All in all, the sophomores are workers and will be a credit to the junior class of 1960.

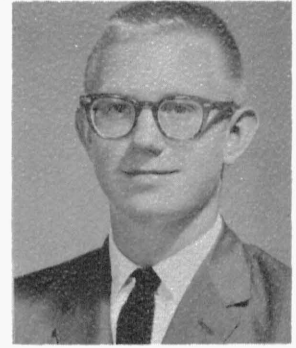
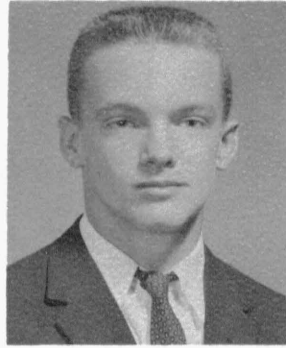

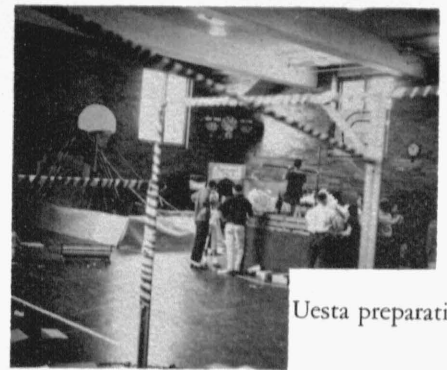
# UESTA

This year the Uesta doors were opened at 7:30, and 548 people passed through these doors for fun and excitement.

