The Curators of the University, at a called meeting in March, 1862, discontinued the Institution, in consideration of the failure of patronage and income, consequent on the disturbed condition of the state and country.

Provision was made, by private arrangement, for the completion of the Senior Course of Study and the Degree of A. B. was granted, severally, to the following candidates:

In November, 1862, a partial organization of the Institution was made by filling three chairs of instruction and employing two Tutors. At the end of the session the Degree of A. B. was conferred on HENRY N. ESS.

In the provisional arrangement for session 1863-4, the Curators authorized the appointment of an additional Tutor, enabling the Faculty to cover the whole ground of ordinary University instruction. The following candidates graduated at the close of the session, June, 1864:

MATRICULATION.

In order to admission into the University, each student is required, by ordinance of the Curators, to present to the President a certificate from the Treasurer of the Board, that his bill for tuition and contingencies has been paid; and no drawback is allowed for absence in any case.

When an applicant for admission into the University has been connected with any other incorporated seminary, he should present satisfactory evidence to the Faculty of an honorable standing in the Institution from which he comes.

It is highly important that students should be present at the opening of the session, since the loss of a few days, at the beginning, breaks the connection of their studies, and occasions material embarrassments.

SESSIONS, VACATIONS AND EXPENSES.

The ANNUAL SESSION begins on the third Monday of September, and continues forty weeks.

COMMENCEMENT, the last Wednesday of June.

ANNUAL VACATION, from Commencement till the third Monday of September.

TUITION FEES—in University Classes \$40.

“ “ in sub-Freshman Classes..... 30.

BOARD, in private families, with lodging, washing and fuel, from \$3 to \$5 per week.

The allowance for clothing, books, and pocket money, will vary with the character of the student. It is hoped that parents will bear in mind that too liberal an allowance of money, exposes a youth to temptation, interferes with his habits of study, and adds nothing to his happiness.

Exercises During the Year.

Critical reading of the New Testament in Greek, on Monday morning of each week, by the Senior, Junior, Sophomore and Freshman Classes.

English Compositions and daily exercises in Declamation, by all the classes.

Written Translations of Classical authors, by the Freshman class.

Latin Compositions by the Sophomore class.

Foresnic Debates and original Declamations by the Senoir and Junior classes.

LECTURES,

On Natural Philosophy and Chemistry, with experimental illustrations to the Junior class. On Philosophy of Rhetoric and elocution to the same.

On Mineralogy and Geology, with the exhibition of specimens, models and drawings, and on Astronomy with observations in the Observatory, at noon and at night to the Senior class.

On International Law, Civil Polity and Political Economy to the Senior class.

OBSERVATORY.

The Observatory, standing a few yards west of the University, contains an Equatorial Telescope, by Fitz of New York; a Sidereal Clock by Stokel of New York; a Solar Clock by Riggs of Philadelphia; a Transit Circle by Brunner of Paris; an Altitude and Azimuth Instrument by Simms of London, and a Transit Theodolite by Gregg, of New York. Besides the foregoing instruments, the outfit includes a sextant, mercurial horizon, barometers and thermometers.

FORUM EXERCISES; RELIGIOUS, &c.

At the first bell every morning, the Faculty and Students assemble in the forum of the University. At the second bell, the students take their proper seats, the Secretary of the Faculty passes over his roll in order to ascertain what students are absent, and Religious services are performed by the President, or other professors, by reading a portion of the Holy Scriptures and offering prayer.

Once a month the Faculty and all the students assemble in the forum for the purpose of attending to declamations and compositions. These exercises fall within the charge of the Professor of the English Language and Literature, who in addition to his own criticisms, invites his colleagues to make such comments as they may deem proper to the occasion. All compositions and original speeches that are partisan in politics or religion, are expressly prohibited.

APPARATUS, CABINET OF MINERALS AND LIBRARY.

The outfit of Instruments and other facilities for illustrating the Principles of Natural Philosophy, Chemistry and the cognate branches, has been increased by appropriations from year to year, and is now very full and complete.

The Cabinet, has been greatly augmented from time to time, and particularly by additions made by order of the General Assembly through the State Geologist.

Yearly additions to the Cabinet will continue to be made during the progress of the Geological Survey. Its size and value at present are increased by many valuable specimens belonging to Prof. Swallow and Doct. Norwood.

The number of specimens in the Cabinet is about 500,000.

The Library is regularly improving, partly by purchases and partly by presents from the General Government of sundry valuable works. The number of Volumes in the Library of the University is about 3,000; the number of volumes in the Libraries of the two Literary Societies, is 1000; total number of volumes, 4,000.

EXAMINATIONS, HONORS AND DEGREES.

There are four Examinations in the University:

1. An Examination of the new students is held at the beginning of the session for the purpose of ascertaining their scholarship, and assigning them to the classes for which they may be qualified.

On the occasion of these examinations, the Faculty generally commend the full course of study to students whose age and means render such a course advisable.

2. An intermediate Examination of all the classes, partly oral and partly in writing, is held about the middle of February.

