

THE JOURNALIST'S CREED

I believe in the profession of journalism.

I believe that the public journal is a public trust; that all connected with it are, to the full measure of their responsibility, trustees for the public; that acceptance of lesser service than the public service is betrayal of this trust.

I believe that clear thinking and clear statement, accuracy and fairness, are fundamental to good journalism.

I believe that a journalist should write only what he holds in his heart to be true.

I believe that suppression of the news, for any consideration other than the welfare of society, is indefensible.

I believe that no one should write as a journalist what he would not say as a gentleman; that bribery of one's own pocket-book is as much to be avoided as bribery by the pocketbook of another; that individual responsibility may not be escaped by pleading another's instructions or another's dividends.

I believe that advertising, news and editorial columns should alike serve the best interests of readers; that a single standard of helpful truth and cleanness should prevail for all; that the supreme test of good journalism is the measure of its public service.

I believe that the journalism which succeeds best—and best deserves success—fears God and honors man; is stoutly independent, unmoved by pride of opinion or greed of power, constructive, tolerant but never careless, self-controlled, patient, always respectful of its readers but always unafraid; is quickly indignant at injustice; is unswayed by the appeal of privilege or the clamor of the mob; seeks to give every man a chance and, as far as law and honest wage and recognition of human brotherhood can make it so, an equal chance; is profoundly patriotic while sincerely promoting international good will and cementing world-comradeship; is a journalism of humanity, of and for today's world.

M. U. School of Journalism Is Fifteen Years Old

The School of Journalism of the University of Missouri, the first professional school of journalism in the world to offer courses leading to a degree in journalism, was opened for students in September, 1908. Its fifteenth school year closed with the completion of the winter term, 1923.

Classes in news writing and in journalism had been conducted at the University of Missouri as early as 1878-79 by Prof. D. R. McAnally, who was before, and again after his membership in the University faculty, a reporter and editorial writer on the St. Louis Globe-Democrat. In 1898 a chair of journalism was established by the Board of Curators, at the request of the Missouri Press Association. This chair remained unfilled. During 1905 a course of lectures on various phases of journalism was given. In 1906 the department of journalism was established, co-ordinate with the departments of law and medicine. In 1908 a school of journalism, co-ordinate with the other professional divisions of the University, offered its first courses.

The first degree conferred was Bachelor of Science in Journalism but in 1913 the name of the degree was changed to Bachelor of Journalism, which was then conferred for the first time by any college or university. This is the only undergraduate degree in journalism conferred.

Until 1911 the entrance requirements for the School of Journalism were the same as those to the College of Arts and Science. Since 1911 two years of college work have been required for entrance.

The first issue of the School's daily newspaper, the University Missourian, appeared on the same day on which instruction began. Its name was changed in August, 1916, to The Evening Missourian and in 1920, to The Columbia Evening Missourian.

Journalism classes were first held in the basement of Academic Hall. In 1909 Switzler Hall, first known as the Scientific Building, the oldest building for class use on the campus, became the School's home. Switzler Hall, named for the late Col. William F. Switzler, distinguished editor and friend of the University, was occupied by the School of Journalism until the completion of Jay H. Neff Hall, the present home of the school. Jay H. Neff Hall stands as a memorial to the journalist of that name, a pioneer in agricultural journalism and founder of the Corn Belt Farm Dailies. It is the first building to house a school of journalism and its daily newspaper, as well as the present well-equipped home of the oldest school of journalism in the world. Funds for the building were given by Mr. Neff's son, Ward A. Neff, an alumnus of the School of Journalism in the class of 1913, editor of the Daily Drovers Journal of Chicago, one of the Corn Belt Farm Dailies. This gift, plus the additional cost of the equipment supplied by the state, makes the building represent an investment of \$100,000. The ground for Jay H. Neff Hall was broken May 8, 1919, during Journalism Week, and the building was occupied in October, 1920.

GRADUATES NUMBER 435

Including the candidates for the degree of Bachelor of Journalism in April, 1923, the school has graduated 435 men and women in its fifteen years' existence. In the following table the figures show how many students actually received diplomas in the respective years. Some of the degrees when granted were "as of" a former year.

Journalism Organizations

In the School of Journalism there are now eight organizations whose chief purpose is to encourage journalistic endeavor and create greater comradeship among those studying journalism. Another, the Dana Press Club, was originally of this type but has since become a strictly social organization.

