Ray Odor's tenth season has a very bright outlook for this year's team, as some of you cub fans may have guessed.

In the annual soap game last Thursday night, the U-High Varsity team ran over the Junior Varsity 103-21. Bob Heidlage, sophomore JV guard got the first bucket of the game for his team's only lead. The varsity was slow to start as a result of determined effort of the "B" team. The varsity could manage only 12 points in the first period against a tough defense. The quarter ended at 12-2,

The second quarter saw a superior attack unleashed with the varsity scoring 31 points. With good ball handling the Cubs were able to penetrate the JV's zone defense for numerous shots. Bob Hines led the scoring with 17 of his eventual game total of 29 points. At the end of the half it was 43-6.

After the fateful second quarter it was all the Junior Cubs could do to stay on the floor. The Cubs continued to pour through points in the 3rd and 4th quarters. The 3rd quarter's final score was 78-14. The game finished with a score of 103-21.

Bob Heidlage was the only scoring threat that the "B" team had as he scored 10 of his team's 21 points. Chuck Clutts, coach of the JV squad this year was somewhat disappointed that his team could not make a better showing. He said after the game, "We just couldn't get our offense going.

The wide margin of the score doesn't necessarily doom the outcome of the season for the "B" teamers. Last year the Varsity romped over the JV team 98-39 without the help of all

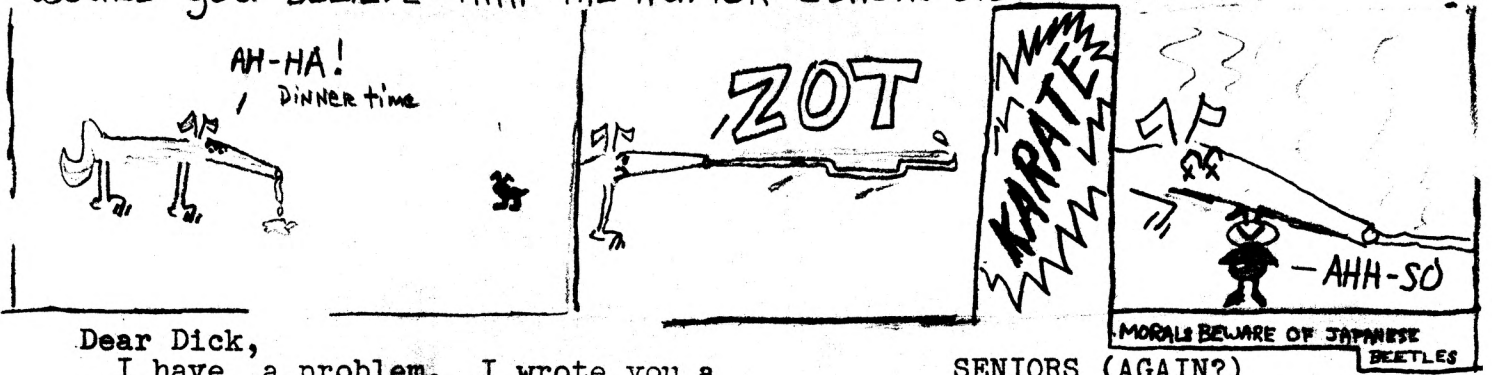
