SEPTEMBER

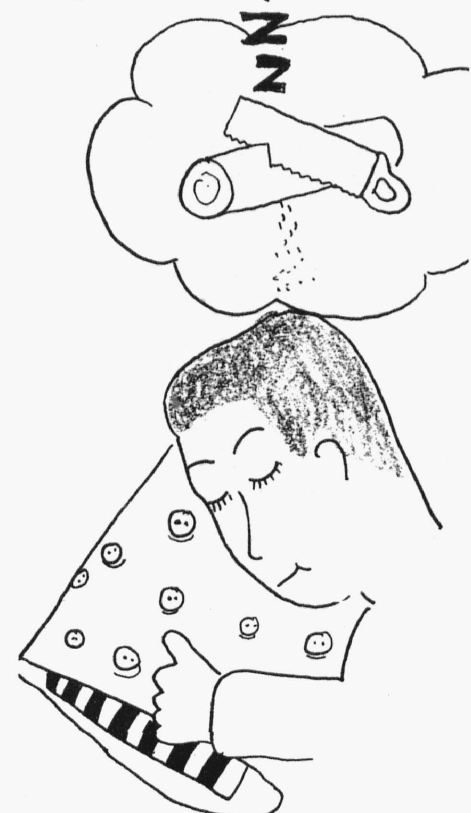
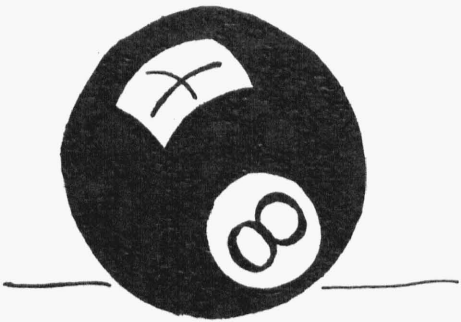

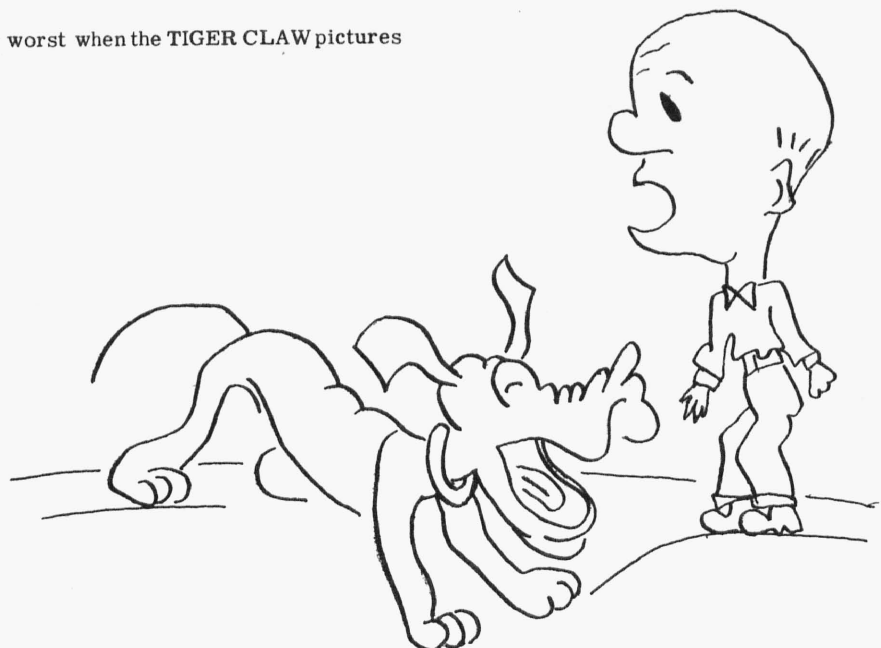
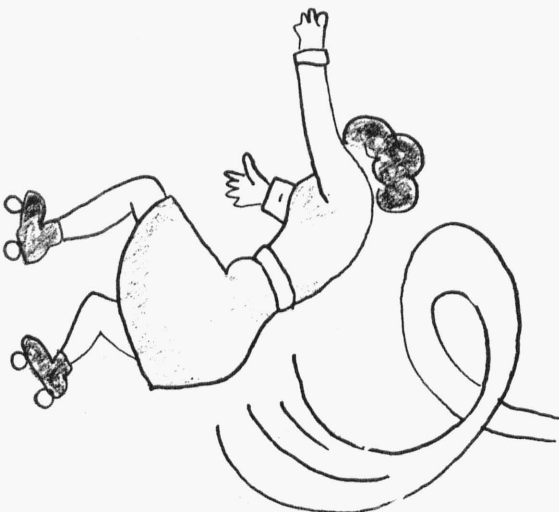
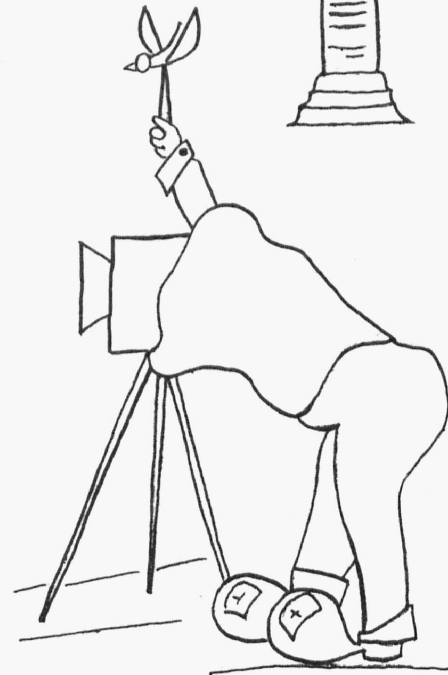
17. Today is the day of the Jr.-Sr. G.A.A. brawl-pardon-ball. We wonder why everyone seems to like intermission best!

