




Chancellor Is Host To Leaders

The activities of alumni, like those of students, get off to a big start each fall. By now the annual Alumni Leaders Conference is established as a traditional event of autumn which kicks off a new season of meetings and other programs around the country. The visiting alumni were guests of Chancellor and Mrs. John W. Schwada at a brunch in Memorial Student Union and at the football game between Kentucky and Missouri.

The alumni gathering really began Friday, September 17 when more than a score of leaders were present for the fall meeting of the Association's Board of Directors. During a lengthy session the directors cleared the calendar of a number of pending matters and then launched into plans for several new programs, which will be announced later when details are worked out.

A change in national presidents of the Association was effected smoothly. The change was necessitated when William C. Tucker of Warrensburg, serving his second term in the office, was appointed by Governor Hearnes as a member of the Board of Curators. Succeeding Mr. Tucker is one of the Association's vice-presidents who has given years of service to the University—Marvin D. McQueen of St. Louis.

Saturday morning the visitors mingled in the Alumni-Faculty Lounge at a coffee hour preceding the brunch in the main ballroom. Brief talks were made by Mr. Tucker and Mr. McQueen at the brunch, which was presided over by G. H. (Bus) Entsminger, Assistant to the President for Development and Alumni Activities.

In addressing the guests, Chancellor Schwada said the University "has a great number of things going for it" and listed a few of its assets. He called on alumni for continued moral and financial support, pointing out that more than half of the University's support comes from private sources.

President and Mrs. Elmer Ellis were guests at the brunch.

Five of the Association's regional directors were present: Eugene F. Trumble, Minneapolis; Harry Calvert, San Francisco; Clifton Blackmon, Dallas; Howard Broemmelsick, Memphis; and Ed Kennedy, Tulsa. Among the out-of-state club presidents were Mohsen Nour, Albuquerque, N. M.; Martin Mayes, Washington, D. C.; and Robert B. Arkes, Des Moines.


Following the brunch, the guests were taken to Memorial Stadium in special busses.




Charles (Bud) McClaren of St. Louis enjoys a chuckle over his coffee.
