### The Missouri Medal

The School of Journalism at the University of Missouri-Columbia has awarded its Journalism Honor Medal "for distinguished service in journalism" continuously since 1930.

The awards are presented by the Chancellor of the University at the annual journalism awards banquet, the high point of the School's annual Journalism Week. During the week the Medalists are featured speakers in addresses to alumni, faculty and students who attend special sessions for each sequence as well as plenary sessions for the entire School.

Nominations\* for the medals are received each year by the Awards Committee of the School. Final selection is made by the faculty, which thereupon advises the Chancellor and the President of the choices.

\*Nominations may be addressed to the Dean of the Faculty, School of Journalism, prior to November 1 annually.

### The Honor Medalists

Honor Medals for Distinguished Service in Journalism were awarded to seven honorees at the 73rd annual Journalism Banquet April 16, 1982. They were:

**David R. Bradley,** publisher, *St. Joseph* (MO) *News Press* and the *St. Joseph* (MO) *Gazette*;

The Kansas City Times, Michael Davies, editor, accepting,

Jonathan Kwitney, investigative reporter and author;

"Lou Grant," **Gene Reynolds,** producer of the television show, accepting;

National Public Radio, Sam C. O. Holt, senior vice president for programming, accepting;

The New Republic, Martin Peretz, editor-in-chief, accepting;

William T. Raidt, vice chairman, D'Arcy-MacManus and Masius;

This year's seven medalists bring to 338 the total honored; the presentation ceremony marked the 53rd consecutive year in which the awards have been presented.

#### THE MISSOURI MEDALS

David Bradley is the publisher of the St. Joseph News-Press and the St. Ioseph Gazette. In 1946, he joined the papers as national advertising manager. During his 36-year connection with the papers, he has served as secretary-treasurer, production manager, publisher, president and chairman of the board.

Although Bradley's journalism career has centered on St. Joseph, Mo., his activities reach far beyond the local sphere. Bradley has served three terms as Director of the Associated Press. represented AP at the African-American Conference in Africa and was part of an AP delegation of directors who made a good-will visit to the People's Republic of China in 1977.

Bradley is a member of the American Newspaper Publishers Association, the American Society of Newspaper Editors and the American Press Insitute.



Gene Reynolds, producer of "Lou Grant," accepted the Missouri Medal for his show.

Reynolds began his entertainment career in radio on two Detroit, Mich., radio stations at age 6. As a child actor, he appeared in "Boys Town," was young Jimmy Stewart in "Of Human Hearts," was young Tyrone Power in "In Old Chicago," and was young Robert Taylor in "The Crowd Roars."

In 1947, Reynolds graduated from UCLA with a degree in economics. He acted in several plays and motion pictures before landing TV director spots on "Peter Gunn," "Alfred Hitchcock," "Andy Griffith," "My Three Sons" and several other shows.

Reynolds developed, produced and directed the pilot of "Room 222" and produced or co-produced "M\*A\*S\*H" for five years. He produced "Lou Grant" for two years.

Samuel C.O. Holt, senior vice president for programming, National Public Radio, accepted the Medal of Honor on behalf of that organization.

Holt is a member of the senior management team of NPR, with responsibility for programming activities including direction of a company-wide study of new financing options for public radio and authorship of the plan for moving NPR from primarily federal to private funding.

In addition, his division was responsible for NPR's becoming the first satellite-distributed radio service in the country.

He is also active in the business world as director of the Dreyfus Leverage Fund as well as several other mutual funds managed by the Dreyfus Corporation. He has been involved in the founding of several firms and has done research in biotechnology.

John Mack Carter, BJ '48, AM '49, has been editor-in-chief of America's three leading women's magazines—Good Housekeeping Ladies' Home Journal and McCalls. Currently director of new magazine development for the Hearst Corp. and editor-in-chief of Good Housekeeping, he has also been editor-in-chief of American Home and assistant editor of Better Homes and Gardens. Carter was chairman of the board and editor-in-chief of Downe Communications Inc. and vice president and director of McCall Corp. prior to joining Good Housekeeping in 1975.

Cited by *Time* and *Newsweek* as a phenomenon in publishing history, he received a 1970 Missouri Honor Award for Distinguished Service in Journalism, was the 1978 Women in Communications Inc. Headliner of the Year and the 1977 Brandeis University Publisher of the Year.

Appointed to a number of presidential commissions on human need, Carter served on the National Commission for the Observance of International Women's Year. He is a volunteer consultant to a number of professional organizations, and is director of the Christian Church Foundation, the American Cancer Society and Religion in American Life.
