Legalize Mizzou hopes to change both laws and stigmas around drug usage

[The group](#) is made up of two separate nationwide organizations, the National Organization for Marijuana Reform Laws and Students for Sensible Drug policy. The president of MU NORML said that a year ago, the MU Office of Licensing and Trademarks told the group it could not use a marijuana leaf in any image associating with MU because it may give the impression that the school promotes drug use. Legalize Mizzou is looking to challenge this.

Student government had little input on Tiger Plan

The presidents of the Missouri Students Association and the Residence Halls Association both said they raised concerns with Campus Dining Services about the [Tiger Plan](#), but they said their feedback was not taken into consideration. Both said they talked to CDS about the low number of flex dollars that were provided for the cost. Other members of MSA were not consulted at all.

Gender-neutral bathrooms one step toward gender-inclusive campus, advocates say

Sophomore Rio Chacon stands outside the door, their hand hovering. It is a smaller bathroom — the two-stall kind — but instead of entering, Chacon pauses to listen for a flush, the noise of the sink, chattering, anything to indicate a person is inside. If Chacon hears a noise, they wait. For Chacon, who identifies as transgender and gender fluid, using bathrooms at MU has not been a smooth experience.

“I’ll just kind of stand there for a second to hear if anyone’s in there before I go in,” Chacon said. “I hate doing that, but I just don’t want to be there while someone else’s in there, just because I don’t want to make anyone else uncomfortable.”

Last spring, the Student Fee Capital Improvement Committee granted \$4,000 to the Missouri Students Association to change signs on single-stall bathrooms on campus to make them gender-inclusive.

One for the history books

Missouri football [had a field day yesterday](#) in its 79-0 rout of Delaware State. The team put up more points in this game than it had in any single game since 1890. They broke the record set in 1979 for most points in a half with 58. Drew Lock tied the record for most touchdown passes in a game, and J'Mon Moore tied the record for most touchdown catches in a game. It cost Missouri \$525,000 to schedule Delaware State, but the morale boost after last week's heartbreaker should make it worth the price.

Other updates

Volleyball stands at 10-3 after [a sweep of South Carolina](#). Soccer finished the week 7-3. They're 2-1 so far in SEC play.

College football recap

- Ole Miss avenges our loss: No. 23 Ole Miss picked apart No. 12 Georgia's defense yesterday. They won 45-14, and all of Georgia's points came in the back half of the fourth quarter. This was Georgia coach Kirby Smart's first loss in that position, and the Bulldogs are now 3-1.
- LSU looks beatable: Missouri's next opponent, LSU, was beaten by Auburn 18-13. They lost on a last-minute play that would have been the game-winning touchdown for LSU had the refs not ruled that time ran out before the snap. The two-loss Tigers from Baton Rouge, ranked No. 18 this week, look particularly vulnerable as Mizzou heads into Death Valley next weekend.
- Tennessee comes back against Florida: The No. 19 Gators led 21-3 at halftime, but No. 14 Tennessee went off for 35 points in the second half to win 38-28. Florida had a 92.6 percent win probability just after halftime, according to ESPN. Despite some close calls, Tennessee remains undefeated at 4-0. This was Florida's first loss.

Moore hauls in four touchdowns as Missouri routs Delaware State by Tyler Kraft

First, it was a 4-yard fade pass to the corner of the south end zone.

Then, it was a 6-yard slant pass for a second touchdown. A few minutes later, there was a 9-yard screen that turned into a third score.

Finally, it was another fade route to the sideline of the north end zone, and just like that, J'Mon Moore tied the Missouri record for touchdowns in a game. There were still seven minutes left in the second quarter.

Moore accounted for four of Missouri's 11 touchdowns in its 79-0 rout of Delaware State. The performance tied Dorial Green-Beckham's single-game record of four receiving touchdowns in a game.

The possibility of a record-breaking performance did not occur to Moore while he was in the game. All that mattered to the junior wide receiver was getting the ball in the end zone as much as he could
