

- ▶ Planning for college is an exciting time, and the Student Financial Aid Office at the University of Missouri-Columbia is pleased to help. This booklet will acquaint you with scholarships available and how to apply for them.
- ▶ Some scholarships reward high grades, while others consider your hometown, academic interests or financial need. But winners have two things in common: they applied and met the selection criteria.


**A**nd don't stop looking here — we also recommend contacting local and national organizations or foundations that may have an interest in your background or potential interest in your future. Check with high-school counselors, professional publications, clubs and groups to which a parent or relative belongs, and the library. Remember: Apply early, apply often and be resourceful.

To help you locate other scholarship funding sources, MU provides a Scholarship Search Service. This service identifies sources of private funding through a computerized data base that is updated twice a year.

The data base, which contains approximately 180,000 awards from more than 20,000 sources, features no-need or merit awards as well as need-based resources. The scholarship search matches the applicant's academic and personal criteria with the eligibility criteria for financial resources. The results of the search include complete application and award information. You must request application forms directly from the scholarship agencies listed on the results.

To request a Scholarship Search Service application, complete the card on the back cover of this booklet. You will receive an application within one week. Return the completed application with a \$15 check payable to the University of Missouri-Columbia. The results of the search will be mailed to you within three weeks. The best time to use MU's Scholarship Search Service is in the fall, since many scholarship application deadlines are in February or March.

Please type your application and mail to Scholarships, MU Student Financial Aid Office, 11 Jesse Hall, Columbia, Mo. 65211. Application deadlines are shown on Page 5.





## ► Don't forget

- If you apply for a scholarship that has a financial-need requirement, you must submit a 1993-94 ACT Family Financial Statement or the USA Funds SINGLEFILE FORM. The forms are available from your high-school guidance counselor, your local or community college, or the MU Student Financial Aid Office. Read the instructions carefully. Mail the completed form by March 1, 1993, but not earlier than Jan. 1, 1993, to receive priority.
- We rely upon academic information available in the MU Admissions and Registrar's Office. Therefore, if you will be a freshman or a transfer student, apply for admission to MU at the same time you apply for a scholarship. No scholarship can be awarded before a student is admitted.

# Consider these first

**E**ntering freshmen should use the application on Page 39 to apply for these scholarships, except those indicating a separate application is required. The application for continuing and transfer students is on Page 41. Scholarships marked with a star cannot be received simultaneously. You may apply for more than one, but may receive funds from only one.

## **Bright Flight**

(Missouri Higher Education Academic Scholarship. 1,705 students were awarded \$3.3 million in 1991-92.) Missouri residents; ACT or SAT score in the top 3 percent of all Missouri students taking those tests during the year you graduate from high school. Students must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 semester hours to receive this award. The scholarship pays \$2,000 a year, and is renewable up to four additional years or until you receive your degree, if you maintain satisfactory progress. A separate application is required. For more information, contact your high-school counselor or the Coordinating Board for Higher Education, 101 Adams St., Jefferson City, Mo. 65101, or call (314) 751-3940.

## **National Merit/Achievement Scholars**

(147 students were awarded \$161,675 in 1991-92.) National Merit/Achievement finalists; declare MU as the first choice with the National Merit Scholarship Corp. The scholarship pays a minimum of \$1,000 each year. Every scholar demonstrating financial need may receive up to an additional \$1,000. In addition, the award will offset any out-of-state tuition charged to recipients. Guidelines are established by the National Merit Scholarship Corp. Students must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 semester hours to receive this award. To apply, be sure to name MU as your first choice with the National Merit Corp. Contact your high-school guidance counselor for additional information.

