CROSS COUNTRY

The University High Cross Country team has improved over a dismal '65 season. Jeff Aldrich is undefeated this season after suffering only one defeat last year, that in the state meet. The rest of the team, not necessarily in the order they finish is Fred Lucas, Jim Carr, Tom LaBerge, Marty Riback and Guy Baker. They captured our first dual meet victory in two years at the expense of Van-Far, 25 to 30. Four defeats were dealt from the hands of Mexico and Hickman, strong class L schools. We always run a tough schedule and don't run anyone in our own class. We usually held these teams within 10 or 12 points in our defeats. Our dual season over , we currently are preparing for the state meet by attempting to qualify in the district meet on October 22.

This year, for the first time, a "B" team schedule was added to the competition. This year's "B" record was very encouraging, finishing with a 4 and 1 record. They were led by Rock Townsend, who gathered 4 wins. Also on the team were Henry Muhrer, Donnie Smith, Clark Odor, and Dix Moser. The success of our future cross country program seems assured for a few more years.