The Dana Press Club, the first organization of any sort in the school, came into existence the fall of 1909. Previous to that time the fifty or sixty students of the school were scattered over the campus and town with little to bring them together except class work. Realizing the need of cooperation a group of men rented a house at 718 Maryland Place and formed the Dana Press Club. For years it was maintained at this address. Gradually students other than journalists were admitted and now it has no specific connection with the School of Journalism. Among the founders of the club were: F. W. Cooke, Harry E. Ridings, Gordon Fisher, Charles A. Harvey, E. R. Childers, Earle Pearson, J. E. Chasnoff (deceased) and James G. May.

Gamma Chapter of the national honorary journalistic sorority, Theta Sigma Phi, was the next organization installed. It was started here in 1911 with Amy Armstrong, Florence LaTurno, Mary Alice Hudson, Myrtle McDougal, Vina Lindsay, Sara Lockwood and Clarissa Spencer among its early members.

One of the older organizations revived in recent years is Kappa Tau Alpha, a purely honorary, scholastic society taking the place of Phi Beta Kappa in journalism. It was founded here in 1910 by Vaughn Bryant, E. R. Childers, Robin P. Gould, Joseph E. Chasnoff, Gus V. Kenton, R. F. Leggett, J. B. Powell, Oscar E. Riley and DR Scott. The chapter was revived after several years of inactivity in 1921 and women were admitted to membership. Plans for nationalizing the organization are under way.

Sigma Delta Chi, national honorary journalistic fraternity, next established a chapter at Missouri in February, 1913. Since its organization by James G. May, Hugh James MacKay, William Earle Hall, John Cauley MacArthur and Ward Andrew Neff, it has been a leader not only in local but national affairs. Its list of honorary members includes: Dean Walter Williams, Prof. Frank L. Martin, Harry Hansen, Richard V. Oulahan.

Alpha Delta Sigma was founded here in 1914 and has since become a national advertising fraternity. It is affiliated with the Associated Advertising Clubs of the World. Among the first members were: John W. Jewell, John B. Powell, Hugh J. MacKay, Oliver M. Gingrich, J. Harrison Brown, Rex B. Magee, Thomas E. Parker, James E. Schofield. The local chapter won a silver loving cup this year for having the largest delegation in proportion to the size of the town at the national convention of A. A. C. W. in St. Louis.

Girls interested in advertising also felt the need for organization and in 1920 Ella Wyatt, Elizabeth Atteberry, Frances Chapman, Christine Gabriel, Lulu Crum, Christine Hood, Beatrice Watts, Lucile Gross, May Miller, Mary McKee, Alfreda Halligan, Selma Stein, Ruth Prather, Mildred Roetzel and Ruth Taylor formed the first chapter of Gamma Alpha Chi. Since then two other chapters have been established. These also are associated with the Advertising Clubs of the World.

The Mallett Press Club, fulfilling the need of a home for girls in journalism, was organized in 1921, by twelve girls, who still maintain a house for the organization. The club was named for Hannah Mallett who was the first woman journalist. The charter members were: Mary Cherry, Sara Moore, Lorance McKiddy, Ruth Warren, Clara Shaw, Mabel Clarke, Esther Burre, Lee Kearney, Katherine Grumley, Rowena Pierce, Lulu Crum, and Mary Green. Miss Sara Lockwood and Miss Julia Sampson are patronesses of the organization.

The Women's Journalism Club enrolls all girls in the School of Journalism, helping to bind them closer together in the ideals of the school, and to foster the school spirit. Since 1920, it has been the annual custom of the club to put on a Fashion Show each spring.

The student body of the School of Journalism was incorporated under the laws of the State of Missouri on April 13, 1922, as the University of Missouri Journalism Students' Association. This action was taken by Irl Brown, then president of the student body of the School, that a closer organization might be gained; that the student body might have some legal basis and that the activities might be carried on more efficiently.

The Association consists of all of the students enrolled in the School of Journalism as well as freshmen and sophomores who plan to enter journalism. An effective organization was worked out recently in a new constitution which was adopted by the association this spring. This constitution calls for a president, vice-president and

secretary-treasurer, all to be elected. Aside from these officers is a cabinet consisting of the elected officers, the president of Women's Journalism Club and four appointive officers. The appointive officers are a chairman of activities, an advertising chairman, a scholastic chairman and an historical chairman. In this way the work of the association is divided and placed under competent heads.

The activities during the year in which the Journalism Students' Association takes charge include the annual Scoop Dance, the journalism play and the Peerade Xtra. It also takes an important part in the arrangements for Journalism Week.
