Keshi Crowned UESTA Queen

University High's U-ESTA festivities have a queen reigning over them now. Following the fun night and talent show Nancy Keihl was crowned female monarch for the day. Nancy is a junior at U-High and fills all the qualifications beautifully. Darnette Nelson, a ninth grader, received the princess honors.

It was a very emotional ceremony with the crowning coming only after all contestants were on stage. The queen and princess both nearly collapsed when the decision was announced but were aided by their escorts. Miss Keihl gave a short speech after which she remained her composure stating she was very grateful to the student body and that she denounced women's liberation movement. Roger Fastman, the Burt Parks of U-High crowned the winners and gave Miss Keihl a congratulatory kiss.

The candidates for princess were Connie Apple, Tori Byrne, and Darnette Nelson. They are seventh eighth and ninth graders respectively. Their escorts were Andy Nelson, David Holt and Tony Grano. The candidates for queen were Rita Gabis, Nancy Keihl and Heather Unley. They are sophomores, juniors and seniors respectively. Their escorts for the evening were Mark Straight, Mike Pfander, and Glen Pickett. The escorts were chosen by the candidates themselves.

The candidates were selected in class meetings a month prior to the night and a steady campaign for each preceded the hour of decision. There was special drama in the event since it was the last U-ESTA night for University High. It is being closed at the end of this school year.

Pfander Flips on Cycle

U-High Senior Mike Pfander was injured in a motorcycle accident on the north inter-branch of I-70 on Sunday, October 14. He was taken to the emergency ward of Boone County Hospital but was released the same day with a broken right shoulder and numerous minor bruises. His right arm is still being kept immobilized in a sling.

According to Mike, the accident occurred

when he went around a corner on his motorcycle and it began to "wobble" in front. He was exceeding the speed limit about 75 p.m. when he veered into a ditch. Mike jumped off the cycle just before it crashed into a concrete culvert. He estimated the damage to his week-old motorcycle at \$450.

Variety Show Shows Talent

Last Friday night at 9:30 p.m., the University-of-Labotatory school gave its first variety show. The school hasn't had a talent show in two years, because there hasn't been sufficient talent to warrant a variety show.

105 runners started the race, with 86 finishing.

Charlie will advance to the Regional meet at Sedalia, Saturday, October 28th.

Sedalia won the district meet, led by former U-High cross-country coach, Joe Simones.

The state meet is in Columbia, at the A.L. Gustin Golf Course, on November 4th.

Bob Graham put in a solid performance to finish 50th. Bill Burge, John Victor and Randall DeGroot also ran.

This ends the season(era of U-High cross-country, except for Charles Evans, U-High number one.

Weston Sounds Optimism
