he Tigers (1–0) travel to
Ohio to tackle the Rockets
(1–0) 11 a.m. Saturday,
Sept. 6, at the University of
Toledo's Glass Bowl on ESPN.



It's a homecoming for Mizzou Coach Gary Pinkel, who coached Toledo for 10 seasons from 1991–2000 and amassed a 73–37-3 record. Pinkel has more wins than any other coach in either school's history, a topic sure to be visited more than once by Saturday's ESPN announcers.

It's only the second meeting between Mizzou and Toledo, so even if you attended the Tigers' 38–23

<u>victory against the Rockets at Memorial Stadium</u>, you probably aren't that familiar with the opposing institution.

Traditions: In October, UT monitors each residence hall's energy consumption compared to the previous year. The most improved hall wins.
