Violist Steven Kruse is coordinator of strings at the UMKC Conservatory of Music where he has taught viola and chamber music since 1989. He performed for six years as principal violist with the Kansas City Symphony and for four seasonsas principal violist of the Kansas City Camerata, appearing as soloist with both groups. A native of Los Angeles, Dr. Kruse studied viola with Milton Thomas at the University of Southern California, and with Lillian Fuchs at the Manhattan School of Music, where he earned both Bachelor and Master of Music Degrees. In 1985 he was awarded the Doctor of Arts degree from Ball State University. Dr. Kruse has performed as principal violist with several orchestras, including the Aspen Music Festival Sinfonia, Spoleto Festival Orchestra, Peninsula Music Festival, South Bend Symphony, and the Wheeling Symphony. He has performed as soloist with several orchestras in the midwest, in such works as the Walton and Bartok Viola Concertos, Berlioz, Harold in Italy, Strauss, Don Quixote, and Mozart Symphonie Concertante and Arthur Benjamin's Romantic Fantasy for Violin, Viola, and Orchestra with wife Penny Kruse. He currently performs with the Eastern Chamber Players and serves on the faculty of the Eastern Music Festival in Greensboro, North Carolina.