APRIL

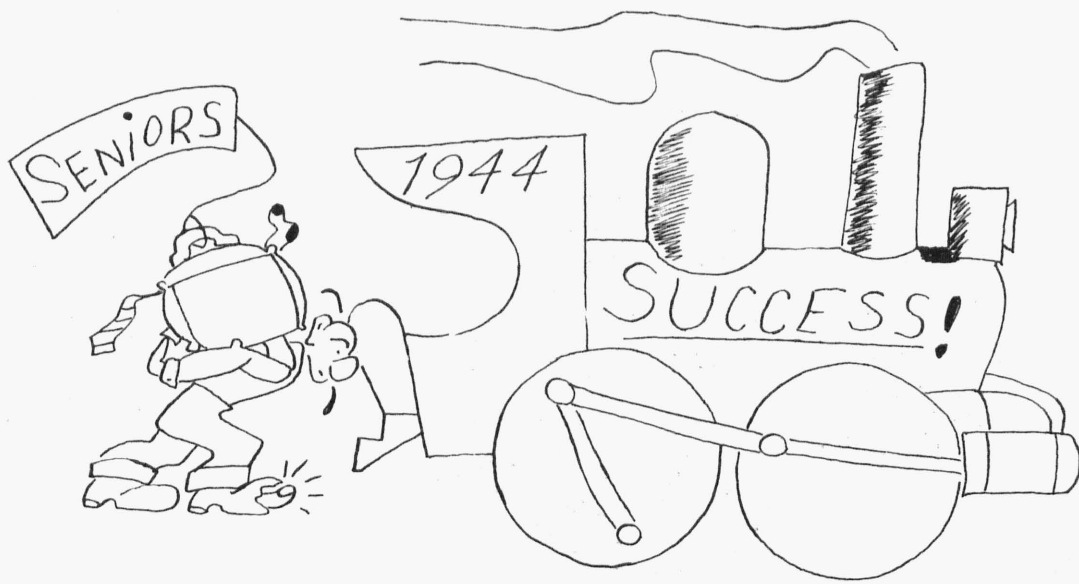
14. The junior high kids have a lot of fun guessing the identity of baby pictures. Of course the seventh graders don't look much older than babies to us seniors. Ahem!!

