WHERE TO FIND AGRICULTURAL MARKETING INFORMATION

"Decisions are no better than the facts upon which they are based." This familiar old adage certainly applies to Agriculture today. The trend during the past several decades has been for farms and agribusiness firms to become larger while profit per unit of product became smaller. This leaves little room for the uninformed and the inefficient in agribusiness. The only way producers and processors can make a profit—or stay in business—is to have accurate information for making "sound" economic decisions.

GETTING THE FACTS

It is often too costly for each farmer or agribusiness firm to collect all the facts needed for making "sound" decisions. Frequently, by one agency collecting the information and preparing it for use by a large number of firms, these needed facts can be made available at a reasonable cost. Many agencies and groups (both public and private) collect agricultural information and make it available to farmers and agribusiness firms. In cases where many people—both farm and nonfarm—are affected, as in the case of food and fiber, facts are frequently collected

by public agencies and made available at very little cost.

The U. S. Department of Agriculture (USDA), the Missouri Department of Agriculture, and the College of Agriculture and Extension Service of the University of Missouri are among the more important public agencies providing facts to farm and non-farm firms in Missouri.

United States Department of Agriculture: The USDA has played an important role in making agricultural market information available for many years.

Statistical reporting of agricultural information came into existence even before the United States Department of Agriculture. In 1839, as a result of popular demand, Congress authorized the Patent Office to collect agricultural statistics. In 1862, the Department of Agriculture was established and given the responsibility for collecting, distributing, and preserving agricultural information. From this meager beginning, the most elaborate agricultural information program in the world has evolved.

The Statistical Reporting Service has 43 state offices. The Washington staff is the coordinating body. They provide for preparation of various reports and supervise

work in the states to ensure that methods used and interpretations of data are consistent.

The Missouri office of the Statistical Reporting Service, like most of the state offices, operates under a formal federal-state cooperative agreement. The state statistician gathers data from farmers and agribusiness firms. They even count the number of ears of corn in selected fields in order to estimate annual corn production. This mass of data is summarized and analyzed, and the facts are made available to Missouri farmers and agribusiness firms so they can make "more accurate" decisions about the future.

These facts are also sent to Washington and become part of the national reports on crops and livestock.

The Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) is another USDA agency that plays an important role in providing facts about current situations necessary for making "better" decisions. Market news—about current prices, supplies, local stocks, and trading—is collected and disseminated by AMS.

Market news reporters are stationed at most of the terminal markets and in some of the local production areas. Usually the production area market reporters come under a federal-state agreement.

Market news collected at the different markets is exchanged over a leased wire system in seconds. Each reporter prepares reports that are then made available to the public by radio, television, newspapers, and mail releases.

Other agencies in the U. S. Department of Agriculture also release facts about agriculture. Situation and Outlook reports are prepared and published by the Economic Research Service. These reports are not specifically designed for Missouri. They report the national situation with specific states or areas mentioned if local conditions affect the nation's supply or the price of commodities. Since market conditions in Missouri are drastically affected by other areas, these situation reports are important to Missouri farmers and agribusiness firms.

The Missouri Department of Agriculture: In 1961, the Marketing Division of the Missouri Department of Agriculture entered into a federal-state agreement to expand market information available in Missouri.

This service provides facts about prices, supplies, trading, market conditions and production in many of Missouri's production areas. Under the federal-state agree-

ment, the Missouri Department of Agriculture has access to the leased wire service for exchanging facts with other areas and terminal markets. This enables Missouri farmers and agribusiness firms to keep track of what is happening in their own neighborhood as well as in other producing and consuming areas.

The Missouri Department of Agriculture and the Missouri Office of the Statistical Reporting Service are also working together to provide the facts needed about Missouri's Agriculture. Improvements have already been made in watermelon information and pig crop reports as a result of their efforts.

University of Missouri: The University of Missouri makes available a wealth of agricultural facts. The Agricultural Economics Department and the Extension Service of the University of Missouri release outlook material on a monthly basis in a newsletter and in an annual outlook brochure available each January. See the list of periodic releases below.

Many of the reports published by the University of Missouri are nonrecurring. Private Agencies: Private agencies are important in getting timely facts to farmers and agribusiness firms. Radio, television, and newspapers are essential for making market news available in time to be useful in decision-making. These media also are of major importance in making available other types of information such as outlook and production data.

Of course, magazines, trade associations, and other private groups collect, interpret, and make facts available to their clients or members. Some of the larger agribusiness firms have their own staff collecting marketing information for their own use.
