations that have been received before November 1. Members give special attention to records of excellence over a period of time, rather than particular occasions of

achievement.

Nominations for the honor awards may be submitted by interested parties. Names should be sent before November 1 to the Dean of the Faculty, School of Journalism. After consideration by the Honor Awards Committee, nominees are voted on by the faculty and approved by the Chancellor, President, and the University Board of Curators.

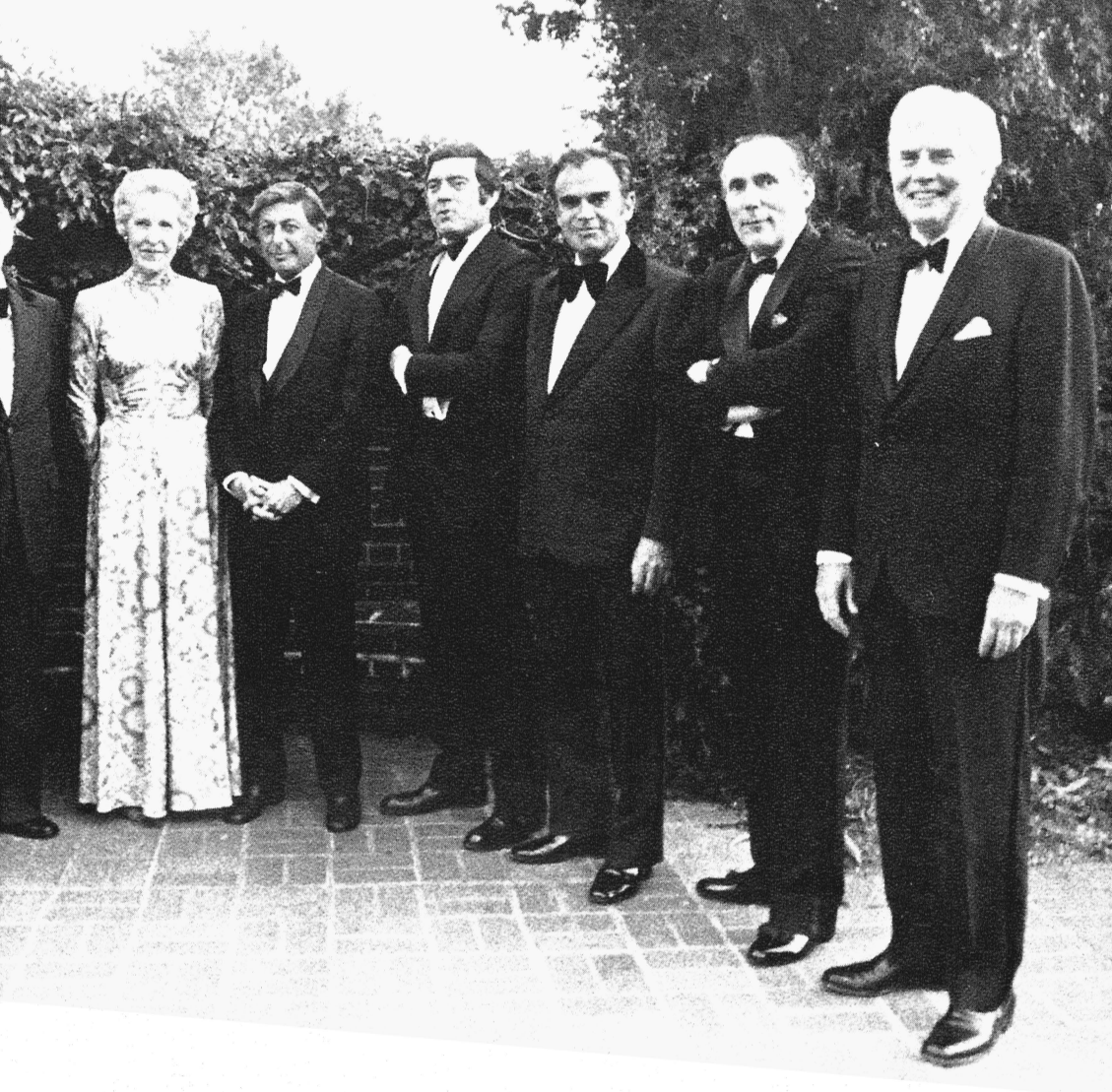
1976 MISSOURI MEDALISTS

The 67th annual Journalism Week, April 19-23, 1976, drew an array of top media persons to the campus. Students served as greet-and-guide escorts for the speakers, and 34 students presided, introduced speakers, and served on panels during the week.