3. An Examination of the Senior Class is held during the second week, in June, in order to determine what members are qualified for graduation.

4. A general Examination of all the other classes is held during the last week in June, for the purpose of ascertaining the progress of the Students and deciding what students shall be promoted to higher classes.

Each candidate for graduation is required to prepare a Thesis:—Oration or Essay—which may be delivered on Commencement day or not, at the discretion of the Faculty. The usual college honors, appropriate to each of the *first* degrees, are awarded by the Faculty amongst the graduates.

The regular degrees are Bachelor of Science, conferred upon those who satisfactorily pass through all the College Departments, but that of Ancient and Modern Languages; Bachelor of Arts upon those who thus pass through *all* the Departments; and Master of Arts, upon such A. B.'s, three or more years after they obtain that *first* degree, as pursue some professional or literary calling.

The Curators can, of course in addition to these, confer any of the usual Honorary Degrees and Titles.

PUBLIC EXHIBITIONS AND COMMENCEMENT.

The Exhibition of the Junior class is held in the College Chapel, some time in the month of May, each year; and some years the Literary Societies give public exhibitions during the session. The Commencement takes place on the last Wednesday in June.

On this occasion orations are delivered by members of the graduating class and the exercises of the day are closed with the conferring of degrees.

DISCIPLINE, LEAVE OF ABSENCE, &c.

The Discipline of the University is intended to be mild and suasive, as far as circumstances permit. If, however, students manifest such moral obliquities as render them unworthy members of the body collegiate, they are returned to their friends without exposure, when it is practicable so to do; and it is only in cardinal offences that the Faculty resort to *public* and *exemplary* punishment.

When a student enters the University, the discipline of the Institution allows him a credit of one hundred merit marks, and he is charged on the record with such demerit marks as arise from misdemeanors, and neglect of college duties. When it is ascertained that his demerits reach twenty-five, he is admonished, and a letter of notification is sent to his parent or guardian.—When the number of demerits reaches fifty and seventy-five, the same course is pursued; and when the number reaches one hundred, he is excluded from the Institution by the operation of law, which is rendered effective by an announcement of the fact by the President.

When a student wishes to leave the University, either temporarily or permanently, he should confer with the President, in order that charges for absence may not accumulate against him on the record of demerit. It is hoped that absences from the Institution for the purpose of visiting friends, &c., will be discouraged by parents and guardians, because such absences interrupt a student's progress, and greatly diminish the pleasure and profit of his literary pursuits.

In all cases of withdrawal, written authority from the parent or guardian will be required; and, as a very general rule, like authority will be required even to obtain a leave of absence. Parents and guardians are again urged not to encourage withdrawals; nor to permit them save for controlling reasons.

LITERARY SOCIETIES.

There are three Societies connected with the University, viz: "The Athenæan," "The Union Literary," and the "Society of Alumni." The Athenæan and Union Literary Societies have spacious and well furnished halls in the University edifice, and hold weekly meetings for improvement in debate, oratory and composition. At the close of the session they have exhibitions, which consist of original addresses and the conferring of diplomas upon such of the members as belong to the graduating class.

The Society of Alumni is composed entirely of graduates of the University. It holds an annual meeting on the day before commencement, and is addressed in the college chapel by an orator previously selected from its own body.

The objects of this society are the promotion of education, especially in the halls of Alma Mater, the reunion of early friends and colaborers in literary pursuits, and the revival of those pleasing associations which entwine themselves about academic life.

GENERAL REMARKS.

The University of the State of Missouri was chartered by the Legislature during the session of 1838-9, and went into full operation on 4th of July, 1843, since which time it has been in successful operation, affording to students the

educational advantages ordinarily enjoyed in similar institutions. Columbia College which has been established near the same spot, was by the charter of the University made a branch of it and was merged into it.

The University edifice, a spacious, tasteful, and commodious building, was erected at an expense of \$85,000 by the liberality of the citizens of Boone county, in which it is located.

The annual revenue of the Institution, exclusive of fees for Tuition, is the income of a State fund of \$123,000, being the proceeds of the sales of lands donated by Congress to the State for University purposes. The principal is well invested, and is legally inviolable.

Columbia, the seat of the University, is situated near the centre of the State, ten miles north of Providence on the Missouri river, about twenty-two from Centralia on the North Missouri Railroad; and about thirty-three from Jefferson City, on the Pacific Rail Road. The town contains about fifteen hundred inhabitants. It is confidently believed that no location combines more advantages for the site of a literary institution. It is not surpassed in healthfulness, and in those social, moral and religious influences which are conservative of the character of young men, and promotive of good order and industrious habits of study.

The University is easily accessible by the river during the greater part of the year. At the landing at Providence carriages will always be in readiness to convey passengers to Columbia. To this point a plank road is completed. There is also daily communication with St. Louis, and with most parts of the State by stages, connecting with the North Missouri Railroad at Sturgeon and Centralia, and with the Pacific Railway, at Jefferson City.
