That means more service and events, like bringing food trucks to campus or helping students access free textbooks.

Parker is the director of *Birth of a Nation*, and Union writes "I took this part in this film to talk about sexual violence. To talk about this stain that lives on in our psyches. I know these conversations are uncomfortable and difficult and painful. But they are necessary. Addressing misogyny, toxic masculinity, and rape culture is necessary. Addressing what should and should not be deemed consent is necessary."

The week in Mizzou sports



The Tigers' D-line wasn't strong enough

"The vaunted Missouri defensive line must have missed the flight to Morgantown, West Virginia," Maneater football reporter Tyler Kraft wrote after the game. Charles Harris, a preseason All-Southeastern Conference honoree, was fairly ineffective during Saturday's game. The redshirt junior tallied only two tackles. The entire defense had no sacks and just six total tackles for a loss. Cornerback Aarion Penton, however, had a strong game, intercepting his first pass of the season.

Mizzou debuts fall too short

For both offensive coordinator Josh Heupel and kicker Tucker McCann, this was their first game as a Tiger. Neither lived up to their expectations. McCann only made one field goal in three attempts, and Heupel "rotated [quarterbacks] Marvin Zanders and [Drew] Lock at odd times, often killing drives," according to Maneater writer Nick Kelly. The Tigers offense only scored 11 points.

On the other hand, offense wasn't too bad

During the game, the offensive line gave up just one sack and kept the pressure off sophomore quarterback Drew Lock. The sophomore had success throwing to the middle of the field on post and slant routes, and he finished with 280 passing yards.
