Stockton/Gulati drops out of the MSA presidential race

Josh Stockton and Shruti Gulati [announced their withdrawal](#) from the MSA presidential election and support for the Nathan Willett/Payton Englert campaign on their campaign Facebook page Saturday morning. The Willett/Englert campaign team said in an email that Stockton/Gulati's post was "merely a public endorsement" of the campaign and that their campaign would not be receiving the rest of the Stockton/Gulati campaign funds.

Missouri men’s basketball coach Kim Anderson to step down

Kim Anderson’s time as head men’s basketball coach at his alma mater has come to a close.

Athletics director Jim Sterk has asked Anderson to step down from his job as coach of the Tigers men’s basketball team at the end of the season, per a release from Mizzou Athletics on Sunday.

The decision comes after a 7-23 regular season in 2016-17. If Missouri loses one more game — which will happen barring a deeply improbable national title run — it will mark the most losses in program history. The 7-23 record is also Anderson’s worst in his time as head coach.

Anderson did not win a road game in his three years as coach of the Tigers.

UM System audit highlighted areas for improvement in system administration

Incentive payments to top UM System administrators, former Chancellor R. Bowen Loftin's transition agreement and vehicle allowances [were causes for concern](#) in an audit of the UM System from the state auditor released on Monday. Specifically, Loftin continued to receive his chancellor's salary six months after he resigned. In his current role as director of National Security Research Development, he receives 31 percent more than the highest-paid research administrator on

campus.

J'den Cox helped lead the wrestling team to its sixth consecutive conference championship

Mizzou wrestling [won](#) the Mid-American Conference Championships on Sunday in Cedar Falls, Iowa. This made J'den Cox the second wrestler in program history to win four conference championships. Mizzou had six wrestlers crowned MAC champions of their respective weight classes on their way to a conference-record 154.5 team points.

Bright Flight still haven't received the scholarship money they were originally awarded

The Bright Flight scholarship is [a \\$1,500-per-semester scholarship](#) for in-state students who scored a 30 or higher on their ACT. The original appropriation for the scholarship from the state isn't enough to cover the larger-than-expected increase in students who qualified. Scholars received \$400 less this semester than they were supposed to. Liz Coleman, a spokeswoman for the Missouri Department of Education, said in an email that the department will not know when the scholars will receive the money until the end of the legislative session, when lawmakers vote to either pass or fail the \$4 million increase to the scholarship allocation included in Gov. Eric Greitens' 2018 fiscal year budget.

Letter to the Editor: The proposed fee is too important not to learn about

This letter, written by Jack Dae Han Miller, discusses the importance of learning about the pending student fee, especially with the attention on this year's MSA election.

"This year is different. This year, there's a student referendum on the proposed Student Services Enhancement Fee, which, if passed, would bring changes to some of the most essential student services on campus.

"Library hours would be longer, with Ellis Library open 24/5 on all floors. The Counseling Center would hire three additional counselors and expand outreach efforts. TigerWiFi would improve due to an increase in wireless access points. Without the fee, the university will struggle to maintain the status quo."



The Willett/Englert slate won the MSA presidential race

Nathan Willett and Payton Englert, running under the slate "Tigers Together," won the Missouri Students Association presidential election last night, with 54 percent of the vote. They defeated the slate "Make it Matter, Mizzou," composed of current MSA Vice President Tori Schafer and Riley de Leon. According to the BEC, 8548 votes were cast in the presidential election.

Earlier yesterday afternoon, the Board of Elections Commissioners announced that the Willett/Englert slate had been expelled from the election for rules violations. However, the slate appealed, and the MSA Senate meeting last night was packed with speakers in favor of and in opposition to the slate. Last night, the MSA Student Court ruled in favor of the slate, overturning the expulsion. Election results were announced on Traditions Plaza at 9:30.

The “Enhance Mizzou” fee also passed last night

This \$35-per-semester fee, which would go toward expanding Ellis Library hours to 24/5, hiring more counselors at the Counseling Center and updating technology and TigerWiFi, passed last night with 79 percent of the vote. Voter turnout for this referendum was high, with 9,420 students casting votes.

### Morning read:

The Missouri women's basketball team gathered around head coach Robin Pingeton for a short meeting during a late regular season practice. Pingeton laid out the pages of stats and talked briefly about the Southeastern Conference standings, the team's future in the NCAA and other postseason games.

Then, she ripped all the papers to shreds, right in front of the team's eyes.

“I said there would be no more discussion about it,” Pingeton said. “We’ll take it one day at a time and be

the best we can be. Any time you get too far ahead of yourself, you start to play to not lose instead of playing to win.”

It’s that step-by-step, “blue-collar” approach that has propelled Mizzou to two five-game conference winning streaks for the first time in program history and several wins over ranked opponents, including a win over South Carolina that guaranteed Mizzou’s first winning record in SEC play. It’s the approach that helped them to finish third in the SEC.





A CPD report shows that arrests increased in 2016 compared to 2015

The report, released March 1, showed the Columbia Police Department made 11.1 percent more arrests in 2016 than in 2015. It stated that 3.1 percent of all citizen contacts lead to arrests. It isn't clear whether the increase was due to more misdemeanors or more felonies committed. However, Internal Affairs Sgt. Brian Tate suggested the rise could be due to increased demand from Columbia's growing population.


