GUEST ARTISTS

ROBERT NAGEL, trumpet soloist and clinician, began his musical career at the age of eight. As a young cornet prodigy he was guest soloist with the famous Armco Band, the U.S. Marine Band and many others. He studied trumpet and conducting with Dr. Frank Simon, renowned Sousa Band Soloist; George Mager, first trumpet of the Boston Symphony under Koussevitsky; and Ernest Williams, well-known symphony and solo trumpeter. He has studied composition with William Bergsma, Peter Mennin, Vincent Persichetti and Aaron Copland. Mr. Nagel attended the Cincinnati Conservatory and the Juilliard School of Music, where he received his B.S. and M.S. degrees.

Robert Nagel has performed as first trumpet with many of the nation's leading bands and orchestras and has made countless solo appearances, premiering more than 30 works for trumpet solo. He has recorded on Columbia, RCA Victor, Mentor Music, MGM and MMO labels. He is founder and director of the New York Brass Quintet, a group that has earned wide acclaim through radio and television, recordings, and concert tours of Europe and North America. He is coordinating organizer of the International Trumpet Guild.

He is a faculty member of Yale University School of Music, Rutgers University, the Hartt College of Music, the Institute for Advanced Musical Studies in Montreux, Switzerland, and the New College Music Festival in Sarasota, Florida, and New England Conservatory of Music in Boston.

SUSAN MARCHANT has a Bachelor of Music degree from Oberlin Conservatory, as well as two degrees, the Master of Music and Master of Musical Arts, from the Yale School of Music. She is currently a Doctor of Musical Arts candidate at Yale.

Ms. Marchant has played harpsichord with the Hawthorn Chamber Ensemble in Columbia and has frequently accompanied several of the University of Missouri Music faculty. She has also been the organist at the St. Andrew's Church in Columbia.

Ms. Marchant has taught on the music faculty at St. Cloud State University in Minnesota. She is currently teaching organ, piano and harpsichord at Pittsburg State University in Pittsburg, Kansas. Last year, she also participated in the Missouri Trumpet Guild by accompanying one of our guest soloists, Joyce Johnson.