Thirty outstanding media representatives spoke and served on panels. Among the speakers

and program participants were the seven recipients of Missouri Honor Award medals for Distinguished Service in Journalism.

Hung on black and gold ribbons,

the medals were placed around the neck of each recipient by President C. Brice Ratchford and Chancellor Herbert W. Schooling at the Journalism Banquet in Rothwell Gymnasium. Dan Rather, co-editor of "60 Minutes," was the banquet speaker.

This year's seven medalists brought to 293 the total honored in 47 years.

MAHLON R. ALDRIDGE

General Manager, KFRU

Mahlon R. Aldridge, Jr., “Voice of the Tigers” for 28 years, has been an owner of Station KFRU since 1948.

He initiated Missouri Tiger football and basketball play-by-play on KFRU in 1946, and after buying the station he started the Missouri Sports Network. By 1970, the original five stations in the network had grown to 55, making it the largest in-state sports network in the country.

A past president of the Missouri Broadcasters Association, Aldridge has been closely associated with the School of Journalism. He has been a leader in community affairs.

Aldridge is a member of the President’s Committee on National Traffic Safety and is widely known for his efforts in behalf of the Missouri State Highway Patrol.

In recognition of more than 30 years of community service, his commitment through radio station KFRU to local news, public affairs, and sports programming;

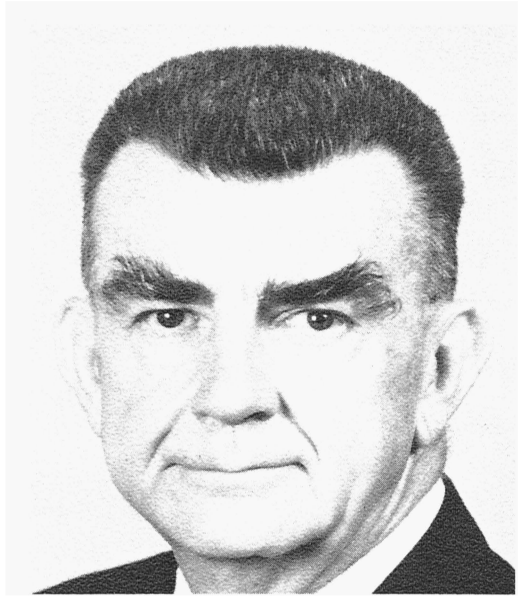

Wes Gallagher, president of the Associated Press, earned his journalism spurs as a foreign correspondent.

His by-lined dispatches from Europe and North Africa during World War II and his coverage of historic postwar events won him many honors. AP recalled him to New York in 1951 to

become general executive in charge of the association's personnel.

A native Californian, he took over as top AP executive in 1962. He is a winner of the John Peter Zenger Award and numerous other honors for his dedication to freedom of information.

His service with the AP for almost 40 years—as battlefield reporter, foreign correspondent, overseas bureau chief, general manager and president;

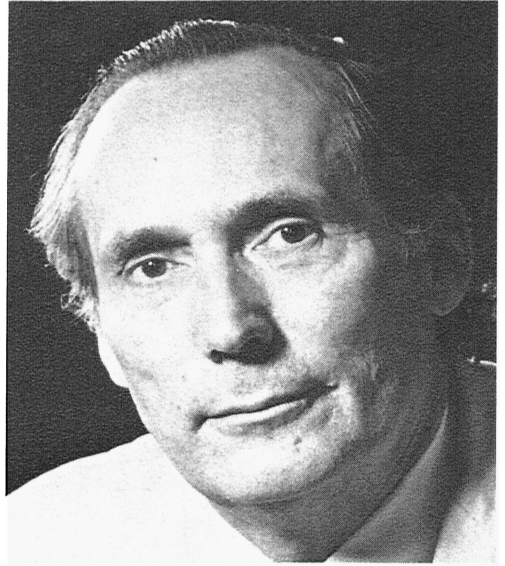
His insight and innovation in bringing the AP into the electronic age through pioneering use of computer technology and laser transmission;

John N. Cole accepted the Missouri Medal for the *Maine Times*.

