Last Tuesday night the Cubs lost a hard fought ballgame to the Cairo Bears 61-60. Brent Weston and Roger Eastman fouled out when they were needed most. The Kansas State Wildcats beat Missouri Tigers Saturday 69-67. Steve Zender led K-State with 17 points. John Brown led all scorers with 18 points followed by Al Eberhard with 16. MU played without the services of starting guard Mike Griffin who sprained his ankle in Friday night's practice.

Monday the Tigers moved into first place by defeating Iowa State 77-72. It was a much needed victory, although Coach Maury made some nasty accusations about Missouri's Coach Norm Stewart. Greg Flaker led Missouri with 23 points. John Brown made 18 big points and Martinez Denmon bucketed 18 points. Missouri moved into first place as Oklahoma beat Nebraska. Nebraska, Oklahoma, and Missouri all have a 5-2 record.

The loss to K-State dropped Missouri in the two National polls. MU is ranked 17th in the AP and 15th in the UPI.
