ARTISTS

HUGO VIANELLO, conductor, has achieved distinction in just about every phase of the art of music. Educated at the Manhattan School of Music and the National Orchestral Association in New York City, he played in the Minneapolis Symphony and the New York Philharmonic before turning his attention to conducting. Mr. Vianello made his conducting debut in Oklahoma City. The broadcast of this concert throughout Europe led to his association with the Kansas City Philharmonic. Mr. Vianello founded the Kansas City Civic Orchestra and produced concerts which brought forth wide public enthusiasm. He left Kansas City to take up the challenging dual assignment as Music Director of the Lansing (Michigan) Symphony and Director of Orchestral Activities at Northwestern University. In addition to his position as Professor of Music at Stephens College and Principal Guest Conductor of the UMC Philharmonic for its 1979-80 Season, Mr. Vianello is also Music Director of the Missouri Symphony Society.

JOHN AUGENBLICK is presently Director of Choral Activities at Central Methodist College in Fayette, Missouri. He is conductor of the A Cappella Choir, Chamber Choir and Swinney Singers, and a teacher of conducting, music education, and music history classes. Dr. Augenblick, a native of Florida, received his Doctor of Musical Arts degree at the University of Miami. His public school and college teaching experience includes working with singers at various stages of development and musical experience. Since coming to Missouri, Dr. Augenblick has served as a clinician at several high school choral festivals.

SUSAN BELLING, soprano, has appeared as soloist with the Boston Symphony Orchestra, Chicago Symphony, Atlanta Symphony, and the Los Angeles Philharmonic. She has been a leading coloratura with the New York City Opera in recent seasons and is a frequent guest artist with other leading opera houses in the United States. Miss Belling's recordings include Igor Stravinsky's opera MAVRA (for Columbia Records) with the composer conducting. In 1979 her performances will include Bach's B MINOR MASS at the Berea Bach Festival.

VIRGINIA PYLE, mezzo-soprano, holds the Doctor of Music degree in vocal performance from Florida State University. She has performed with the Saint Louis Grand Opera Guild, National Opera Festival, and the North Carolina Opera Association and has been a soloist with the Saint Louis Symphony Orchestra. Dr. Pyle is Associate Professor of Music at UMC.

DONALD PYLE, tenor, holds the D.M. and M.M. degrees in Vocal Performance from Florida State University. Additional study was done at the Juilliard School of Music in the Opera Diploma Program. He has sung with the Juilliard Opera Theater, the American Opera Society, and as soloist with the Margaret Hillis Chorale and the John Harms Chorus, as well as under the batons of Sir Thomas Beecham and Thomas Schippers. Donald Pyle is the Dean of the Swinney Conservatory of Music, Central Methodist College.

HARRY MORRISON, bass, and Associate Professor of Voice at UMC, has performed more than twenty-five roles in over 150 opera appearances throughout the midwest. He has been a soloist with the Saint Louis Symphony Orchestra and often serves as visiting artist for major concerts at other universities. Mr. Morrison, a graduate of the University of Iowa, serves as Director of the UMC Opera Workshop.