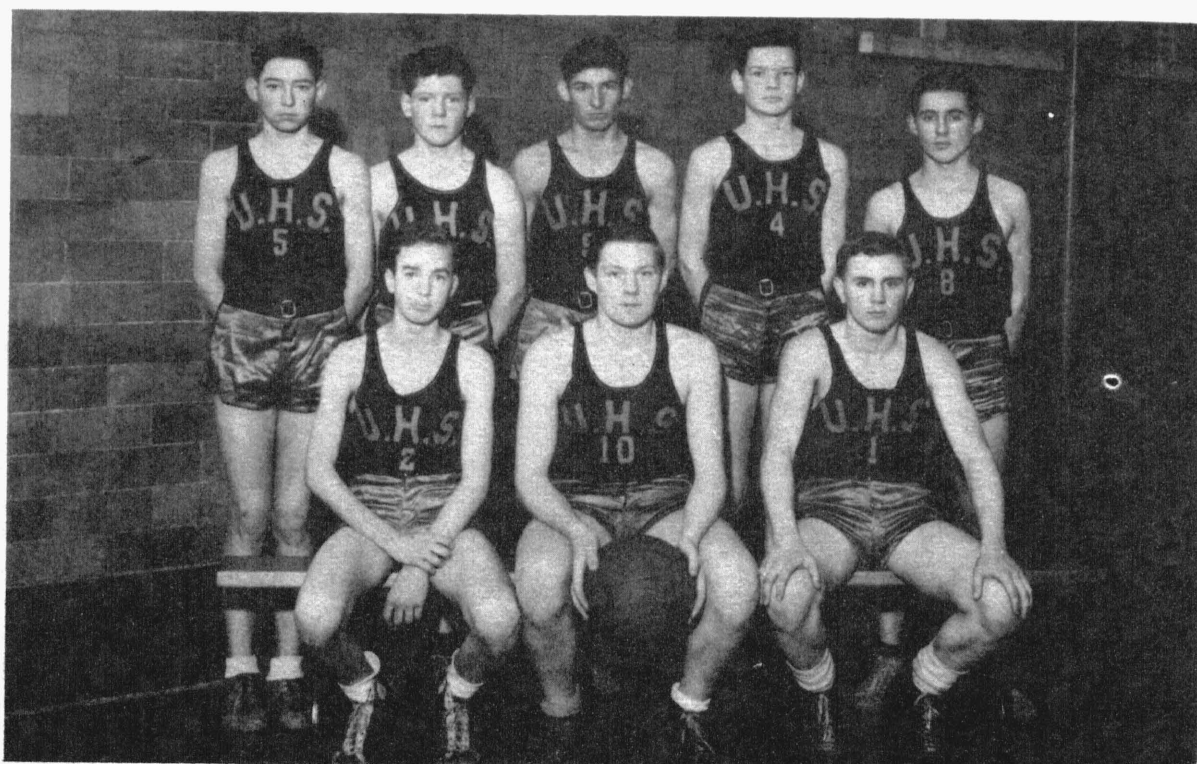

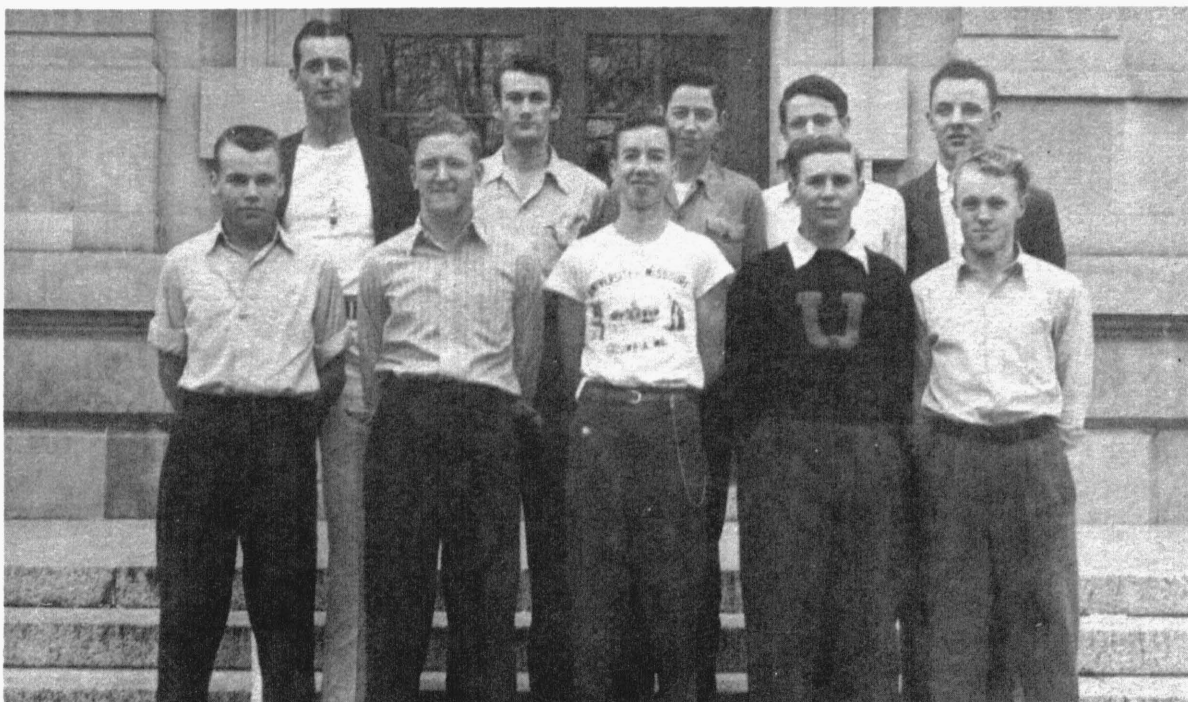