## **★Curators Scholars**

(928 students received \$1.7 million in 1991-92.) Top 3 percent of your high-school class at the end of six semesters; a composite ACT score of at least 26 or a combined verbal and math SAT score of

1,120; Missouri residents; enroll at MU the first semester after high school. This scholarship pays the educational fee and is fully renewable if you maintain a 3.75 grade point average. The scholarship is renewable for 75 percent of the educational fee if your grade point average is between 3.5 and 3.749. Students with a cumulative grade point average between 3.25 and 3.49 will receive a \$1,000 award. High-school principals and counselors recommend students for this scholarship. A separate application is required. Nominations from high-school principals, due March 15, should be sent to the Office of the Curators Scholars Program, 306 Clark Hall, Columbia, Mo. 65211. For more information, call (314) 882-6292.

## **★MU Scholars Program**

(90 students were awarded \$90,720 in 1991-92.) Top 5 percent of your high-school class; ACT composite of at least 27; Missouri residents; enroll at MU the first semester after high school. This scholarship pays half of your educational fee, and is renewable for an additional year if you earn a 3.25 grade point average. Complete the freshman scholarship application on Page 39 and submit not later than Feb. 1, 1993. One award will be made to one incoming freshman from each Missouri high school.

## **★Excellence Award**

(651 students were awarded \$322,000 in 1991-92.) Top 15 percent of high-school class; ACT composite of at least 26. The scholarship pays \$500 and is renewable for one more year if you earn a 3.25 grade point average or better. No application is required for this award. Students are considered automatically based on the information provided on the admissions application.

## **Chancellor's Leadership Class**

(42 students were awarded \$21,000 in 1991-92.) Students who have shown excellence in leadership ability in high school and community activities; enroll at MU the first semester after high school. The scholarship pays \$500 for one year. Recipients are expected to attend and participate in bi-weekly class meetings during the fall and winter semesters. Complete the freshman scholarship application on Page 39 and submit not later than Feb. 1, 1993.

## **George Brooks Minority Scholarship**

(114 students were awarded \$516,100 in 1991-92.) Minority students; top 10 percent of high-school class; high ACT score. The scholarship awards \$6,500 to in-state students and \$9,500 to out-of-state students who enter MU in the fall 1993 semester. Brooks Scholars are allowed to retain up to \$1,000 in additional gift assistance that is not awarded or funded by MU. This includes Pell Grant, Bright Flight, corporate sponsored National Merit awards, awards from not-for-profit organizations and private corporation scholarships. High-school principals and counselors nominate students for this scholarship. This award is renewable up to four additional years or until you receive your bachelor's degree, if you maintain a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 and complete 24 credit hours each academic year. ## **Missouri Teacher Education Scholarship**

(39 students were awarded \$78,000 in 1991-92.) Missouri residents; score in the top 15 percent on the ACT or SAT; plan to be a teacher. This non-renewable scholarship pays \$2,000, and does not have to be repaid if you teach after graduation. If you do not teach after graduation, you must repay one-half of the scholarship at 9.5 percent interest. A separate application is required. Application deadline is Feb. 15. For more information, contact the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, P.O. Box 480, Jefferson City, Mo. 65102.

## **University Scholars Program**

(850 students were awarded \$394,590 in 1991-92.) Missouri residents; completion of at least 24 credits; have a 3.5 grade point average or better. This scholarship pays 20 percent of the educational fee for students

who have a 3.5 to 3.749 grade point average and 30 percent of the educational fee for students who have a 3.75 to 4.0 grade point average. This award will pay for a maximum of 140 credits or completion of an undergraduate degree and cannot be received in conjunction with the Curators Scholars or MU Scholars. Transfer students are initially eligible for this award based on their transfer credits and cumulative grade point average. Transfer students should contact the Financial Aid Office, 11 Jesse Hall, Columbia, Mo. 65211, for the award. No application is required for this award.

**Tuition Scholarship for Non-residents**

(290 students were awarded \$913,600 in 1991-92.) Residents of a county that is contiguous with Missouri; parents accrued personal Missouri income tax liability the year before the calendar year in question and show evidence of payment. This scholarship will pay the amount of your out-of-state tuition. Renewable if student maintains a 2.0 grade point average at the end of each semester. A separate application is required. The scholarship must be applied for each year. Contact Residency Office, 123 Jesse Hall, Columbia, Mo. 65211. In Missouri, call toll free 1-800-225-6075. Out-of-state call (314) 882-3852.