Cole, president and editor of the *Maine Times*, a prize-winning regional weekly, is an environmental activist and author. A Yale graduate in 1945, he put in a four-year hitch in the Air Force as a combat gunner.

After trying his hand at public relations in New York,

Cole turned writer and commercial fisherman. He went to Maine in 1958 to go into newspapering, and he has remained there since.

He has written books and numerous articles on conservation and environmental affairs. His weekly has won national recognition for its aggressive advocacy of environmental protection.



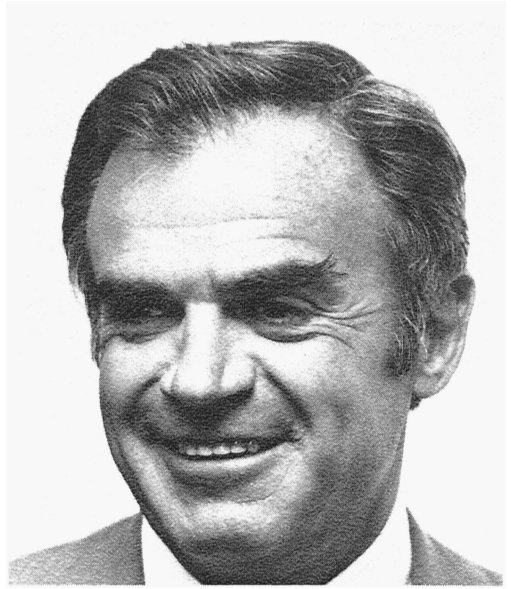

Carl W. Nichols, who put in a stint in this School of Journalism as an advertising major, is chairman and chief executive officer for Cunningham and Walsh.

He had joined that agency in 1946 as a researcher. In 1961 at the age of 37 he was elected president.

Cunningham and Walsh, literally a Madison Avenue agency, under his leadership

became one of the nation's top corporate communications firms.

Nichols has been a director of the American Association of Advertising Agencies and is on the AAAA committee on improving advertising.

He also is a director of the Advertising Council and chairman of the American Advertising Federation.

“60 MINUTES”

Don Hewitt accepted the Missouri Medal for “60 Minutes.”

Hewitt, winner of six Emmy Awards, is executive producer of “60 Minutes,” CBS’s highly acclaimed television news series. Hewitt has been involved with the production and direction of broadcast coverage of almost every major news break in the past 28 years.

Hewitt’s journalism career began as head copyboy for the New York Herald Tribune in 1942. He was a war

correspondent in Europe and in the Pacific and then became night editor for the Associated Press in Memphis.

Hewitt joined CBS in 1948. He was executive producer of the CBS Evening News with Walter Cronkite at its inception and then moved on to producing and directing numerous major news specials, among them the face-to-face television debate between John F. Kennedy and Richard M. Nixon in 1960.



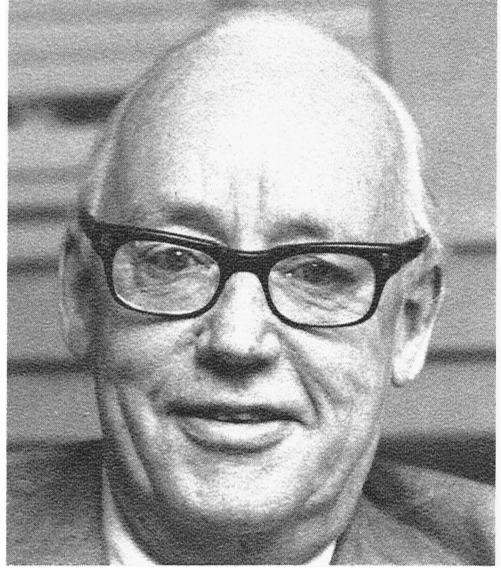

RED SMITH

Columnist, New York Times

Red Smith, a legendary sports columnist for the New York Times, broke into newspapering in 1927 as a general assignment reporter for the Milwaukee Sentinel soon after graduating from Notre Dame.

In 1928 he joined the St. Louis Star as a copyreader and soon went to sports. Smith headed east to the

Philadelphia Record in 1936 and began writing a column. After memorable stints on the New York Herald Tribune and the short-lived World Journal Tribune, he joined the Times as a columnist in 1971.

As author and sports columnist, he has won countless honors.


In recognition of her successful career as editor and publisher of the Warrensburg Daily Star-Journal and as owner of radio station KOKO;