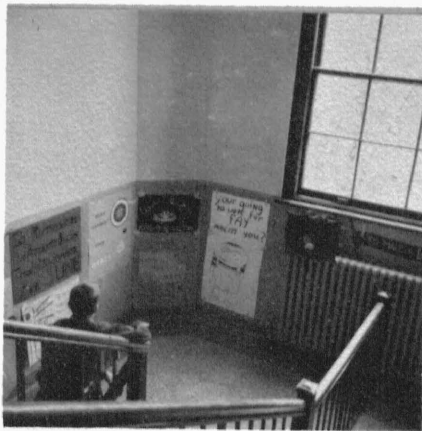

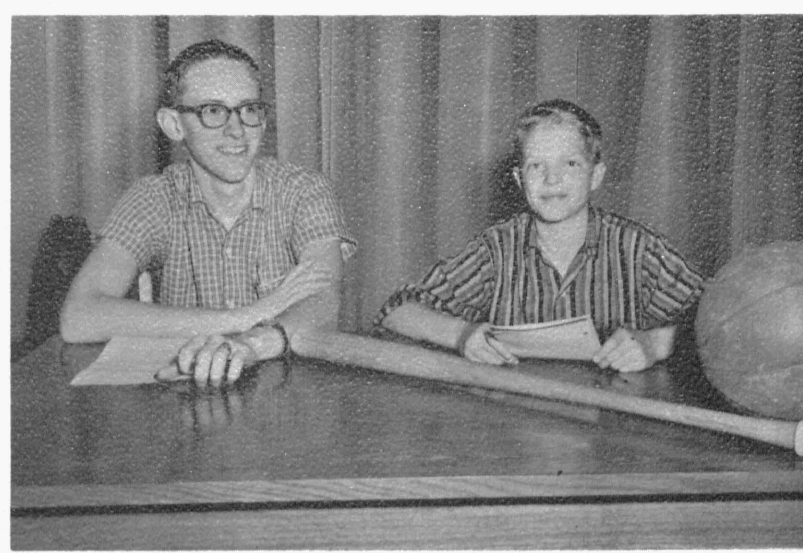

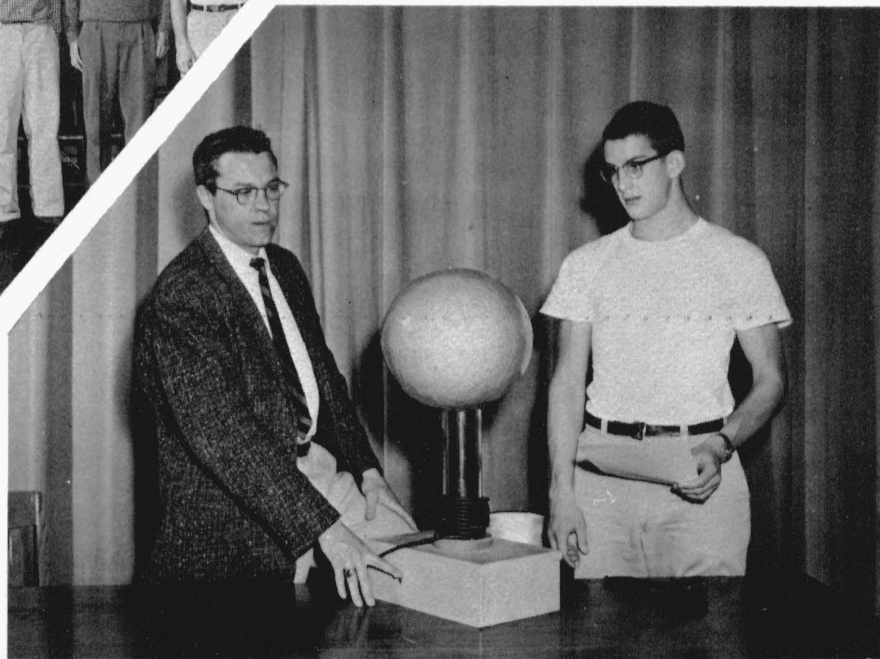
# SCIENCE CLUB

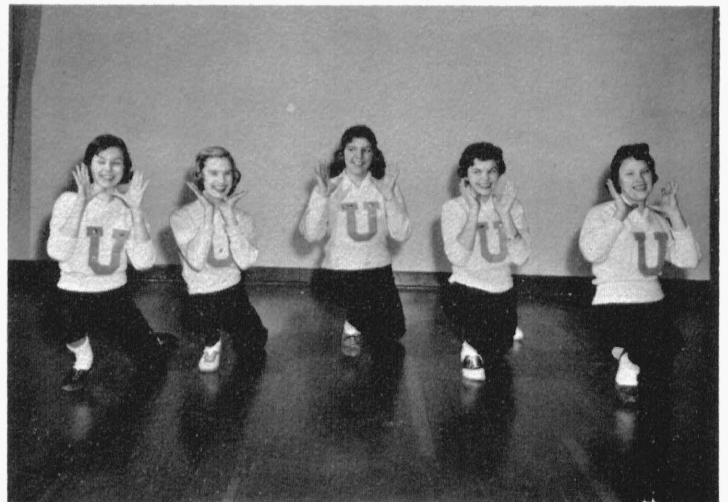

The club meets once a week with Mrs. Lawnick, its sponsor for a get together of semi-classical music. At present there are no officers.

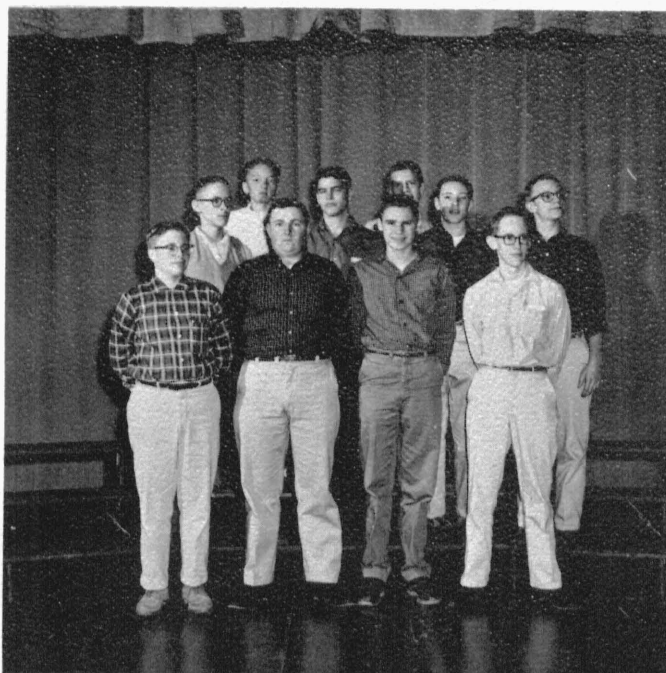

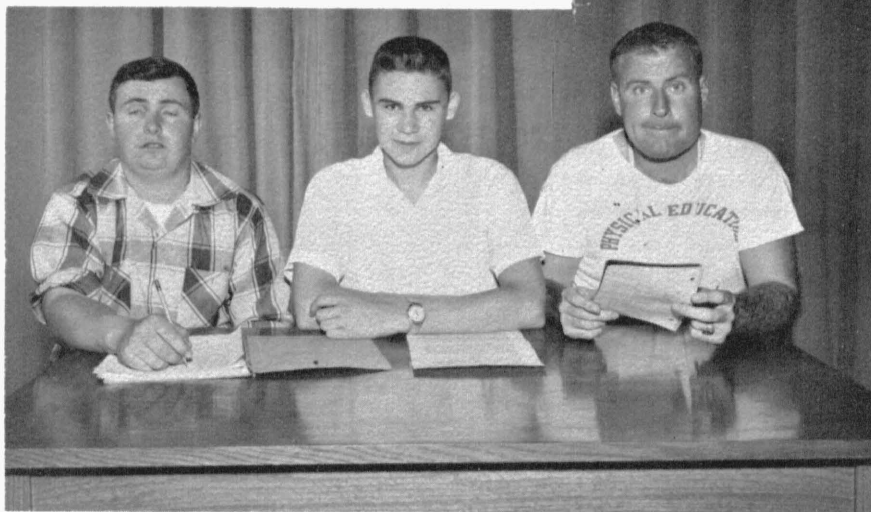