**Alumni Scholarship**

(135 students were awarded \$82,755 in 1991-92.) Graduate in the top 25 percent of high-school class; be recommended by your local MU alumni chapter. A separate application is required. Obtain an application from your high-school counselor. For additional information, contact the MU Alumni Association, 123 Donald W. Reynolds Alumni and Visitor Center, Columbia, Mo. 65211. In Missouri, call toll free 1-800-225-6075. Out-of-state call (314) 882-6611.

**Junior and Community College Scholarship**

(10 students were awarded \$11,145 in 1991-92.) Transfer students; Missouri residents; receive an Associate of Arts or Science degree; graduate in the top 10 percent of your public junior or community college class; attend MU the semester immediately after graduation. The amount equals 50 percent of the educational fee at MU. Two awards are given for each public junior and community college. For information, contact the Student Financial Aid Office, 11 Jesse Hall, Columbia, Mo. 65211.

# General Scholarships

▶ MU awarded more than \$300,000 in  
general scholarships for 1991-92.

**T**he MU Student Financial Aid Office has many general scholarships available. To apply for the scholarships listed in this section, incoming freshmen should complete the application on Page 39. The application for continuing or transfer students is on Page 41. Several of these scholarships are county-specific. However, most are open to all MU undergraduates.

## Alpha Gamma Delta Scholarship

Junior, senior or graduate student who is an active member of a social sorority that is a member of the Panhellenic Council; financial need; and grade point average of 2.5 or above. Recommended to Financial Aid Office by MU Panhellenic Council and Scholarship Committee of the Alpha Gamma Delta Founders Memorial Foundation.

## American Citizenship Scholarship

Freshmen graduating from a Missouri high school; financial need; preference to women; high-school class rank considered. Renewable for three years.


**T**he college has many scholarships available for full-time engineering undergraduates with appropriate academic credentials and technical interests. The Engineering Scholarship Committee will match an applicant's interests and qualifications with a particular scholarship, so there is no need to apply for each specific scholarship separately. A college scholarship can be combined with other campus awards (See chart on Page 7) or awards from external sources.

The college also encourages our students to compete for externally awarded scholarships. Generally, these programs are designed to support students with specific technical interests at the junior and senior level, and require a separate application form. Information about these and other external programs can be obtained by contacting the Engineering Scholarship Committee Chairman, Engineering Dean's Office, W1025 Engineering Building East, Columbia, Mo. 65211, (314) 882-4092.

**NOTE:** Students are encouraged to explore cooperative education opportunities and summer internships to supplement their undergraduate engineering education. These jobs provide valuable engineering experience. Contact the Engineering Placement Office, W1025 Engineering Building East, Columbia Mo., 65211, for further information.

## Engineering Scholarship Application Checklist

- Submit the appropriate scholarship application form to the MU Office of Financial Aid (address on form).
- In addition to the appropriate scholarship application form, applicants should attach a supplementary sheet of information. On the sheet, do the following:
  - Discuss your reasons for pursuing an engineering degree, including your expected area of engineering study (agricultural, chemical, civil, computer, electrical, industrial or mechanical). If you are unsure, please indicate that your area of study will be undeclared and indicate areas of engineering that might interest you. This information could help identify other sources of financial support outside of the college for which you might be eligible to apply.
  - Discuss your interest in receiving scholarship support. This could include such items as unusual circumstances that have bearing on family finances, upcoming events that will have a major effect on your financial situation, whether you are a first-generation college student, or other situations that influence your need.
- Since many scholarships consider financial need, you are strongly encouraged to submit either the ACT Family Financial Statement or the SINGLEFILE form for the 1993-94 academic year. These forms are available through your high-school counselor's office, your home college, or through the MU Student Financial Aid Office.
- Transfer students must attach an official transcript to their scholarship application.




