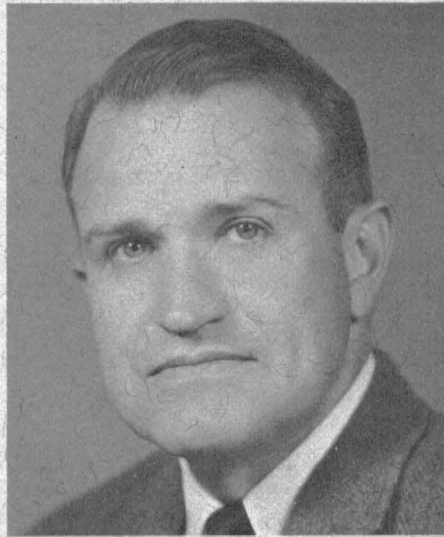
NASH W. HAMPTON JR., BS ChE '29, at age 65, February 19 in Lebanon, Ill.
