Agriculture

Three Alumni Association Citations of Merit were presented at the annual Ag Day activities on February 4. Howard A. Cowden, Agr '11, Dr. Earl L. Lasley, Agr '41, and J. O. Martin, BS Agr '26, were the recipients.

Cowden is the founder of Farmland Industries, a regional cooperative for farmers with headquarters in Kansas City. Farmland is recognized as one of the 500 largest corporations in the United States. Cowden retired as president of the corporation in 1961. He also is chairman of the board of the International Cooperative Development Association, Washington, D.C.

Lasley is director of research for Farmers Hybrid Companies, Inc., a subsidiary of Monsanto Company. He joined Farmers Hybrid in 1960 after having been with the Miner Agricultural Research Center at Chazy, N.Y. and a member of the faculty at the

University of Illinois. He received his BS and MS degrees from North Dakota State University and his PhD from Iowa State University.

Martin retired in October 1969 as a member of the administrative staff in the State of Missouri Office of the Farmers Home Administration. He had been with that agency since 1934, when it was known as the Rural Rehabilitation Corporation. He has also been active in the Missouri Society of Farm Managers and Rural Appraisers and is a past president of that organization.

Arts and Science

Three graduates of the College of Arts and Science received Citations of Merit from the College and the Alumni Association on February 29 at the annual Arts and Science Banquet.

Those honored were George H. Clay, AB '34, LLB '34, Dr. Cynthia P. Deutsch, AB '58, and William S. Hayes, AB '39, AM '42.

Clay has been president of the Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas City since 1961. He first joined the bank in 1958 after 14 years with Trans World Airlines. He currently is a director and treasurer of the University of Missouri-Columbia Development Fund, a director of the Heart of America United Campaign, and a director of the Mid-America Comprehensive Health Planning Agency.

Professor and chairman of the department of psychology and education at Briarcliff College, Dr. Deutsch continues her work in developmental psychology and directs the development labs there. She formerly was associated with the Institute for Developmental Studies at New York University. The Institute was organized by her husband, Martin Deutsch, a prominent social psychologist. She has taught and directed research at many schools and hospitals over the past 20 years.

President of Alice Lloyd College, Pippa Passes, Ky., William S. Hayes has been with the college since 1942 when he started his career there as an instructor. He later became dean and then president in 1962. He also is vice president of the National Council of Independent Junior College Associations. His wife is the former Edith Worstell, RN '40.

Home Economics

Dr. Margaret Liston, AM '33, professor of family economics at Iowa State University, Ames, received the 1972 Citation of Merit presented by the School of Home Economics and the Alumni Association on March 4.

A member of the Iowa State faculty since 1949, Dr. Liston currently holds the title of Mary B. Welch Distinguished Professor of Home Economics there and teaches nine graduate courses. She also is an advisor for graduate student thesis research projects at the University.
