- 26. "No overnite." That is the announcement that was made at the first G.A.A. meeting of the year.


OCTOBER

JANUARY


- That short sleep which started late on the morning of January 1st is interrupted by a school bell 4. at 12:30.


- 3. The Student Council meets at 2:30. They must be important to get out of a class like that.

- , Student teachers show their skill outside the classroom as they give us a swell assembly.




At one time the Cubs had a twenty-game winning streak.




