BIG LITTLE MAN

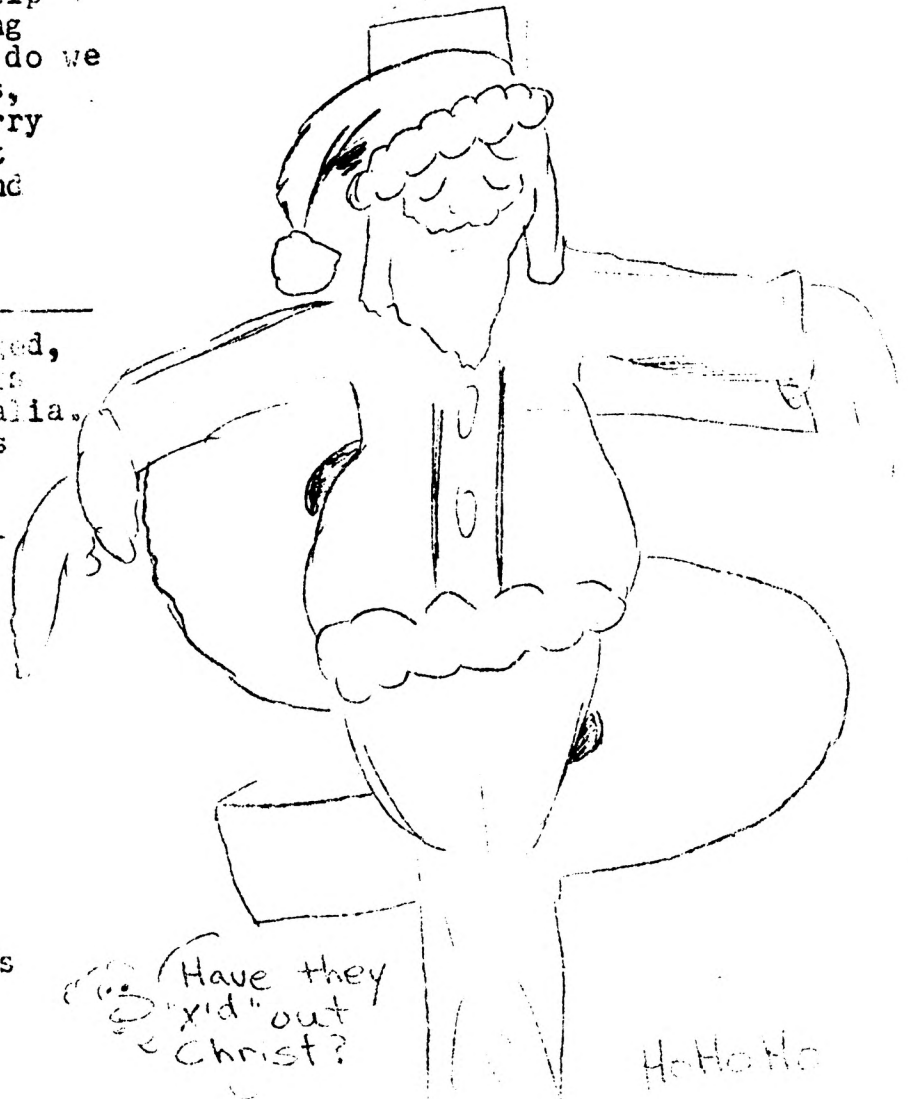
